





The second class of the Eastern Shore Golf Hall of Fame was honored in a spectacular oceanfront venue at the Solero in Rehoboth Beach Saturday, Dec 1st. Along with delicious cuisine the evening was filled with scholarships (Kolin Howard Wor Wics Turf Management and Erik Carlson UMES PGA Golf Management), presentations, inductions, music, dancing, camaraderie and laughter.





UMES Graduates THE FIRST CLASS OF THE GOLF PGA MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

The University of Maryland Eastern Shore awarded 273 degrees at its December 2012 commencement, including seven that went to members of the first class to graduate from the golf management program.

Among family, friends and guests who witnessed the two-hour graduation exercises were officials from the PGA of America, the sanctioning body that authorizes UMES to offer the highly specialized course of study. "I've had a great experience here," Brian Anderson said. "I grew up (in Westminster, Md.) playing golf. It was something I was good at and now I have a degree to make that work for me."

UMES is one of 20 universities in the country with such an undergraduate degree that combines instruction in the hospitality industry and playing competitive golf at the professional level.

Zach Allen of Baltimore said he valued the opportunity to be among the first group accepted into the program that launched in 2009.

"The prospect of being part of something new was just the kind of challenge I was looking for" in college, Allen said. "I think we feel we got a lot of personal attention from (the) faculty and I've learned a lot about the industry."

Six of the seven, including Allen and Anderson, graduated with honors.

Billy Dillon, the golf management program director, said on graduation day that six members of the class – Anderson and Allen among them – have jobs waiting for them, and the seventh is close to accepting an offer.

"It's hard to find good people in this profession," Dillon said, "and our guys are good."

Golf management students are enrolled year-round and must fulfill a requirement to do field work under the supervision of a working PGA professional.

Anderson, a "scratch" handicap golfer, said he learned a lot about merchandizing, including selecting the right inventory, displaying it in a way that makes it appealing and pricing it to sell.

"It was very much a hands-on experience," said Anderson, who did field work at a country club in Montgomery County. He'll be starting work soon at Columbia Country Club in Chevy Chase, Md.

Allen spent time at River Bend County Club in Great Falls, Va., where he's been invited back to work as an assistant pro starting in March 2013.

"One of the things I took away from the experience was learning to organize tournaments," Allen said. "It's not as easy as it might sound. It's important to do it right, because you are working in a business where people have high standards."

Watching from the third row as the newly minted graduates stepped forward to receive their degrees; Dillon described his emotions in one word: "Pride."


"It's what we're here for," Dillon said, "to produce graduates who are members of the PGA and who are going to be productive people in their lives."

The stellar academic performance of the charter class is not surprising, Dillon said, because "the one thing we have is that we get to know our students on a personal basis."

"We're involved in their personal lives well outside the classroom," Dillon said. And the students notice.

"Billy Dillon is a great teacher," Allen said. "His knowledge of the industry and his persistence in making sure we succeed is something I'll always appreciate." The golf management students were among 235 who received bachelor's degrees along with 29 who earned a master's degree and nine new Ph.D. recipients.

The class of 2012 heard from Dr. Louis W. Sullivan, a former U.S. Secretary of Health and Human Services for President George H.W. Bush and president emeritus of Morehouse School of Medicine in Atlanta.

AAGHOF INDUCTS FIRST SEVEN UMES PGM

Riviera Beach (USA), December 17, 2012: The University of Maryland Eastern Shore, founded in 1886, a renown research and doctoral degree granting institution on the Eastern Shore of Maryland, is a Historically Black University. The PGA of America's Professional Golf Management Program, created in 1975 at Ferris State University, Big Rapids, Mich., as the first university to gain PGA accreditation and offer the PGM curriculum was brought to UMES Past President Dr. Thelma B. Thompson's attention. The "PGA PGM Program" is a 4½-year structured college curriculum for aspiring PGA Professionals. The educational program is accredited by the PGA of America and includes extensive classroom studies and internships to succeed in the golf industry. With the support of her staff (Marshall Cropper, Dr. Ayodele Alade, Dr. Ernest P. Boger, etc.) and the AAGHOF leadership, Dr. Thompson set her sites on UMES offering the program. The application process began in 2003 to satisfy the State of Maryland and the PGA of America. In January 2008, with great pride, the University of Maryland Eastern Shore in the quaint town of Princess Anne, MD became the first historically Black University accredited by the PGA of America to offer the PGA Professional Golf Management Degree Program.

The entire "UMES PGM Program" was inducted into the AAGHOF in 2010. As AAGHOF Founder, I recall sending a letter to Dr. Thompson which stated in part: "It is with great pleasure that I inform you on behalf of the Board of Directors of the African American Golfers Hall of Fame (AAGHOF) of the selection of the 'UMES PGA Professional Golf Management Degree Program' to receive its 'Pioneer Award' and be inducted into the AAGHOF. The AAGHOF Selection Committee chose the UMES PGA Golf Management Degree Program to receive its prestigious award because it shares the overall vision for the entire University and its becoming the first Historically Black College and the 20th University accredited by the PGA of America in January 2008 to offer their Professional Golf Management Program."

Indeed, the AAGHOF co-hosted a dinner for the Inaugural PGA Professional Golf Management Program students (Zachary David Allen, Baltimore, MD; Brian Michael Anderson, Westminster, MD; Richard Chadwick Dailey, Salisbury, MD; Brett William Emrick, Scio, NJ; Lewis Laverne Schnauble III, Westminster, MD; Devan Michael Scott, Delmar, MD and Mark Simshauser, Chance, MD) on Thursday, December 13, 2012 at the Courtyard By Marriott, Ocean City, MD to kick-off the historic weekend. All seven students, Program Administrator William Dillon and Christopher Prosser, Intern Coordinator were formally inducted into AAGHOF with their shirts and pins. Fellow PGM students: Norman Blanco (inducted 2012), Anthony Long (inducted 2011) and African American Collegiate & Youth Golfers Hall of Fame Chair James Garvin, Jr. and Vice Chair Dr. Ernest P. Boger, Director, UMES Department of Hotel & Restaurant Management assisted with the induction.

Letters of commendation were delivered from Legendary Golfers Jack Nicklaus and Bob Murphy. Both Messrs. Nicklaus (2007) and Murphy (2011) have received the "AAGHOF Humanitarian Awards." Both Jack and Bob sent similar messages to Dr. Ernest P. Boger: "Congratulations once again to the students who have excelled in this program, especially those 2012 graduates who will be recognized as members of the African- American Golfers Hall of Fame at the first annual special AAGHOF luncheon on Thursday, December 13. On behalf of those who live and love the game of golf, I not only want to thank you for helping mold the next leaders of our industry, but also those who will shape the future of our country. Please share my best wishes for continued success with all those in attendance."

YOU KNOW THE DRILL

O THE WIND

It is January and if you are playing winter golf, you can guarantee that you will be playing in windy conditions. Here is a good tip for those into the wind shots. Level your shoulders to the ground at address position and hit the shot with a three-quarter swing. With the shoulders being level you will reduce your launch angle and hit the ball lower. With a three-quarter swing you will reduce the amount of spin on your normal shot allowing for more control in your ball flight. Resist the urge to swing harder. The harder you swing the more spin you put on the ball. The more spin the less control. Go to the range and practice flighting your ball into the wind. Now you know the drill!






SHORE UP WITH THE GAME COACH


Now we can make a list and check it twice to be sure we receive our full share of enjoyment from the 2013 golf season. What is first on your list? Researchers recently asked more than 1,600 avid golfers to report how they would allocate \$1,000.00 toward maximizing performance in preparation for a tournament of importance; respondents assigned \$525 to receive lessons from a professional, \$300 to practice fees and \$175 to purchasing new equipment, a seemingly reasonable ratio. On the contrary, the study found golfers paying more than \$1.3 billion in a calendar year on new putters, irons, woods and wedges while spending considerably less, approximately \$200 million, on lessons from a pro. The outcome supports a golden paradox in psychology: Belief and behavior can make strange bedfellows. Why? Consider


The participants in the study identified practice and instruction as the best ways to get ready for an important golf event, but the focus and dedication required to master the psychophysiological aspects of golf can be easily short-circuited by the reflection and enticement of shiny new titaniums. The investigator noted, "It's easier to buy a new club than to change one's swing." Additionally, seeking guidance from a professional or Game Coach may pose a threat to the fragile ego, narrowing the route to a lower handicap. Though athletes often know the right track, the alternate, beaten path has appeal. For a lucky '13, document what has been proven to work and pursue goals without regard for resistance. Despite the course, there is no easy way to the top.


GOLF FITNESS - GOLF ELBOW

DR. PETE ZEMO

I was doing some research on golfer's elbow (median epicondylitis), a condition similar to tennis elbow,



when I ran across a product that has been around for a while but of which I was unaware. Typically with sports injuries, the options are: rest it, take Motrin or go to the Doc, who will offer a steroid injection if you need quick relief. The last thing most athletes/golfers want to do is wear a brace, which will limit motion but expedite healing. The product is called KT tape. If you Google it, you will get all the info you need; apparently, athletes have been using it for months. Basically, it is a waterproof elastic tape (non-medicated) that when applied properly takes the pressure off pain receptors, reduces swelling and prevents muscle cramping. It supports tired/ injured muscles and tendons and provides the support of a brace without restricting full range of motion. It is 100% cotton and stays on in water (for you golfer/swimmers) out there. We are using it at our gym for minor injuries to allow people to continue to do their thing. Proper application is very important; the website will flip you to YouTube videos that explain it all. It is not expensive and is available at places like Wal-Mart and CVS pharmacies. If you go online to examine it, go to the area called FAQ which will direct you to specific applications (elbow, shoulder, knee etc.). Personally, I hate steroid injections. This has worked well for our members and its always exciting to find new non-intrusive ideas and products.


Say it with me: "I will not let rust form on my golf game like a 68 Mustang. I will not start the spring with no golf shape. I will not shoot 10 shots over my average for the entire month of spring. I will not do it!!!"

This winter I want all of you to join me in an "almost everyday, kind of as much as possible, squeeze it in somehow dailyish" workout routine. And the best part...I don't care what kind of routine it is: pilates, yoga, jazersize, dance craze, aerobics, walking, skipping, running, biking, weight lifting, duck feeding, or any activity that you can come up with that's legal (preferably), and gets you up and moving even a little bit. I only ask you to try to do two things for me...


- **1.** Move a little bit on purpose, and with a purpose. Just take a little time to get the blood flowing to stay loose and fit. Shopping and regular daily stuff does not count unless you move your body with exercise in mind while performing your normal routine. Walk through the stores with a pace...swing those arms...ankle weights...heavy hands...all that stuff (don't over do it). Take the stairs if you can, rather than the elevator or escalator!
- **2.** Make at least 20 golf swings (with a golf club if possible) every time you exercise. Make the swings continuous...back and forth non-stop. Long, smooth swings in rhythm. Don't worry too much about form. Try to make as long and smooth a back swing as possible...smooth at the transition to forward swing...then smooth and effortless all the way through to a full finish...then all the way back to the top of the back swing again. Keep the motion going...smooth...rhythm...balanced. Make it like a move in your aerobics class! Just swinging the club can be a great workout!


I want us all to start out the spring ready to have our best golf season ever. Start out firing in great golf shape...not couch potato shape!

Over the years I have seen a few clients who had a difficult time pulling the trigger. They felt that they had to analyze every aspect of the shot and the swing before they could commit to swinging. It drove their playing partners nuts and they got invited into fewer and fewer games.



To help them I would invite them to join me for a late afternoon or early evening round of golf. The rule was that you had to play fast. I told them we had limited daylight so we have to think about our shot as we approach the ball in the cart; hop

out, grab the club, hit the ball and move on. No time to over-analyze. Now I also stressed that we didn't have to swing fast, just play fast. After the round they were typically amazed at how much better they played when they didn't spend so much effort anguishing over the shot.

When I play in events with my fellow club professionals, speed of play is ever present on your mind. You must move at a quick pace. The key is to be efficient in your use of time so that you can keep your swing rhythm smooth. If you are efficient in your use of time, you have more than enough time to stick to your pre-shot routine in your long shots and have you enough time around the greens to take care of business since this is where the scoring really takes place. When playing in tournament conditions where the pace of play is quick and your body has a tendency to be a bit anxious, I make a concerted effort to slow down the turn on the take-away. By feeling a bit slower, I'm actually swinging at the normal, non-tournament pace. Going slower also helps in making sure the body is creating the motion and not the hands.

This can also help you when you are playing through a group. The tendency is to rush your swing and then you actually hold the group up by hitting poor shots and then get frustrated. You can get through the group quicker by just being ready to play your shot when it's your turn and then make a smooth swing.





SUPPORT YOUR

As we kick off another new year, here is a good resolution to add to your list. Support your club! Just because you are a member of a golf club doesn't mean you are supporting it. Maybe this year you can ask not what your club can do for you but what you can do for your club. As members, we sometimes forget that golf is a business. We expect great service, great conditions and want to be treated a certain way and we should. But sometimes, as members, we forget that this relationship works both ways. If you're the kind of member who never brings guests and goes through the drive through, instead of having lunch at your club, you're not helping your club. As members, we have a responsibility to bring guests, tip the staff, play in member events and support the grill and pro shops. If you choose not to, then don't pull your pro aside and start complaining about course condtions and poor service because you are part of the problem. There are a number of great deals out there at a variety of clubs but remember just because you join one doesn't mean you are supporting it. As the saying goes the more you give; the more you will receive and your golf club is no different!



YOUR PATH TO PAR

RICHARD ROBINSON - INSTRUCTOR: THE ORIGINAL GOLF SCHOOL

"Anchoring" your putter to your body has found disfavor with golf's rule makers, but anchoring your game to your putter is still a fundamental principle of good scoring. After all, half of all strokes in the calculation of par are designated to putts.

The ability to putt has always been critical to good scoring. The techniques, equipment and attitudes of successful putters have universally attracted scrutiny, admiration, emulation, and occasionally rule changes. The "Old Man" Walter Travis and his center shafted "Schenectady" putter became America's first great champion by winning the United States and British Amateur Championship decades before Bobby Jones achieved such success with his trusty blade "Calamity Jane". Travis' reward for his innovation, skill, and audacity to beat the Brits, was to have his Schenectady design banned by the R&A. Half a century later golf's most graceful swinger, Sam Snead, straddled the line and stooped over to use a croquet technique. When Bobby Jones saw Snead putt he said, "Sam, it just doesn't look like golf" The rule makers agreed and straddling the line was banned. The resourceful Snead merely adjusted his stance to conform to the rules and continued to face the hole with his side saddle technique.

Putting is the simplest of golf strokes with the most nuanced techniques. The key to success is the ability to keep your approach simple. Anchoring the long putter was a "crutch" to simplicity. The mere fact that the putter is placed on the body in the same place every time guarantees two fundamentals. First, the set up will be consistent, the same position every stroke. Second, with the top of the grip anchored and the ball stationary, the angle of the putter shaft and path of the clubface at impact will be the same time and time and time again unless consciously manipulated. Good putters vary in style, technique and equipment, but they all set up consistently, and keep the top of the grip on a level plane through the stroke. Anchor your stroke with good fundamentals and it won't matter if the club is touching your body. Set up for good putts and good golf in 2013 and join us at the Original Golf School.
