





Eight years ago life changed for Ocean City locals Joanna and Bob Wilkinson with the sudden and tragic loss of their son Sammy.

In our tight-knit Ocean City community, that evening in January 2003 left a lot of people feeling confused and angry. A lot of emotion with no understanding of what to do with it.

And, in a time when strength was an elite premium, this community bonded together as hundreds turned out to attend the first ever Jam For Sam. Seacrets opened its doors to host the event. Local musicians showed up to perform in memory of Sammy. The Wilkinsons were there, and so were their families. In their most challenging time, they reached out to the community. And, whether, in that moment, they realized it or not, they had a message to send.

That night as Bob scanned the crowd – friends, family and families of friends – all there to offer support, he said, "Look at all of this. Sammy did this. Look what he did."

And, with that, they set out to create a legacy. In a time seemingly absent of strength, they filled a room with power – on a cold, February evening. And, if they could do that in just a few weeks after an emotionally tragic

time, then what could they do in a year, or two....or eight?

In the past eight years, the Wilkinsons have worked closely with the National Alliance for Youth Sports (founded by Joanna's father, Fred Engh) to create and implement the Global Gear Drive which is funded by the Sammy Wilkinson Foundation.

The goal of the foundation is simple. It's all about helping kids. According to Bob and Joanna, the Global Gear Drive is meant to "get kids balls and equipment" – no matter where they live in the world and what their personal circumstances are. "We want to bring some joy to the lives of kids" – kids who might be challenged to find joy on their own. "We want to show them that someone, maybe even far away, understands how important playing is for children. The joy it brings is priceless."

And, Sammy knew that joy well. "Sammy loved sports!" said Joanna. "He was an excellent soccer player and had just started competitive soccer with the Makos before his death. He actually had to choose between gymnastics and soccer that fall, and it was hard for him to choose. He was competitive, but always a fair and respectful player. He had a sweet nature and would never want anyone to feel bad or defeated. He was a great sport!"

Bob has participated in the development of the foundation since its inception. He has experienced a field dedication in Dominica in Sammy's name. He witnessed poverty in India, yet felt the joy of performing for 20,000 people in their country who accepted positive change in their

lives in Sammy's name. And the list of prominent foundation memories continues to grow.

This year," Joanna adds, "sitting down with Carolyn Cordial and Stefanie Gordy of Worcester Youth & Family Services and hearing the passion and dedication they have in helping kids in Worcester County" is yet another positive memory for the foundation.

And now, embarking on year eight of its primary fundraiser, the Sammy Wilkinson Memorial Golf Tournament and Jam For Sam, the Wilkinsons have decided to donate a portion of the funds raised from this event to Worcester Youth & Family Services. "We want to help them to continue to implement the wonderful programs they are already doing, so we've decided to contribute some of the funds raised at our annual golf tournament and jam to help kids who live here in our community," Bob and Joanna explained.

In the wake of a tragic life change, the Wilkinsons and their families chose to change lives in Sammy's name. Seems fitting for a family with an Ocean City legacy dating back more than 75 years to give back to the community in this way.







Ocean City's beach is always free. Add a full line-up of free, family friendly activities and events, and your visit to Ocean City takes on added value and added fun. In fact, you will find a free activity or event to enjoy on almost every night of the week. From concerts and movies on the beach, to live entertainment in the bayside parks, your family will have plenty of free fun to choose from.

Radio Disney AM 640 Philadelphia, part of the #1 radio outlet for kids, tweens and families, returns to Ocean City with its popular "Sizzlin' Summer of Stars" event series, featuring appearances and concerts by popular recording artists and meet and greets with stars throughout the summer on the beach at North Division Street from 6 to 9 p.m. on selected Sundays.

The Radio Disney Road Crew will provide entertainment, music, games and prizes throughout each event. All events are free and open to the public (talent can only meet as many fans as time allows). For more information, visit www.radiodisney.com/philadelphia

The Town of Ocean City presents Family Movie Nights on the beach at 27th Street every Monday and Friday at 8:30 p.m. from June 27 through August 12. Also free movies on the beach will be held on Wednesdays in front of the Carousel Hotel at 118th Street and Thursdays in front of the Princess Royale Hotel on 91st Street. Both of these shows will begin at 8:30 p.m.

Returning this summer is the Family Beach Olympics Night on the 27th Street beach every Tuesday, June 28-August 9, at 6:30 p.m. with activities such as sand castle contests, tug of war and relay games.

Free weekly Concerts on the Beach hit the stage on the North Division Street beach just steps from the Boardwalk on Wednesday evenings at 8 p.m., July 13-August 24 (no concert July 27).

Ocean City plays host to numerous fishing tournaments including the annual White Marlin Open, the world's largest billfish tournament the first week in August.

Nearby Assateague Island is a natural treasure of barrier island life where the famous wild horses can be found, along with Sika deer, otter and 260 species of birds. Nature trails wind across the island and the Barrier Island Visitor Center is a great place to start.

Ocean City offers a variety of water sports. Rent a pontoon boat and glide along the bay, or try a jet ski and dash across the waves. For a bird's eye view of Ocean City, try parasailing high above the bay or ocean. You can also enjoy kayaking, canoeing, surfing, boogie boarding and windsurfing.

I was sitting on my overlooking the golf course and I happened to notice on that particular day how over weight some






I know what you're thinking...I play by the rules! REALLLLLY. Let's test this theory:
Do you have a USGA (United States Golf Association) rule book in your bag? If so, do you ever take it out? Have you ever read it? If you don't have a rule book, you should. If you don't ever take it out, you should. And if you have never read through the rule book, you're missing out on a thriller! I'm serious... the rule book is fascinating! The Decisions Book even more so! The number of possible situations coming up during a golf round is infinite...as are the possibilities!

It would be impossible to have a rule for every strange thing that happens, but the USGA and the Royal and Ancient (old guys making rules in Europe somewhere) have done a great job of covering the basics and allowing for weird things to fit in. From foxes and geese stealing your golf ball, to Walruses kneeling on towels to hit golf shots, the rules of golf cover it all.

This time you're thinking...yeah, but the rules are no fun...they just penalize you when you mess up! Not so! The rules are there to help you. Once you understand (and believe) that, a whole new world opens up to you as a law abiding player. Think about this: if an ausprey dives down and steals your golf ball, would you rather hire a nature guide to help you track down the raptor and retrieve you ball, or just drop another ball in play? Would you rather dive down to the bottom of a pond to find and play an errant shot, or add a mere one stroke to your score and drop a new ball on the dry green grass? Would you rather attempt to strike the ball off the foot of an eight foot tall giant (from Happy Gilmore...if you haven't seen it, you should), or take a simple free drop? Yes the rules are there to help, not harm. But in order to take advantage of the rules (Tiger Woods having 10 guys move a boulder in Arizona) you must know them intimately.

Read through the rule book a couple of times. You don't even have to pay all that much attention. Just kind of let the information sift around in your brain. Some of it may even make sense. The amazing thing is ...once you're familiar with the rules they come drifting into focus when needed on the course...like magic. Though unlike magic, rules require proof when confronted by non-believers, so have a rule book handy to back up your psychic visions. Always look up the rule in question to confirm that you are right! Don't take some schmo's rule interpretation as gospel...check it out to be sure! I love showing someone in black and white that they just did something aggregations and will surely loose the match because of it. Actually, though this sounds fun, the rules are there to help you, and help you police yourself...they are not there to make you a finger pointer (you did this...you broke that...you loose...you'll never play again, etc.)

Remember, golf is THE ULTIMATE Gentleman's (and Ladies') game. We play with honor, integrity, and honesty...and we play with a little help...from the rules.


MAKE A NEW PLAN. STAN

Do you want to play better golf? Yep I said it, I started off the article exactly the way most infomercials begin. Note to self, yes you want to play better golf. That is one of the reasons you normally read a golf magazine. In every sport, coaches or players develop game plans to help their execution on the field. Even sandlot football kids draw lines in the dirt detailing game plans to attack the other teams. Golf should be no different! You should be making an individual game plan to help you play against the golf course. One of the ways better players have become so successful in their golf game is by keeping a journal of their playing and practicing habits. They set up realistic goals for themselves on and off the course. They form good practice habits that travel to the course with them during the round. A personal golf journal can quickly identify weak spots in your game and help you focus on the areas that you should practice more. Some of the stats I keep track of in my golf journal include keeping track of the amount of fairways hit, greens in regulation (GIR), number of putts, one putts vs. three putts, acceptable misses, up and downs, penalty strokes and so on. Most people keep track of pars, birdies, bogeys and so forth. I take my journal a bit further, I include practice sessions with time spent hitting various clubs and swing thoughts I may have been using on that particular day. If I had troubles in a particular area on a certain day I can now go back and see how much time I devoted to practicing that part of the game. There is normally a direct correlation between the two. When I asked someone how they played, they normally respond with "I shot a 94, but it should have been an 87 because I hit two in the water on 8 and 3, putted number 12." In reality, they shot 94 because of those things. Should have and could of are not on the score card. Score is just a number and the real focus should be on your preparation to play on any particular day. Once you keep a journal you will now realize that you shot 94 because you got up and down on 3 of the 10 greens that you missed in regulation. The focus now turns on iron play and short game. That is how you can learn from your golf mistakes and what will make you a better player. This is the key that will set you free. Now, if I can only get that old Paul Simon song out of my head.






















PGA CHOLARSHIPS



YOU KNOW THE DRILL BY STEVE MENZ

ITCHY TRIGGER FINGER

One of the common mistakes I see in the golf swing is swinging the club from the top with your right hand. This happens when your most dominate hand takes control of the swing and tries to hit the golf ball resulting in an outside to inside club path and normally a slice. One way to neutralize that dominant hand is to take you thumb and forefinger on your lowest hand on the grip and point them like a gun. Address the ball and swing while trying to keep them from gripping the club in anyway. At the end of the swing if you see the fingers still pointing in like a gun and trigger, your dominant hand has been removed from the swing. If you see the fingers curled around the shaft you have hit it form the top of the swing with that hand. Now you know the drill!



- 4. Play the ball down. You have to learn how to hit shots from bad lies to be the complete competitor. Not to mention, touching the ball anywhere but the tee and green usually results in a one stroke penalty.
- **5.** Learn the rules of the game by obtaining a USGA rule book and study it. Penalties are assessed during practice rounds, qualifying rounds, and matches for any and all infractions. Ignorance to the rules is not an excuse. United States Golf Association www.usga.org
- 6. Learn to control your anger. Swearing, club throwing, kicking objects, etc. will not be tolerated at all. Act with maturity and control on and off the course.
- 7. Get a physical if you haven't already done so. Physicals are valid in public high school for 365 days. Permission slips, physical forms, emergency forms, etc. are usually required before you may try out for your high school team.
- 8. Don't concentrate on driving, as much as your short game. Tournaments are won around the green with chipping and putting. That's why Long Drive Champions do not excel on the PGA Tour.
- 9. Walk the course as often as possible when you play. You must have strong legs to play competitive golf. Tired legs usually results in bad golf.
- **10.** Don't take golf for granted. It's not a right, it's a privilege. However, any player who does not exhibit respect for the game, the facilities, and the people involved could jeopardize their high school experience. You are representing your school and you are a reflection of your coach. Do not embarrass your teammates, coaches, family or yourself.
- 11. Enjoy the sport. It is one of the few sports that can be played for a lifetime. Don't let the game control you, you control the game. Everyone has their share of horrible rounds. You may hit a slump this summer and at other times strike the ball with resounding confidence. Don't give up - don't be a quitter. It would be a perfect world if everyone could post scores near par, however, that takes a great deal of practice and commitment. If you're not committed to getting better, your game may never improve. It doesn't happen overnight while you're sleeping, or in the ocean on your body board, or in your room on the X-Box: it happens on the range, the chipping green, and the golf course.
- 12. Remember to always respect and appreciate those who give you the opportunities to play golf. Be thankful to your family and the people who make it possible for you to enjoy the sport. Good Luck in your preparations for the upcoming season. Practice, play, and learn from those golfers whom you respect.

"PLAYING THE GAME"

Looking back during my 27 years as a teacher and player I have come to an understanding that the average golfer does not know how to play the game of golf. Sure! A golfer can take lessons on how to strike the ball and feel committed about his swing, But! Does he actually use what is necessary to play the game on the golf course? Golf course designers, when they build a golf course, utilize strategic parts of the course such as: water hazards, sand traps, trees,

etc. to strengthen their design on every hole. The question is, Do we focus on these elements when we play? I can say definitively that the majority of amateur golfers do not. Let's take for example a golf hole playing 325 yards. There is a water hazard down the left side of the fairway with sand traps guarding the right side alone with a line of trees. What do you think the club of choice is on the tee? Driver!! Why? Play the hole as designed. Hit a club that get's you 150-180 yards. This distance should keep you short of the sand traps and definitely away from the trouble on the left side of the fairway. Now you are in the fairway looking at the green. What is better than being in the short grass? If you really want to lower your handicap let's play smart around the golf course. Each golfer playing should understand his capabilities. Being long and wrong is never the answer when playing golf. Why do you think these designers set the playing field as they do? They set up a hole with risk reward factor always. Keep the "Ego" feeling out of your round. Play Smart! Look at each hole and visualize your success by doing the right thing. I understand that it takes a lot of practice making a shot go where you want it to go, but by hitting an iron or hybrid off the tee, you have a better chance of keeping the ball

in the short grass. I know some holes are longer than others but playing smart can lower your score. Even on the longer holes "golf course management" if approached with some form of regularity will get you playing better and will lower your scores. You can create continuity in your golf game. Let's look back at the 2011 Player's Championship. David Toms had a one shot lead over KJ Choi on the Par 5, 16th hole at the TPC @ Sawgrass. KJ Choi playing it smart laid up 90-100 yards out. What happened to David

Toms second shot? His feet above the ball and water down the right side, David Toms knocks it in the water. Eventually he ends up losing the tournament. Was he going for the green or did he just miss hit the shot? I can tell you for certain that he didn't have an iron in his hand. When we lose focus on what we need to do and make a bad decision, we end up paying the price. So, let's start learning to think around the golf course when we play. There are good PGA Professionals around the area that can help you

do this. If you never had a playing lesson with a PGA Professional you should really think about it. His thoughts and strategies will help you play the game of golf with a different approach. Good Luck! See you on the golf course.





YOUR PATH TO PAR Richard Robinson- Instructor The Original Golf School

Golf is an elusive and illusory game. What you see is most often, what you get. The trick is to see the correct things. Your vision of a golfing challenge, defines your response to it, and thus determines how you play the game.

There are four major competitors challenging us each time we tee up. The first is our physical ability to perform golf skills and techniques. The second is "Old Man Par", the conjurer of expectation and aspiration. Third, weather conditions provide the ephemeral element of chance testing our ability to adapt to the unusual. Fourth, course design that challenges our judgment. These four conspire against your score, but understanding their interactions can magnify your enjoyment of the game and enhance your ability to play it well.

Technique, scoring, weather and course design are similar in that they are potential distractions. The best players play best when they: have one technical swing key; play one shot at a time; concede that mother nature is to be respected and can't be overpowered and

see clearly the intention of the course design. To see improvement in your skill you must expect to commit to learning and practicing your game. To see Old Man Par on more than just a few holes, avoid being tempted to try a shot you think "should" be played and make the shot you know you can play. Adapting to weather conditions is a matter of proper clothing, a desire to learn adaptive skills, and simply refining your expectations. To master the course you must match your style of play with demands of the design.

Tournament players often comment that a particular course "fits their eye". This means that when they step up on the tee, they intuitively perceive the challenges of the design and the shots required are comfortable for the player. The challenge is to develop the skill to make every hole fit your eye.

For each shot identify a landing area that is comfortable to reach with an average shot. The priority is to keep the ball in play. Once the target is identified, focus intently on it. Your eyes will act just like a camera. The focus and concentration you put on the target will blur the surrounding areas in your field of vision. Lock into this vision, address the ball and swing. It is simple, but not easy. Research has shown that "target acquisition" is the last thing you see and acknowledge. Trust and commitment = see the fairway, expect to hit the fairway, hit the fairway. Doubt and distraction = see the fairway, expect to hit the fairway, notice the hazard, think avoid the hazard, see the hazard to be avoided, hit the hazard. What you see and expect is what you get! During my lifetime in golf, I've had several pearls of wisdom that were tossed in my direction. Some of them I caught and understood them right away. Others slipped through my hands only to be gathered for digestion at a later date, while others rolled away and down the drain never to be

The following is a list of some of those that I've been able to hang onto and sometimes use while teaching and playing the game.

"The dog wags the tail!" this is from the great teacher, Bill "Coach" Strausbaugh. Coach was one of the most enthusiastic teachers I've ever met. His respect for, and love of the game of golf was evident in every lesson he gave.

The dog wags the tail means that the inner body swings the arms. Nothing moves until inner body moves it.

"The golf swing is 96% set-up, 2% swing and 2% in God's hands." Coach Strausbaugh. If you set up properly, it's just two turns and send it. What ever happens, happens. If you set up improperly, somewhere during the swing you must make an adjustment if you want to deliver a good impact position through the ball.

"It's in the divot!" Craig Shankland is probably the second most enthusiastic teacher I've ever met and not very far behind the Coach. Craig Shankland is a top teacher down in the Daytona area. It's in the divot means that you can tell what's going on in the swing by looking at your divot. Learn how to make a nice divot and you can hit nice shots. Learn how to make a shallow, straight divot and you can hit solid, straight

"It's in the dirt!" Ben Hogan, when asked what about his mystical secret. The meaning? It was his ways of saying, I figured out by hitting balls, so now it's up to you to do the same. It was also his way of saying that there is no secret. Hard work pays off eventually. On a side note: I know someone who worked closely with Ben Hogan. He asked him on three different occasions about his "secret" and was given three different answers.

"Two turns and a swish!" Charlie Sorrell, a top teacher in the Georgia area. This is the best, most simple description of the golf swing I've heard. You turn the upper body away from the target, then you turn the lower body towards the target and then, the swish happens. Many of the golfers I see get that sequence wrong. There's a turn away from the target, a swish and then a false turn of the lower body to finish.

If you think, turn upper, turn lower and let the swish be last, you are at least swinging with the proper sequence. If you feel a complete finish to the swing, you are using your lower body properly. If you don't feel a complete finish, it's a sign that you probably have a turn-swish-turn swing instead of the turn-turn-swish swing.

"Are you ok if you miss it? Then go ahead and make it!" Tony, a nutty friend of mine that caddied for me in an event. Tony was an excellent thinker around the course. By asking me if I was ok if I missed it, he was freeing me from any tension or apprehension in the putting stroke on an important putt. By saying then go ahead and make it, he was giving me a positive thought. I'm pretty sure I made it. It was a long time ago, but the question/statement I remember clearly.

Today is my day! Let's run with it! Dr. Patrick Cohn, a sports psychologist in the Orlando Area. Many golfers who start out with a score that is much lower than they are comfortable with, will start to wonder when the wheels will fall off. Inside, they don't feel that they are capable of keeping that low score going to the end. The truth is you can do it because you just did it. Instead of wondering when the wheels will come off and get back to your normal share of bad shots, you need to think that today, I have it!!!

Let's run with it! Don't give the wheels a chance to come off.

SHORE UP WITH THE GAME COACH CARSON LOVETT, MA, SPORT PSYCHOLOGY

US OPEN

Many of golf's greats gathered west of the Chesapeake in June for the 111th United States Open Championship and ESGM was there to witness history. Rory McIlroy led from start to finish and dominated the competition with a record-setting performance becoming the youngest golfer to win the US Open since the early 1920's. When discussing his success he mentioned a key that can be utilized by golfer's of every age and skill level: the competition he dominated in winning by eight strokes was Congressional Country Club, not Jason Day, Davis Love III or Phil Mickelson.



McIlroy focused on small goals and hitting course targets throughout the tournament, practices researchers believe can enhance in-competition confidence and build self-assurance. His ability to "Play The Course" allowed him to eliminate the field, leaving one competitor. At that point the contest became a simple game of an athlete versus an obstacle. With all variables controlled for, McIlroy's superior skill was uninhibited.

A few days prior to the 2011 Open Championship, McIlroy went on a mission to Haiti as a representative of UNICEF to assist in the recovery from the devastation that followed the earthquake of 2010. Upon returning he spoke of how that trip enabled him to prioritize golf and what is truly important in life. It served as therapy following his final-round meltdown at the 2011 Master's and helped him accept the pressure for exactly what it is: a natural part of the game. McIlroy rediscovered that golf is fun to play and an exciting one-on-one activity. His approach to the tournament is a reminder that the number of playing partners may vary, but golf's challenge remains the same; man versus terrain.

GOLF FITNESS - WRIST INJURIES

Last month we discussed wrist injuries in golf. This time I would like to talk a little about a wrist problem that everyone has heard of but few know about in detail, and that is carpal tunnel syndrome (CTS). Can this caused by too much golf? The answer is that as advanced as medical knowledge is, no one has identified the cause for this problem except to say that there are believed to be many causes repetitive use of the hands is felt to be one of the factors, but many others are believed to be contributory.


The setup up is anatomically simple – a nerve to the wrist and fingers (median nerve) passes through a "tunnel", the roof of which is a tendinous band at the wrist and the floor of which are the carpal bones. Also passing through this tunnel are the tendons (flexor) to the fingers. If inflammation of any cause makes the tendons swell, pressure is exerted upon the nerve in this restricted tunnel, and symptoms occur, typically numbness and tingling in the fingers. There may be pain, and there may be weakness when

trying to grip things. So initial treatment is



like a lot of other problems we have talked about – rest, sometimes immobilization (wrist splinting) and anti-inflammatory agents. If these fail after a reasonable trial, surgery may be necessary. This involves cutting the tendinous band discussed above, thus allowing pressure to be removed from the nerve. If left go for protracted periods of time, the end result could be permanent damage to the nerve and long term symptomatology.

As you employ conservative measures to improve things and hopefully avoid surgery, you look for things that might be contributing to what caused the problem. Are you using wrist motions with too much force or too repetitively in anything you are doing? For the golfer this may be too much grip pressure at address or other mechanical issues such as worn golf grips. Some authorities advise using golf gloves on both hands to provide extra cushioning. I personally used to do this, but for a different reason – palmar psoriasis, which was aggravated by excessive friction on the palmar area. Then there are the obvious ways to reduce inflammation - fewer rounds of golf and fewer practice balls, not fun alternatives for someone trying to improve his or her game, but better than having to give the sport up completely, which I read happened to Ken Venturi.

While visiting The Smoke Shop at Etch Art Awards for the last article, I took advantage of the opportunity to try some Kristoff Maduro cigars. Having been an enthusiast of cigars for over twenty years, I enjoy cigars that are bold in flavor. This one certainly lives up to those expectations.



On The Range

We start off with the beautiful Brazilian wrapper showing its deep richness looking like a bar of dark chocolate. There is a nice firmness to the touch. A pre-light sniff lets you know that this is going to offer up a hearty smoke.


Front Nine

The cigar lights up with a smooth, even burn. The draw is nice and steady. As you work you way through the first third, the blend of Dominican, Cuban seed and Nicaraguan tobaccos start to work it's magic. You know that this is not one to rush through.


Back Nine

Past the halfway point, you realize that this cigar is not for the faint of heart or for the first timer. While this full flavored cigar might get your putting stroke a little bit on the shaky side, you might consider it worth the trade-off. The burn and draw remained even and steady until the end. The boldness increased with a bit of a spicy finish.

While I prefer a cigar with a bit less kick for the golf course. I will certainly keep a supply of these in the humidor for casual rounds or for the 19th hole.


