



120 golfers from ages 13 through college will take to the course. Players must be enrolled in school or be attending college to participate. Several age categories are available and girls are encouraged to compete.

For the second year, UMES will offer a 4-year tuition-paid scholarship to its Professional Golf Management Program to the day's rising high school winner. Additionally, a top golfer will receive \$1,000 from the Marianna R. Holloway's Memorial Golf Scholarship. Financial prizes are also awarded to the top golfers in the college division.

The monies raised from the tournament provide funds for the Tri-County Athletic Scholarships. Each spring, students are selected to receive a scholarship based on leadership in a varsity sport, financial need, and dedication to community service. Over \$50,000 has been awarded since the tournament began.

For the \$25 entry fee (\$30 after July 31st), golfers receive a continental breakfast, assorted golf goodies, and lunch.

"Ron asked me what I was going to do," explained Holtzclaw. "I told him I had no idea. He told me, 'Then do what you love."




He attended Cape Henlopen High School and played on the school's golf team, but did not play in college. "I just didn't give golf much thought as a career until after I graduated."





the 'forward' swing



BY BOB BECKELMAN

We've finally reached the fun part of the golf swing...the forward swing. It drives me crazy when people call it the "down swing", because the opposite of the "back swing" is the "forward swing"...think about it. If it was the "down swing" then why wouldn't they call it the "up swing"? Silly details, but I believe that the name paints a certain picture, and most forward swing errors are due to the swing becoming too steep, and too much "down" at the ball. How to correct these swing errors? Make a forward swing instead!


Once you finish the back swing (see last issue), you want to have a smooth transition to the forward swing. The sequence is important. Begin by initializing a weight shift from your back foot to your forward foot. All good players shift their weight early in the forward swing. This allows the club to smoothly change direction and begin its' forward move toward the ball and target. If the forward swing is started with the arms or shoulders, the dreaded over the top move will ensue, and nothin' but trouble. With the weight shifting, the body will begin to unwind, turning the belt buckle to the target (very important the belt buckle...make sure you wear one for optimal swing visualization...plus it makes this part make sense!). The turning of the body toward the target allows the club room to swing forward along the same inside path as on the back swing (not much steeper and outside as is the favored of high handicappers). With an inside path, you will strike the ball solid and square naturally without having to manipulate the club or club face in order to control contact.


This is known as the "moment of truth", though I believe that it is over rated. You don't swing to impact; you don't swing AT the ball. You do swing forward THROUGH the ball. Impact is a by-product of the through swing. If you swing through the ball, you will have proper impact position.

Just as in the back swing, if you give the forward swing through the ball enough momentum, the speed will: carry your head up with the ball (do not keep your head down!); continue turning your belt buckle until it is facing the target (the belt buckle again? And does it have a face?); continue turning your shoulders until your chest is slightly left of the target; and continue the club moving until it is over and behind your forward shoulder (do not stop the club, let it stop itself!). You should be able to follow the entire flight of the ball with both of your eyes. The eyes bring the head up with the swing, and the head MUST come up with the swing in order to allow the body to release through! Once all motion comes to a smooth balanced stop, pose for the camera while watching the ball fly to the target. This is called the "finish position" (more on this next issue!). You are finished for now...until next swing.

If you have set up in good posture, with a good grip, and made a back swing, and now a forward swing, you may have accidentally made contact with a small white ball and sent it flying FORWARD... NOT DOWN!!!



COACH'S CHALKBOA

■BY JIM KRALL WHAT HIGH SCHOOL GOLFERS SHOULD KNOW FOR SUMMER PREPARATIONS

PRACTICE, PRACTICE. Make the golf course and range your second home. Hit balls until it hurts. Serious high school golfers can be found on the course almost everyday during the summer. Does that sound like you? Bayside golf matches are usually played from tees that are closest to 6300 total yards for men. Ladies will always play from the ladies tees in high school. No matter which course you are playing this summer try to play from that distance or more.

GET INVOLVED IN A JUNIOR TOUR. Summer tours afford young players with experiences in competition that are extremely valuable. In fact, most college recruiters weigh a player's achievements on junior tours more heavily than their high school accomplishments (except for the state tournament).

PLAY THE BALL DOWN. If you improve your lie by fluffing your ball up on a tuff of grass you are only hurting yourself. You must learn how to hit shots from bad lies to be the complete competitor. Touching the ball anywhere but the tee and green is a one stroke penalty.

LEARN THE RULES OF THE GAME. Get a USGA rulebook and study it. Penalties are assessed during practice rounds, qualifying rounds, and matches for any and all infractions. Ignorance to the rules is not an excuse.

LEARN TO CONTROL YOUR ANGER. Swearing, club throwing, kicking objects, etc. will not be tolerated at all. Act with maturity and control on and off the course.

GET A PHYSICAL IF YOU HAVEN'T ALREADY DONE SO. Physicals are valid in public high school for 365 days. Permission slips, physical forms, emergency forms, etc. will be due before you are permitted to play. Don't wait too long and assume the doctor can see you on short notice.

DON'T CONCENTRATE ON DRIVING AS MUCH AS YOUR

SHORT GAME. Chipping and putting win tournaments. A good friend of mine put it best when he said, "You have to be better than your opponents in chipping and putting to beat them". you never see long drive champions on

WALK THE COURSE WHEN YOU PLAY. You must have strong legs. Often high school golfers are able to post good scores for their front nine, but many times they tire on the back nine due to weak legs. I see it happen every year during our 18 hole matches. Strong legs help a strong finish.

DON'T TAKE GOLF FOR GRANTED. It's not a right, it's a privilege. However, any player who does not exhibit respect for the game, the facilities, and the people involved will be dismissed. You must have control over your bodily functions. You are representing your school and you are a reflection of your coach. You will not embarrass your teammates, coaches, family or

ENJOY THE SPORT. It is one of the few sports that can be played for a lifetime. Don't let the game control you, you control the game. Everyone has their share of horrible rounds, as well as, awesome ones. You will hit a slump Don't give up. Don't be a quitter. It doesn't take very long to understand how deeply Ocean Pines Yacht and Country Club Director of Golf and Course Superintendent Harlyn Goldman feels about his work.

In fact, you begin to suspect he could account for every blade of grass and every grain of sand on the classic Robert Trent Jones layout.

Which is a good thing; since the popular and busy club is in the middle of a multi-year, very ambitious rework to modernize the design of a world-famous golf architect, a delicate undertaking for sure.

"Essentially we are creating a whole new golf course while maintaining Robert Trent Jones' original design intent," explained Goldman, himself a Certified Golf Course Superintendent. "We are matching the course to today's club and ball technology by adjusting turning points (doglegs), fairway hazards, bunkers, etc."

Goldman said they are in the process of vastly improving drainage and irrigation, removing trees that have grown in over the last 40 years to ensure adequate airflow and light – essential to keep grasses healthy - and reseeding with thick, lush, healthy grasses in both the fairways and rough. They are also restoring Trent Jones' signature bunkers to their original glory by addressing years of weather related erosion.

"To maintain 18 holes of golf, we have built a par-3 19th hole, which we will use as we work on specific holes. Luckily, we have an incredibly dedicated member base that is supporting this work."

When he is not working on his course, Goldman teaches on the adjunct faculty of Wor-Wic Community College in the Turf Management Program, plays the drums, and spends time with his family; wife Amy, and children Robin, 15; Melanie, 13; Dylan, 11; and Shawn, 7.

ECOLOGICALLY FRIENDLY GOLF COURSES

We decided to follow up on last month's article about golf and the environment with some additional information discussing the misconceptions people often have about golf courses and pesticides. While many people may think that too many pesticides are being used on golf courses, the truth is that golf courses provide great benefits to their local communities and ecosystems with limited pesticide usage.

Golf courses are community green spaces that not only provide recreational opportunities, but also provide and enhance wildlife habitats. Many golf courses are leaving dead trees, building bird boxes and habitat for birds, implement 'no-mow' natural areas that act as habitat for wildlife, and create buffer areas to further enhance runoff filtration from surrounding communities. Golf courses also act as 'air conditioners', providing vast amounts of oxygen. Healthy turfgrass is an excellent filter that traps and sifts out pollutants. Many golf courses are recycling water and are perfect sites to dispose of reclaimed effluent or wastewater created by neighboring communities and businesses. For example, here at the GlenRiddle Golf Club, we irrigate a portion of the golf course with effluent water from the residential community. Using this water is reducing our demand of ground water by roughly 50%. Numerous other ecologically friendly and best management

practices are being used by almost all golf courses, resulting in LESS pesticide usage, LESS pesticide exposure, and ENHANCING the local environment.

Modern pesticides and fertilizers are a highly regulated business and must be used to maintain healthy golf course turf. These products have been thoroughly tested and are considered safe when used according to their labeled directions. A pesticide product used today typically has undergone countless studies at an average R&D cost of \$50 million before it is registered by the Environmental Protection Agency.

Many of the products used today on our golf courses are derived from mushrooms and other natural plants. Unlike the old DDT days, today's synthetic pyrethoid insecticides and chemicals are made from derivatives of chrysanthemums and have extremely low toxicity levels. Many of the current use rates are extremely low, with some products being applied as low as 4 ounces per acre.

Golf course superintendents are environmental stewards and are leading the way when it comes to protecting the environment. Every golf course employs at least one state licensed pesticide applicator who is trained in environmentally sound pesticide use. Most of today's superintendents have college degrees, substantial continuing education requirements, and can earn certification by the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America (GCSAA). The GCSAA has made environmental education a major focus in all of its educational programs.

However, much of the environmental criticism of golf courses seems to be linked to local opposition to community growth. The next time you tee up, remember golf courses are providing and maintaining an ecosystem in a conscientious way. Play often and enjoy the game, but also the surroundings and environment around you.

Let's suppose we hit a pulled hook shot. Looking at the flight of the ball and the divot can tell the story of how your club came through the ball. The ball started out left of your target and then turned left even more. Your divot is pointing left of your target. Evidence shows the club was swinging from outside your target.

target line, across the ball, to inside the target line. The ball turning left shows the club head was turned inward at impact. Since that golf crime has already been committed, we can't do anything about it now. We can; however, use that information to not commit the crime again.

If the club head was turned in and the swing path was coming from outside to inside the target line on the last shot, what path and clubface position would send the ball straight to the target? The answer my dear Watson, is to place your clubface in a square position, facing the target. From that position take a couple of short strokes back and forth, seeing and feeling the club swing straight down the target line. Let your body follow in any way that allows you to expand the length of the stroke while still feeling the club go straight down the target line with a square clubface. That's all the ball cares about anyway.





GARRISON'S LAKE GOLF COURSE

Like a phoenix rising from its ashes, Garrison's Lake Golf Course reopened last fall after a six-year dormancy.

Once a hallmark of Delaware tournament golf, Garrison's Lake was purchased in the 1990's by NFL-star quarterback Ron Jaworski and slowly succumbed to apathy, neglect and disinterest from the golfing public.

Six years ago, Jaworski sold the land to a developer who planned to convert the golf course into homes.

According to Barry Dear, current Head Golf Professional, the members of the Garrison's Lake community rallied together and began lobbying elected officials all the way up to the Governor, eventually convincing the State of Delaware to purchase the land with Open Space money and contract with the non-profit Delaware State Golf Association to manage and maintain theproperty.



THE RESULT?

Nothing short of the resurrection of one of Delaware's classic courses.

Every green has been rebuilt. More than 300 trees (and counting) have been removed. Irrigation and drainage have been completely modernized. The old drab clubhouse has been demolished and will be replaced with another in 3-5 years.

ESGM staff played the course on a rainy day in May and had a wonderful experience. With immaculate greens, beautiful sinewy lines, classic routing, and a fair but challenging layout, Garrison's Lake is worth the trip. Call ahead though... word is out.

Flexibility, power and strength – we have discussed how these are important to good golf. Interestingly enough, next in importance is aerobic fitness. 

Remember your New Year's resolutions? How's that going? Maybe you wanted to exercise more, or lose weight. Maybe it was to spend more time with the family or lower your handicap. Our goals are often admirable and attainable, but learning to set effective goals and understanding how they lead us toward achievement increases the probability of success.

More than 90% of studies investigating behavioral techniques show that goal setting has a powerful and consistent effect on performance across a wide variety of sports and occupations. Goals influence us mechanically by directing our attention, mobilizing our efforts and prolonging our persistence. Indirectly, goals influence our psychological state by affecting our levels of confidence, anxiety and fulfillment.

Performance enhancement as a function of goal setting greatly depends on correctly implementing the technique.

Our goals generally fall into two distinct categories: Outcome Goals versus Process Goals. Outcome goals usually focus on competitive results whereas process goals tend to be concerned with achieving standards. An outcome goal may be par, and a properly applied process goal like keeping the chin down on every tee shot increases the likelihood of achievement. Beyond these distinctions, goals can be short-term or long-term. However, successful short-term goals are framed by suitable long-term goals.

In the examples of our New Year's resolutions, we set excellent long-term goals. If we have fallen short of these goals it could be that we have not matched them with appropriate short-term goals. We want to

exercise more - so we will walk 30 minutes after dinner every night. We want to lose weight - so we will no longer eat after 9pm. We want to spend more time with the family - so we will create a daily "family hour". And most importantly, we want to lower our handicap — so we will consult a Sport Psychologist!
