ANNIE HAYESRISING TO THE CHALLENGE

Golf is a simple game that offers the most complex challenge, to transcend your own personal expectations and limitations. What fellow competitors do has no real effect on you. The ball sits stationary on the ground and is motionless until you make it move. It has no capacity to influence its future destination, it will only respond to your skill and intention. The method and techniques of controlling the ball are varied in style, tempo, power, efficiency such that effectiveness, and thus success, are measured not by how you prevail in making a par or better score, but by the stark reality that you do. Golf soars beyond the limitation of tournament formats, scoring systems, aerodynamic design and material technology. It is personal. Golf seems unique in challenging the mind, body, and spirit of those who seek mastery of the game and of themselves. This is why those who demonstrate the ability to meet such challenges intrigue us. I have been privileged to meet several of the world's great players, but among the list, Annie Hayes sits at the pinnacle throne of inspiration.

Annie's golf swing has evolved. A few years ago her back swing exemplified balance and grace with a wide high arc that created power potential. The weakest point in her swing was at impact. She tended to overemphasize her arm motion in an apparent effort to hit the ball hard. A versatile athlete giving extra effort was Annie's natural reaction. For example, her enthusiasm to test herself often found her mountain biking over rough and hilly terrain that strained her legs, lungs, heart and will to endure. On one such ride, she came to a bridge. Crossing it changed her life. The tires of her bike jammed between two misplaced boards. She was thrown off the bridge, landing on a fallen tree and suffered a paralyzing spinal injury. Suddenly golfing terms like impact and transition had a devastating tone. Yet, golf was to remain a key component of Annie's life.

"Golf was one of the things that gave me a goal. At first, just basic life skills, like getting dressed, were challenges but golf offered special goals. I became determined to play again," Annie said. She found new ways to play. She acquired a SoloRider golf cart, designed to carry clubs, navigate the terrain of a golf course, and its adjustable seat provides support while the rider makes the golf swing.

Soon Annie was not only developing a new game, she was also becoming an inspiration for all who play the game and many who never considered it a possibility. Her championship attitude has been critical to her achievement. "Life is like golf. Nothing is perfect. We all make mistakes and unfortunate things happen unexpectedly. But, you cannot dwell on the bad shot. You have to move on to the next one and give it your best. A golf course is full of hazards. There are ponds, traps, bunkers, trees, boundaries and obstacles to be avoided the best we can. We can't always avoid them. But, we can overcome their effect." Annie's approach lands in a shallow greenside bunker. Her SoloRider golf cart can navigate the sand. She takes her club from her bag mounted on the front of



the cart, adjusts her cart seat and blasts out onto the green. The cart leaves little trace of its presence. In fact, the pressure has no greater effect than that of a 200-pound man walking on a green. She drives onto the green lines up her putt, and with a single stroke confirms that hazards are meant to be overcome.

The details of her rehabilitation rival the legendary efforts of Ben Hogan, though to date she has not recovered use of her legs. In this regard, she is still playing the front nine. Medical research and technology offer reasons to be optimistic. However, optimism is intrinsic to the spirit of Annie Hayes. Her physical capacity has been limited but her ability to play the game has not been compromised. Playing from a specially designed cart, Annie navigates the course with finesse and determination. She strikes the ball solidly and consistently. She is constantly seeking ways to improve. What is her current handicap? It is down six shots from last season. Give

Annie a stroke a hole and you had better match par to keep pace.

Annie Hayes embraces the philosophy that golf is a journey. Most of all she lives by her motto "You take yourself where ever you go." After meeting and working with Annie at the Original Golf School, I would add, "You leave a part of yourself where ever you have been." Although she takes no steps, Annie leaves



footprints along her life's path that guide and inspire others to meet challenges with optimism, perseverance, and grace.

Tucked away in Caroline County,

among the corn fields and on the banks of the Choptank River, is the charming golf course known as Caroline Country Club. Though it is most definitely off the beaten path, Caroline Country Club is one of the finest golf courses on the Eastern Shore. The now semi-private club, rich with history of Caroline County, has new owners, and they have big plans of restoring the club to its former glory.

Located just south of Denton, Maryland, Caroline Country Club is a place where one can truly relax and play a peaceful game of golf. The course is challenging, and provides an entertaining experience for golfers of all abilities. This is something that the members have known for years, contributing to Caroline's reputation as "the best kept secret on the Eastern Shore." And it was in part this secret, as well as the economic crash of 2008, that led to the club finding itself in financial trouble in late 2010.

Par Fore Us, LLC is the company that stepped in to save Caroline Country Club when its future was in jeopardy. Made up of Jeff and Bernice Parenteau, of Denton, Maryland, and Joe and Judy Jarnutowski of New Hampshire, Par Fore Us, LLC was formed when they heard the club was in trouble. It was brought to the member's attention in the winter of 2011 that the club was in trouble financially and in danger of closing.

The subject of the club and what could be done to save it was brought up by Jeff, a member of Caroline, to his cousin Judy and her husband Joe during a visit. They talked of the opportunity of purchasing CCC in hopes of bringing the club back to where it used to be in the 70's; a flourishing golf course and country club with over 400 members.

"The reason for the decline has many faces," says Bernice. "But what we did know was that Caroline Country Club in the day was the place to be. All the movers and shakers in the area met and socialized there. It was so sad to think that a place that had been an icon for almost 50 years was going to join so many golf courses, a scene of over grown greens."

Caroline Country Club is also a sentimental place for the Parenteaus. Jeff's first job was working at the pool checking members in, and he and his brothers worked in the clubhouse as teenagers. Jeff and Bernice also had their wedding reception at the club, 23 years ago.

In July 2011, Par Fore Us, LLC. (an entity created solely for the purpose of purchasing CCC) became the new owner of Caroline Country Club. Par Fore Us has started its long range plan with various improvements to the Clubhouse such as completely remodeling the River Room dining room, purchasing new and improved kitchen equipment, refurbishing the ballroom, remodeling the main entrance and pro shop, and making the main lavatory handicap accessible.

"If it has been a while since you have been here, you will be surprised to see what a little tender loving care, a few hundred gallons of paint, and as I like to say, 'a little Botox' can do to a place," says Bernice, who has taken charge of refurbishing and completely transforming the interior of the clubhouse.

In addition to modernizing the clubhouse, the new owners have also upped the golfing experience. The course itself has always had a following, and it is in great condition, thanks to Greens Superintendent Scott Reside. But the golfing experience is even more enjoyable now.

"We purchased new mowers and also new carts, with GPS navigation, scoreboard capabilities, and two-way communication," says Joe Jarnutowski. "We also plan on redoing the bunkers, repaving some of the cart paths, and we are entertaining the thought of reworking a few of the fairways and moving to another type of grass."

As for staffing, Par Fore Us hired back longtime Caroline Country Club head pro, Bobby Rementer. They also brought on board Scott Stokes, Chris Norton, and Maria Holiday as Assistant Pro, Executive Chef, and Director of Marketing, respectively.

Some of the other big plans the owners have? Building a new pro shop and adding onto the current clubhouse. In 2011, the owners met with local architect, Jay Corvan, who has a similar vision for Caroline Country Club.

"We want to remove the pro shop from the current clubhouse and build a brand new Pro Shop and cart barn," says Jeff.

The clubhouse will also have major renovations. It is the intention of Par Fore Us to create a facility that will provide its members special attention and privileges such as having their own "Member's only" dining and lounge area overlooking the 9th hole, where they might enjoy watching others make the turn (and possibly make a slight bet on a given shot). The design of the future clubhouse will accommodate a variety of events simultaneously without affecting one another.

There are murmurings of designing a bridal suite above the Pro Shop making for a perfect wedding package to include the night before rehearsal dinner, wedding ceremony, wedding reception and morning after brunch.



As of recent, the owners have decided to make the course semi-private, inviting everyone to enjoy the course and restaurant.

"Obviously the renovation and addition plans are exciting, but we also want people to know that everyone is welcome to enjoy the course, the food, and the wonderful view of the river." says Jeff.

"We have the best members," says Bernice. "They have supported us through the transition, and they have supported the club for so many years. And of course, membership does have its privileges, such as priority tee times, discounts, reciprocity, and use of all the facilities. But we want everyone to be able to enjoy Caroline Country Club"

This place used to be known as the best kept secret on the Eastern Shore. But the location, the course, and the clubhouse- it's far too special to be kept a secret.

How can you hit your second shot first...

I have to give credit to my good friend Bryan Taylor for giving me the idea about writing this article. Bryan often jokes he wanted to write a book with the same title and it would probably be a best seller if it could help us figure out how to hit our second shot first. Now, just to clarify, I'm not talking about your approach shot on a par 4. I'm talking about those times when you knock the ball out of bounds or hit it directly in the water or even miss a simple 3 foot putt and then tee it or drop it on your next shot and hit it right down the middle or knock it on the green or tap in that easy 3 footer. We all know how our mind plays tricks on us throughout the round and this is just another great example of that reality! Once you have hit that first bad shot, all the pressure seems to go away! You hit your second shot and all you think about is where you're going to hit the ball and where not to hit it! Why can't we just do that on the first ball? Sounds simple right? It's not! But here are a few tips to help you play your second shot first!

First, as I mentioned, clear your head and think about what you want to do not what you don't want to. If you start thinking about hitting a bad shot, you probably will. This is not only true in golf but it's also true in life. As my other friend Charlie Thompson likes to say "positive in positive out, negative in negative out." Second, if you're not comfortable with the shot you're going to hit don't hit it! Change your club or change your mind but make sure you are committed to the shot you want to play and visualize it! Finally don't take too much time to think about it! It's just golf, not life or death, so don't drive yourself crazy over that 3 footer or tough tee shot. Just pull the trigger and remember it is just a game! You will enjoy yourself a lot more and the people you're playing with will enjoy your company a lot more too!



First, loft. You need lots of it. 60 or 64 degree wedges work great for this shot, but a 56 will do if you open the face (like an overstuffed sandwich...love the Greene Turtle!)

Second, you need a long lazy swing like Fred Couples...short and quick won't do it here. You gotta be smooth...silky to a full follow through.

Third, you have to be confident...no second guessing here. Commit, Commit, Commit. Once you start the swing, there's no turning back. Otherwise it's chunk, skull, or whiff! Ok, we're ready to go. Ball position slightly forward in your stance, stance slightly open, hands slightly soft, and nerves slightly shaky. Take the club back slow, smooth, and just about full...allow the club to follow the line of your feet back, out, and up. Swing forward allowing the club to slide gracefully under the ball while holding the club face open sending the ball (hopefully) straight up in the air with little forward momentum. Pray. Follow through with smooth grace and balance...pose for the camera...smile! The ball should land as soft as "a butterfly with sore feet" (wish I could take credit for that one), and trickle gently to the hole... plop. "It's in the hole!!!" (Bill Murray – Caddy Shack – greatest movie EVER!).

And that's how you hit the mega flop like Tiger...actually, who am I kidding...I have no idea how he did it. I prefer to chop skull it into the pond on the other side of the green.

PUTTING 1,2,3

The ability to shoot a lower score is very much dependent upon your ability to make the short and intermediate length putts. When you watch golf on television, the players you are watching are the ones that are making the six to ten foot putts. That's why they are on the top of the leader board.

One way to improve your percentages in putting is to practice putting three different speeds on the short to intermediate length putts. There are many different ways to make the same putt. It's all about the speed that determines the amount of break to play. With this exercise we're using three different speeds, one, two and three. Speed one is a putt that is just dying into the hole. This putt requires taking into account the most amount of break in reading the putt. The slower the ball is rolling, the more gravity will have an effect on it. You choose this speed because the ball could run away on a downhill slope if the ball misses the hole. This speed also allows the ball to fall in from any side of the hole.

Speed two is a putt that gives the ball just a little airtime as it enters the hole. This speed is a pace that will help the ball stay on its intended path while rolling over imperfections in the green. The ball is rolling with some authority to the hole, yet won't go too far past if it misses. With this speed you'll play less break than a number one speed putt. This is a speed I try to use most of the time.

Speed three is a putt that has the ball hitting the back of the cup. The pace of this putt will mean there is very little break to it. You use this speed when it is a must make, short putt that has very little meaning afterwards if you miss. Use it in situations like you need this putt to halve a hole and if you miss you lose the hole anyway so it doesn't matter if it goes way past the hole.

You should practice each of these speeds so you get a feel for how the pace affects the break. The key to making these putts on the course is to first, decide which speed you are going to use and then read the amount of break for that speed. Second and most importantly, commit to that speed. Many short putts are missed because you read for a certain speed and then change your mind during the stroke. For instance, you choose a number one speed and then during the stroke, you tell yourself to make sure you get it there and then hit it through the break.

SO WITH A LITTLE PRACTICE, PUTTING WILL BE AS EASY AS 1, 2, 3!


GOLF FITNESS - NUTRITION

DR. PETE ZEMO

My article in this issue will continue with more nutritional info, a subject I love to write about. My wife teaches Pilates at our gym and in one of her trade magazines I found another article on nutrition, or more specifically, supplements. I found this nutritionist had a captivating way of putting things. In responding to the recurring inquiry, "Do I need to take supplements?", she responded. "You do not need to take nutritional supplements. You also don't need hot and cold running water or a television set. You do, however, need the nutrients that supplements provide." She goes on to reiterate many of the things I pointed out in the last article, such as the depletion of our soil, the extensive processing of menu items, etc. By and large, she points out that diet alone is not enough, and she refers to important nutrients such as Coenzyme Q-10, alpha-lipoic acid and Vitamin D which are found in only tiny amounts in just a few foods. Where to get them?- supplementation. Remember, vitamins and supplements are not meant to cure diseases, but possibly help to prevent them. And some nutrients depend on other nutrients to be effective. Plus, they often have a myriad of body functions, unlike an antibiotic which may be taken to cure a specific infection.

Okay – maybe you are convinced supplementation is important. Now you have to do due diligence to determine proper dosage and proper form. Remember, if a little of one thing is good, a lot of that same thing may not be. Too much of anything can be dangerous. I had a professor in medical school who used to point out that if a person could drink a gallon of water rapidly, it would almost certainly be fatal. So talk to people who understand nutrients; ironically, that person may not be your family doc. Some know as little about

nutrients as they do about the parameters of physical fitness and exercise. Once you have received this advice, then consider the form of the supplement. If you need to take calcium,



should it be calcium carbonate, calcium citrate or calcium malate? Should I take this supplement with food or on an empty stomach. Do your research and then get started. Our gym nutritionist has a quote I think needs emphasizing – it goes "A seismic revolution in health will not come from a pill, procedure or operation. It will occur only when the public is endowed with nutritional literacy".





Research confirms that competition anxiety adversely affects sport performance at every level of development; the stress experienced by the beginner aiming to improve is relative to that of the professional striving for perfection. World-renowned golf instructor Peter Kostas described tension as the destroyer of golf swings, and others agree that the ability to relax the muscles of the arms, chest and shoulders is paramount for distance, accuracy and course management success. Game Coaches and Sport Psychologists support prescribing Progressive Relaxation Techniques (PRT) to counteract the negative effects associated with competition-induced anxiety, in addition to competition-related concerns such as social interaction, as well as external factors such as an impending audit from the IRS.

Two common practices to foster a relaxed approach during sport performances are: Progressive Relaxation and Imaginal Relaxation. Progressive Relaxation Techniques regularly entail actively tensing and then relaxing specific muscle groups, typically beginning with the lower extremities and gradually moving through the shoulders and neck, with an accompanying deep breathing routine. Conversely, cognition is at the core of Imaginal Relaxation Techniques without actively tensing and relaxing muscles. Golfers interviewed to investigate the types of cognitive exercises they employ during competition reported success utilizing a variety of coping strategies including: rationalizing, blocking, reappraising, routine adherence, and positive self-talk.

The effect that anxiety and the resultant stress may have on optimal performance is magnified in the focus-intense sport of golf. The dynamics of the game can free attention capacity and lead the athlete to reallocate vital data-processing resources from sport-specific tasks to less-relevant stimuli, thereby impairing performance. Understanding the nature of stress and developing a proactive coping mechanism will better equip the golfer to approach each challenge with a clearer perspective.

Get a good grip! The way you place your hands on the club determines how you will and should do everything else involved in your golf Slight changes in hand position can make monumental changes in power and accuracy of your shots. Getting a good grip on the club is critical, but it

involves more than just technique. There are three factors in a good grip, the placement of the hands on the club, the pressure or tension exerted by the hands to control the club and the surface connection of the hands to the club. The last element that is easiest to improve yet most often overlooked.

By the middle of summer, exposure to heat, sunlight, sweat, suntan lotion, all gradually contribute to slippery grip surface. Simply cleaning grips by scrubbing with soap and water can save a few strokes per round. Many players ignore this simple maintenance. The obvious effect of slippery grips is loss of control if the club twists during the swing, but also loss of power caused by the increased muscle tension required to avoid such twisting. The value of a high tech shaft that reduces torque or twisting of the club is diminished by a slippery grip.

To select the best grip consider size, shape and composition. The composition of the grip effects feedback on the shot. Softer shock absorbing grips help those with hand, wrist, elbow and shoulder injuries or sensitivities. They dampen the vibration of the shaft vibration on impact and thus are more comfortable. Firmer grips are preferred by players who benefit from sensing the effects of a miss hit, and can adjust their technique based on this feedback. Tackiness is a factor if you play in humid or wet weather conditions. The shape of the grip can make it easier to repeat your chosen grip technique. Players using a 10-finger grip often find a grip with no taper better suited to this grip technique. Players with small hands or those who focus on grip pressure with the last three fingers of the lead hand might prefer a reverse taper grip, thinner at the top of the club and gradually thicker toward the exposed shaft. Thicker grips are sometimes helpful in reducing overactive hand action on full shots. Thick grips on wedges can encourage better pitching mechanics. Conversely, thinner grips encourage placement of the club in the fingers and may improve the ability to create and control leverage and increase swing speed. Of course, the "standard" size grip is standard for a reason. It fit's the needs of most players.

Getting a good grip is important. Replacing worn or inappropriately sized or shaped grips will save strokes. If you need help in grip technique or equipment get the advice of the professionals at you club, golf equipment shop or contact us at the Original Golf School.




GAP WEDGES-STUCK IN THE MIDDLE WITH YOU.


Let's face it, distance sells and every year club makers boast of longer yardage. The USGA has made specific guidelines for club manufacturers deciding what they can and cannot do to create a club that is conforming during competitive play. The have set parameters on grooves, length, and face thickness. These rules have been essential to the game of golf. If they gave the company's free reign, the golf courses would all have to be lengthened to 8,000 yards. So here is the conundrum, how do the manufacturers make the club go further by staying within the guidelines? Quite simply, they change the loft. The pitching wedge you may have been hitting in the 70's, 80's and 90's would have had a loft of 50 degrees. Today the pitching wedge in your bag probably has the loft closer to 44 degrees. Of course you are going to hit it farther, it is basically a 9 iron with a wedge stamp on it. This is also one of the reasons that hybrids have replaced longer irons. The club manufacturers have reduced the lofts across the full iron line. A 3 iron that may have had 21 degrees of loft will now have 18 degrees or less. Lower loft on a long iron requires higher club head speed and better compression to keep it

in the air. That is why hybrids became popular. They have a lower center of gravity that allows the club to launch the ball higher and keep it in the air.

This brings us back to the "gap" between the pitching wedge (44 degrees) of today and the sand wedge (56 degrees). These "gap" wedges have many other names. I have seen them called alternate, attack, approach or dual wedges. You may actually see an "A" stamped on the bottom of a wedge on some brands. In reality, if it were numbered sequentially it would be an 11 iron. Since over 65% of scoring happens within 150 yards, it makes sense to have more options with clubs under that yardage. So do yourself a favor, go to the range and figure out exactly how far you hit your pitching wedge and sand wedge. If you have a gap of 30 yards or more, fill in that hole with a gap wedge with the loft in the 50 to 52 degree range. It will save you from hitting that half pw or the smashed sw. You certainly wouldn't use a Phillips head screwdriver for a flat head screw. It is important to have the right tool for the job. Fill that gap and watch your scores benefit.








