BOB AFFELDER

WINS MD SENIOR OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP



"This is the 1:10 starting time. Now on the tee, from Ocean City Maryland, please welcome, Bob Affelder." PGA professional Bob Affelder was standing on hallowed ground, the historic Inverness Club, the place where Bobby Jones and Jack Nicklaus played their first U.S. Open. Bob was about to hit his first shot in the United States Senior Open.

As Director of the Original Golf School in Ocean City, Bob spends most of his golfing time teaching others how to play the greatest game. His talent and skill as a teacher are well established, but his ability and enthusiasm for tournament golf has resurfaced in recent years having reached the age to qualify for senior events. "One of the great aspects of golf is that it is a lifetime sport. At The Original Golf School we have numerous students who are taking up the game for the first time; many people are just beginning in their senior years", said Bob. The Senior bracket of USGA and PGA tournaments are wonderful opportunities for pros like Bob. He said "As we get older we lose our power game, shots don't fly as far as they once did. Modern tournament golf emphasizes power. The Senior events courses are set up to appropriately diminish the emphasis on distance, and thus all around shot making is more a factor in success." irony of this observation became apparent on the first tee.

"On the opening day my first hole was actually number 10. Starting on the first and tenth holes is the common practice on the first two days of competition. The tenth at Inverness is a short but exacting par 4 slight dogleg right with no fewer than 10 bunkers guarding the right side of the fairway, considered the most picturesque

on the course. "I debated whether to hit a driver or 3 The indecision proved costly. Determined to give it my best shot I went with the driver." Confident, undeterred by the Open rough, Bob made a great swing; the ball split the center of the fairway, flying in a graceful arc over the corner of the dogleg and beyond. The shot was too perfect, carrying through the fairway into the rough. "I made a great shot, the club choice was wrong. It was a classic case of going for it, with too much enthusiasm." As Bob came to the eighteenth hole, an errant tee shot, landed near a concession stand. "I was an embarrassing position to be in, so far off line. The officials moved the crowd to give me a clear view of the green. When my recovery shot nearly holed out, the crowd went wild. It was fun!" The experiences at the Senior Open were special and provided a foundation for future success.

In October, Bob teed it up again this time for the Maryland Senior Open Championship. Bob began the final round two shots off the lead. He was paired with Marty West, a Walker Cup veteran, a two time All American at North Carolina, and winner of numerous USGA amateur titles. West was three

shots off the lead. Bob got off to a fast start with birdies on the first and third holes, another birdie at the ninth and he finished the front nine in 33. Playing solidly on the back nine, the only bogey of the day on 16, Bob countered with a birdie on 17, for a closing round of 69. It was

the low round of the day that gave Bob a three-stroke lead and the Maryland Senior Open Championship.

GOLF FITNESS - STRETCHES DR. PETE ZEMO

This month I want to talk briefly about nutrition. As most of you know, there are critical amounts of vitamins, minerals, phytochemicals, antioxidants, etc. that are required for a normal and healthy lifestyle. These are even more important for very active people and athletes, including golfers. You say "I eat plenty of fruits and vegetables, so I get all that I need, right?" Probably wrong. Much has changed in the nutrient values of these products. Food is harvested before it is ripe; the soil it is grown in may have become depleted of important minerals. Chemical additives and preservatives are used; many foods are stored for long periods of time before you get them. For example, the apples in your supermarket may have been picked for up to 14 months before you get them. Here is an example- the amount of vitamin C in 100 grams of spinach in 1950 was 150 mg. In 1994, that same amount of spinach held 13 mg. The odds of you getting all that you need in your market is getting worse and worse. Maybe many of you have heard that a lot of the fruits and vegetable products sold by the Whole Foods market (all organic, right?) come from China. What do you think their standards for organic quality are?

So what can you do about it? Here is a quote from a recent issue of JAMA, the Journal of the American Medical Association.

"Most people do not consume an optimal amount of all vitamins by diet alone. Pending strong evidence of effectiveness from randomized trials, it appears prudent for all adults to take vitamin supplements". At our fitness club, we have been looking in depth at supplements on the market. We have on our staff a registered nutrition/wellness coach who works with our members who want to improve their dietary lifestyle. She and I work together to implement their supplemental/dietary needs, just as our trainers and instructors work to improve their general physical fitness needs. If your facility does not provide services such as these to better your overall fitness, look elsewhere. The words "Fitness Club" should incorporate all these things and not just be a "Gym". There was an article in the health section of the Washington Post that discussed this. The bottom line was strengthening the muscles of the "core" – the back and abdomen – can

help to improve it and prevent future disabling episodes. The stronger these muscles, the more they can help stabilize the spine, build stamina, reduce the need for pain meds, etc. We have talked about these exercise programs in the past. They include yoga, pilates, aerobic training and water aerobics. The aforementioned article describes a study where yoga and aerobic strength training programs were compared to a self-care program guided by a book. After 26 weeks, the yoga and exercise groups reported more pain relief and return of back function than those doing self-care.

Similar studies were done with pilates and aerobic training such as treadmills, stationary cycling and stair climbing. Water aerobics, of course, shifts weight away from the back strengthening can occur for those experience who too much pain with treadmills, etc.

The bottom line, if

you consider these options, is to find a quality fitness facility and hook up with a trainer experienced in these techniques. And let me emphasize experienced. Anyone these days can go online and obtain a piece of paper that states they are "certified". I discovered you can go online and become a minister in a short period of time. You have to do your research; as a physician and gym owner our trainers are rigorously screened. They don't just possess a piece of paper. Would you entrust your spiritual needs to an online minister?





SHORE UP WITH THE GAME COACH

CARSON LOVETT, MA. SPORT PSYCHOLOGY

The milder than normal winter has enabled many of us to remain active on the courses for much of what would usually be considered the off-season on The Shore. Nonetheless, a new season dawns; and the time has arrived to review and formulate new practice and performance goals, and develop the plan that will direct our focus toward a successful and enjoyable 2012 golf year.

A great place to begin the goal setting process for both the beginner and the expert is the proper assessment of the athlete's level of development. Increasing the understanding of the current state of the golfer's game can provide a framework for establishing realistic and attainable expectations. Researchers recommend making practice and outcome-related goals specific and measurable in order to: enhance motivation, solidify commitment, channel focus and track progress. It has also been suggested that having a detailed game-management strategy that centers energy and attention on only the tasks required to accomplish goals can facilitate the overall achievement process.

Winning the 2012 "Tour on the Shore" is an example of a terrific and challenging year-end or long-term performance goal for a seasoned golfer. It is very specific and easily measured. Similarly, athletes new to the game of golf may aspire to simply learn to enjoy playing for its health and social benefits. A key in reaching each objective is the ability to structure, implement and achieve daily and weekly process goals that encourage success. Through the practice of task accomplishment, confidence is built and skills become conditioned responses; and with good fortune, lead to lower scores and higher satisfaction.

New Car Smell

"So, what would you like to get out of today's lesson?"

"Well, I should be hitting it farther, but I think the slice is hurting me. So I'd like to hit it straighter. But I really don't want you to change anything"

"Ok, I'll just sprinkle some of this pixie dust on you and you'll be breaking 80 in no time!"

It's a common fear amongst golfers that if they take a lesson, the pro will make changes to their swing that will feel "strange". This "strange" feeling then acts as a distraction to their usual mindset for the swing and results in poor shots. Obviously if you want to make a change in your results, you must make a change in your motion. The key here is to make this a positive process.

When you buy a new car it has that new car smell.

It's nice. You enjoy smelling it. Eventually though, you get used to the smell and you think it disappears. Six months later a friend gets in your car, takes a sniff and says "A new car huh? Nice!" So the smell is still there. You just can't notice it any more. The same is true in golf. You hear it often in post victory interviews. "My coach noticed I was fill-inthe-blank, so I just felt fill-in-the-blank and it clicked! Every week tour players are looking for that "new car smell" in their golf swing. The one feeling they

can use as a swing key to be sure they are on the right track.

The first thing you should do is change your description of the new feeling from words like "strange" or "weird" to simply "new" or "different". It is this "different" feeling that will help you. Then, as you train, you want to use the "new" or "different" feeling to let you know that you are on the correct path or in the right position. If it doesn't feel different, then you are still in the old move. As you continue making the new move and see better results it will be easier to accept the "different" feeling on the golf course. Eventually the "different" feeling will be the "normal" feeling. The old one will simply disappear. Then, you'll be looking for a new "different" feeling somewhere else in your game.

By the way, I keep the pixie dust for myself!

TOOLS OF THE TRADE BY STEVE MENZ

RULES ARE MEANT TO BE AMENDED



As many of you know, the USGA releases an updated Rules of Golf every 4 years and 2012 is the next scheduled release. The USGA and the R&A did make three changes in the 2012-2015 rule book. Rule 18-2b Ball moving after address has added a new exception that exonerates a player who has had their ball move after they have addressed it if it is virtually certain that they did not cause it to move and it was moved by a gust of wind. There is no penalty AND the ball is played from the new position. We will just dub this the Rory Rule due to his ball being moved by the wind in last year's Open Championship. Rule 6-3a is the Starting Time Rule. Previously if a player was late for their tee time, they would be disqualified. Now if a player starts within 5 minutes of their tee time it is only a two stroke penalty. In match play it is loss of hole. We will call this the Furyk Rule due to his cell phone battery dying at the Barclays pro-am in 2010. Finally, Rule 13-4 allows a player to smooth sand or soil in a hazard at any time, including before playing from that hazard. Providing that the intent was in caring for the course and the action does not improve your stance, swing or line of play. This rule needed changing purely to speed up play. This rule will be called the Cink Rule from the 2008 Zurich Classic where he hit it out of one bunker and it came to rest in another bunker some 200 yards away. His caddie raked the bunker before he hit the next shot and Cink was disqualified. There is one rule I was hoping they would amend this year. It involves the situation when you hit your ball down the middle of the fairway and it comes to rest in a divot. I get so frustrated when a good shot gets penalized by ending up in someone's old divot. It is called rub of the green and you must play it as it lies. I had hoped that the USGA would amend this rule but it looks like they dropped the ball (pun intended), when they did not amend this rule. I would like to see a universal rule in place to get relief from a ball coming to rest in a divot in the fairway. So for now, we will still be playing out of the old divots. Some clubs have divot filling parties, a group of members will head out to a few holes armed with sand bottles. Now add the beverage cart and offer a discounted dinner and you can turn this chore into a good time! No need to buy a new rule book this year, just remember the addendums. And please, leave the course better than the one you found.

YOU KNOW THE DRILL

alignment fixes

Having troubles with proper alignment? Here is an easy way to get you aiming properly. Stand facing your target, like your zipper is facing right at the target. Turn your right foot 90 degrees and point it at the golf ball. Now follow with your left foot. Waggle until you find the proper ball position and Ta-Da, you are square to your target. I see most people struggle with alignment. To get a proper feel where your feet should be pointed, face your target and point your right arm at the target. Now make your left arm parallel to your right arm and look where it is pointing. This should give you a better understanding of how to fix your alignment. Now you know the drill!





This month I plan to teach you just how to keep your game in great shape over the winter and start out sharp when spring finally springs. Your average player has a slight tendency to get a little lazy over the frigid months, and come spring, their game is a mess. Don't let this happen to you.

During the holidays, it is impossible to get anything done between then and early January. Shopping, parties, lousy weather, family visits, hanging decorations, emergency room visits (cause some relative missed a step), or the fact that everyone within a block of your house has the stomach bug. Complete Chaos. During those crazy days, all you can do is pray for Santa to bring you an early spring and every game improvement club on the market!

Now after the Holidays is another story. It's a great opportunity to get a jump on that obnoxious 12 handicapper in your group that you'll do anything to beat. This is what we'll do...

Let's create a game plan for the upcoming year. In other words…let's plan! Think about what your scores are. What do you want them to be? (hey, be realistic…if you're shooting in the 100's, think 90's not 60's!). Take it one year at a time. Honestly, what can you MOST improve on to lower your scores? Ball striking? Accuracy? Consistency? Driving? Fairway shots? Chips and pitches? Sand shots? Putting? On-course performance? Everything? (Just a hint…most people want to drive it farther, but it's rarely a score improvement area).

If you haven't started a golf journal, do it now and write all the stuff above in it! We are making a list, and checkin' it twice, gonna find out if your golf game is naughty or nice! Seriously...write it down! Makes it more real, and you can be more honest on paper than in your head. (I know you want to drive it farther than Bubba, but really your short game smells like last year's fruit cake). What is that stuff anyway?

Create a plan of action to improve and reach your specific goals. If your ball striking stinks, you may consider getting a range membership somewhere (Deer Run perhaps), and committing to more range practice. If your short game is miserable, than find a convenient facility where you can practice a variety of short game shots. If it's that you just can't get it done on the course, create a practice routine that is more like simulated play. Whatever it is, I guarantee that specifying it, writing it down, and attacking it in a planned way will be successful! Stop being haphazard...notice you can't say haphazard without "hazard"...how many of those did you visit last season?

Get a good instructor that you communicate well with...even if you only see them once a year. My suggestion is that if you want to improve, and you don't like to take lessons, see an instructor once a year in early spring. Use the professional to help you create your perfect golf improvement plan!

If you do like to take lessons, sit down with your instructor and create your plan as a team. We want to create a season long game plan that will maximize your chances of success...or you could do like the holidays and just try to survive the mayhem! (And I don't mean Hunter!)


OUR PATH TO PAR


RICHARD ROBINSON - INSTRUCTOR: THE ORIGINAL GOLF SCHOOL

The first hole is always unique. It starts a new round and brings the anticipation of the best of possibilities or perhaps some anxiety about what is ahead. Few shots are more satisfying crushing it off the first tee right down the middle of the fairway. Nothing is more discouraging than a disastrous first shot. More than any other shot, the first one is a matter of attitude.

The result of your initial effort can set the psychological tone, for better or worse, for the entire round. The key is to learn how to use the first shot no matter what the result, to encourage success, throughout the round.

Understanding the design of the hole is critical. Most course designs give you clear clues to the preferred approach on the opening hole, saving deception and risk reward decisions for later in the round. The design of the first hole typically offers a forgiving invitation to the challenges ahead. This is especially important if you are playing a course for the first time.







A frequently used clue to design intention is the fairway bunker. While the bunker can "trap" you and cost strokes, it is useful to consider it as a sailor would a channel marker. It is simultaneously a warning of danger and a guide to safety.

The opening hole at Lighthouse Sound features a steep faced bunker on the left side of the fairway approximately 150 yards from the green. Its message is clear. Do not land here! It signals that anything left on this hole is trouble. What other clues does it offer? If your shot flight tendency is left to right, the bunker may be your best target, as your fade takes you to the fairway. If you draw the ball, consider selecting a club that insures being short or long of the bunker so you will not be "drawn" into it. If your best shot won't reach the bunker or clears it too easily, you are probably playing from the wrong tee, losing the opportunity to take on the decision making and shot making challenges of the course design.

See the bunkers like channel markers, guiding you to safe passage throughout the course. Don't fear them; use them to spot the best shot to play off the tee and into the green. The clues to design on the first hole, apply to most of the remaining holes. Once you recognize the design challenge then choose to eliminate it with club selection and shot shape. This process of decision making and choice keeps you on the path to par even if you hit a less than perfect shot. It is the essence of the game. It begins on the first hole. This season commit to making good initial decisions, play from tees that test your judgment and skill as much as your power, and build a foundation for a better golf game.






Practice... You LOVE It or You HATE It!



After the last two snow-filled winters, it was a real treat to be able to get out and play several rounds of golf and enjoy a variety of new cigars. One cigar I found to be quite enjoyable was EO brand's

601 Red Label Habano. This cigar was created by master blender Don Jose "Pepin" Garcia. The 601 is crafted in Esteli Nicaragua with Nicaraguan filler and binder tobaccos and a Nicaraguan Habano wrapper.



The wrapper is a beautiful deep leathery brown with a slight, oily shine to it. It has a very nice woodsy pre-light aroma.

Front Nine

This cigar starts out very smooth and somewhat mild for a full-bodied smoke, which I find pleasing for a golf course cigar. The flavors start to kick in soon though. The woodsy aroma continues as hickory notes begin to build by the halfway point.

Back Nine

As we head to the finish, the tobacco is really showing its earthy tones as the hickory is fully engaged with some spice and pepper starting to make an appearance. The draw is very smooth and consistent all the way through to the end.

The 601, while it has a slight kick to it, there isn't as much as most full-bodied cigars. This makes for an excellent choice for the golf course. I was enjoying it so much that I didn't consider it finished until it burned down to my fingertips!

EO Brands has recently merged with Rocky Patel Cigars. This should really help to make these excellent cigars more readily available and a bit less expensive.
