Ocean City Golf & Yacht Club was conceived by visionary businessmen back in the late 1950's. Dick Hall and Robe Holland spearheaded the effort to bring a full eighteen hole facility to the growing resort area. The two men with the help of many friends and business associates

The greens committee worked with the grounds superintendent to be certain the membership and guests always had a well conditioned golf course to play. The golf committee worked with the golf pro in order to interest the membership in club tournament play. The budget and operating, membership and building and grounds committees were active in the business of running a young golf course business.

Everyone involved has done a very good job over the last fifty years and the club has grown into a thirty-six hole facility with one of the largest clubhouses on the shore. Many local charity tournaments are held at what is now known as Ocean City Golf Club.


The stock of the club is now held by some of the same shareholders which bought into the original idea and many of the shares remains in the family of the original visionaries.

Club stock is now held under the name of South Point Golf Holdings,

Lot development was a part of the original idea and at the present time eleven of the original one hundred twelve lots are owned by the club.

Ocean City Golf Club is poised to enter the next fifty years as the best local member golf facility which allows outside play on a fee basis. Our two courses have been upgraded recently. The Newport Bay course was completely renovated just prior to the turn of the century. The Seaside course upgrade was completed in 2008 including a new irrigation system and new tees. The character of the original Seaside course still remains as it was in 1959, is challenging and fun to play. Our member-quest has grown into what our peer of golf professionals agree is the best on the shore.

The same vision remains with the board of directors and committeemen today which existed back in 1959. Maintain a great member golf facility and attract non-members to play our golf courses on their visits to this great resort area. ■BY RICHARD HOLLAND, SR.

He sees the Countywith openjuniors, and college students, and locals, and visitors from afar, all golfing, all interacting, all enjoying owned municipal course like it was meant to be enjoyed when it was originally built two decades ago space money.

And over the last three years that Brittingham has been the Head Professional at the only golf course in Somerset County, Maryland, he has been doggedly pursuing his vision - and it shows. With the help of an enthusiastic Superintendent, the course is in great condition, finances are improving every year, and a new friendship with the UMES PGM program means new faces circulating through the course.

"My feeling is that in terms of money, anything that affects the condition of the golf course has to have the highest priority," Brittingham explained. "People come here to play golf, period. Dollar for dollar, Great Hope is the best value on the Delmarva Peninsula, hands down."

Indeed, Great Hope boasts a 7000-yard par-72 layout from the tips, and a great design by Dr. Michael Hurdzan, who also designed Eagle's Landing. The course has five sets of tees for players of all abilities.

Brittingham, 44, grew up in Pocomoke and was a high-school standout, going on the play (and win) at the college level for Division 1A Temple University, where his team played in the 1A Finals (like the Final Four in basketball) four straight years.


He returned home after college and worked at Nassawango and Eagle's Landing before accepting the Head Professional's job at Great Hope three years ago.

"I really want to see more juniors taking up the game. We have a great practice facility here and I'm going to be holding junior clinics throughout the summer. You know, we're a busy society. You can't just throw juniors on the golf course. People will get upset with you. So I'd like to teach kids how to play, and to respect the rules and etiquette, and to make sure they feel comfortable."

Brittingham charges \$40 for a lesson. Great Hope is located at 8380 Crisfield Highway in Westover, MD. Fees are \$42 with cart on weekends, \$28 twilight after 2pm. Walking fees are \$28/\$15.






MISGA HONORS ED NEFF


EASTERN SHORE, MD CHAPTER

One of 20 in the nation and the first historically black university . . .

TAKE THE HIGH SCHOOL GOLF ETIQUETTE CHALLENGE

Golf etiquette is one of the most important and highly stressed facets of high school golf. In fact, a player's level of etiquette speaks volumes about him or her not only as a golfer, but also as a person. The high school coaches in the Bayside Conference value sportsmanship and etiquette as the foundation of a successful program. After all, it is our job to help mold the young men and women into competitive players, but more importantly, into respectable gentlemen and ladies. Most experienced golfers know the differences between good and bad etiquette, but sometimes don't always go the extra yard. Take the test yourself and see if your etiquette is up to par.



PICKING UP TRASH LEFT ON THE COURSE.



Every golfer should respect the natural beauty of the golf course. The grounds crew works very hard to make the playing conditions ideal for an enjoyable round of golf. At the high school level, we are especially grateful for being the guests at many wonderful championship courses throughout the peninsula. Our players are encouraged to go the extra yard to pick up trash on the course, which not only makes them feel good about themselves, but it can also subconsciously affect their playing

partners in a positive manner. High school coaches stress to their players to be the better golfer and set an example for others to follow.

FIX MORE THAN JUST YOUR BALL MARK ON THE GREEN. High school golfers should carry a ball mark tool



or tee in their pocket to repair their own ball mark. We also train our players to fix two or three other ball marks in addition to their own. We certainly don't want them to slow up play by repairing the entire green; however, when playing partners see the effort made, it tends to bring out the best in them too. If everyone in the foursome was

accustomed to fixing more than one ball mark imagine the impact the group could make on the conditions of the greens. Now imagine if all the golfers on the course exhibited that same level of etiquette how gorgeous the greens would be.


RAKING BUNKERS THE CORRECT WAY. Golfers



should always enter the bunker at the lowest point closest to their ball. They should never climb down from the high side because it could cave in and that type of bunker damage is very hard to repair. After hitting a shot a player should rake sand towards themselves as they step backwards towards the same point of entry. Golfers should only rake enough sand to smooth out the impressions they made. We teach high school players to lay the rake down

We teach high school players to lay the rake down outside the bunker with the handle positioned parallel to the fairway.

DO NOT MOVE AHEAD OF YOUR GROUP. Pace of play is an important issue at the high school level because we play



keeps the groups moving on time.

UPON HOLING OUT ANNOUNCE YOUR

SCORE. Announcing a score to playing partners retains the integrity of the player. An honest golfer has nothing to hide. Golfers who whisper under their breath or don't announce their score at all are usually subject to suspicion. Our high school players are conditioned to announce their score immediately after holing out. This also forces them to know exactly what they lay at all times.

BE CONSIDERATE WITH CELL PHONES. At the high school level we don't allow cell phones to be used at all. If



a player is caught using their phone during play they are disqualified. Most of us have that certain friend who talks excessively on the phone throughout the entire round. It's an annoyance but we just shrug our shoulders and chalk it up to the same old pathetic excuse, "It's the 21st Century—what am I supposed to do?" Try not to be

'that guy' who is a distraction to everyone, or you may find yourself getting less invites.

REPLACE FAIRWAY DIVOTS OR FILL WITH

SAND. High school players walk at all matches and practices. Therefore, they are instructed to replace all divots whenever possible since sand is not available to them.

LAYTHEFLAGSTICK DOWN OFF THE GREEN.



Too often golfers pull the flagstick out of the hole and allow it to slam onto the green leaving behind ruts and impressions that may interfere with the next groups putting line. Placing the flagstick off the green or gently laying it down shows excellent etiquette and

respect f or others.

CLEAN THE TRASH OUT OF YOUR GOLF CART. High school players are not



CART. High school players are not permitted to ride, so this tip on etiquette directly applies to everyone else who does. Even if a golfer is tipping a cart attendant, it's just plain discourteous to leave behind a golf cart full of trash. As always, your actions will become contagious to your playing partners. In just a few seconds a courteous golfer can try to leave the cart as clean as possible. If we all take the time to go the extra yard, the golfing experience

will become more enjoyable with every round.





PGA GOLF MANAGEMENT PROGRAM AT UMES WINDS UP HISTORIC INAUGURAL YEAR



Its made from soft 1025 forged carbon steel and designed with a special heel grind for a variety of shots. Cleveland golf features "zip grooves" in its CG14 model. Zip grooves have one of the highest volumes and sharpest edges of any groove on the market. Titlest Vokey wedges continue with an expanded line of their spin milled models. With deep, precision cuts that produce a tighter groove-edge radius, these wedges perform from every lie especially the rough. They are available in three finishes and various bounce and loft angles. Callaway received feedback from its tour players to develop a more

versatile wedge. The X Forged wedge features a tight angle on the leading edge and "mack daddy" grooves for high spin. The Bobby Jones Pelz Wedge features a wear resistant face insert for high spin and durability. Still undecided, swing into Ruddo's Golf in West OC or Rehoboth to pick the right wedge for your game.







In the last article we examined Pilates as it relates to improvement of your golf game. This time I want to discuss sports specific training. Simply put, this just means certain sports use muscles that are unique to the motions and power required for that sport. While good general conditioning is necessary for any sport, there really is no "one size fits all" for individual sports training. As an example, last year a major university set up a program to try to see if they could condition a diverse group to run the Boston Marathon. One of the participants was a pro football linebacker, who said, "My muscle skills are centered around the ability to run 10 or 20 yards as fast as I can until I get to the ball carrier and knock him down". Obviously a different type of training and muscle conditioning was required to run/walk 26 plus miles. It took the better part of a year in his off time, but he eventually did it.

Now let's look at golf, and more specifically the golf swing. As you all know, the secret of distance in hitting the golf ball is club head speed. This is generated by the proper training and utilization of about 22 separate muscles. The components of the golf swing are the back swing, the downswing and the follow through. The back swing is where the muscles are stretched and coiled; when they uncoil in the downswing, club head speed and power are produced. I will briefly go through the muscle groups involved in the downswing, the most important of these motions; a good trainer should know these muscles and how to properly strengthen them.

The first group to be called into action is the lateral rotators of the hips. The best known of these are the gluteal muscles; there are several others. Next the spine must begin lateral rotation, using the spinal rotators and the abdominal obliques. Next, the arm muscles come into play; the pectoralis major and the latissimus dorsi are well known, as is the main extensor of the forearm, the triceps. Along with these muscles, activation of the wrist muscles, the flexors and extensors, occurs. In a general way, these muscle groups are responsible for club head speed.

Now, what is the best way to increase their contractility and strength? Here opinions vary. Some advocate training with basic resistance training, using standard weights or machines isotonically to improve the power of these muscles through a full range of motion. Others feel that incorporating isometric exercises is important. To clarify these terms, in isotonic exercise the muscles contract to move the involved body part through a full range of motion, such as doing a pushup from the floor until the arms are fully extended. If you stopped the pushup halfway through and held that position without moving for several seconds, you would be stimulating the muscles isometrically. Probably the overall best idea is to use both methods in a golf training program. Again, proper advice from a certified trainer who has experience in these techniques is paramount.

Persons with disabilities or impairments such as arthritis or other limiting problems will need specialized handling, but most of these can be worked around. As always, check the credentials and training of someone who purports to know the best way to accomplish these goals.

GOLF AND THE ENVIRONMENT EAGLE'S LANDING GOLF COURSE

A lot has been said about the relationship of golf courses, their ecosystem services such as storm water retention, runoff tiltration, management and the environment, almost to the point of sensory overload. Oftentimes it can be hard to distinguish what might just be marketing hyperbole and what are in fact the true impacts of golf course management to the environment. Who are we to believe? Do we, as golfers really care? How does this affect my golf game? These are good questions. As a golf course superintendent with over 25 years of experience in all facets of the industry, I would like to ask you, for the good of the game, to think about those questions some time soon. Try to become more aware and educated about your surroundings while on the course. I think in time, you will develop a new appreciation of the golf course and it's stewardship by those who manage it.

Audubon International, a leading advocate of environmental stewardship for the golf course industry states, "when properly sited, designed, constructed, and managed, golf courses can be an environmental asset to a community. By their very nature, golf courses can provide significant open space and opportunities to provide needed wildlife habitat in increasingly urbanized communities across North America. With nearly 80% of all of the 15,000-plus golf courses in the United States located in urban or suburban areas, opportunities abound for golf courses to provide







urban wildlife habitat, wildlife corridors, heat island effect reduction, etc." They went on to include "like most other businesses, golf courses must also work to address the environmental challenges of water use, water quality, habitat and biodiversity loss, chemical use, waste, energy use, etc" It is hard to argue particularly in the urban setting, golf courses, as a land use, are better than most if not all other uses.

Here at Eagles Landing Golf Course in West Ocean City, Maryland a Certified Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary, we have a very diverse ecosystem. I truly believe the golf course has improved the land particularly in the areas of plant and animal habitat, stormwater management, biodiversity and economic impact to the area over the previous uses of poultry production and farming. Eagle's Landing has been recognized several times for its environmental stewardship by the Golf Course Superintendent's Association of America (GCSAA), Audubon International, USGA and other industry leaders. We have even partnered with county and state agencies to create guidelines for the development of environmentally sound golf course construction and maintenance As golf course management professionals, practices. superintendents seek out resources in the industry to help us in this effort. Audubon International "works with golf courses to help them provide habitat for a variety of wildlife species and preserve our rich natural heritage by protecting existing habitats and landscaping primarily with native plants. Collaborative projects between members and local resource agencies or wildlife organizations are encouraged. The result is tens of thousands of acres of natural habitats and hundreds of species of birds, mammals, fish, amphibians, reptiles, and other wildlife conserved on golf courses across North America and, increasingly, around

GOING SUPERINTENDENT'S CORNER CHRIS ADKINS



SOMETIMES YOU JUST HAVE TO TAKE A DEEP BREATH AND JUMP

In 1999, that's exactly what Chris Adkins and his now-famous friend and partner, 2004 Senior British Open champion Pete Oakley, decided to do when they bought a piece of land in Milton, Delaware and designed their first golf course, The Rookery.

"I started out in farming," explained Adkins. "But I met Pete when I took a job at Shawnee Country Club in Milford, where Pete was the pro. We became friends and promised each other that if either of us ever got into something big, we'd involve the other. I had left Shawnee and opened my own fertilizer business when I got this piece of land, but I called him up and said, 'Pete, it's time.' He didn't hesitate."

The course took just 11 months to build (honest) and now ten years later it sees 34,000 rounds a year from a combination of a strong local base and throngs of summer beach-goers.

Oakley, though touring on the European Senior Tour, is still a part-owner of the course, and Adkins is also the General Manager and Course Superintendent, the only superintendent the course has ever had.

Adkins describes The Rookery as a classic risk/ reward layout, but also very open to promote a quick 3 ½ hour pace of play, with large greens and plenty of water. Fairways, tees and greens are bentgrass, while the rough is blue fescue



Adkins said that Oakley's surprise win at the 2004 Senior British Open was incredible to watch, and also, "very, very good for business. You can't imagine the publicity we've gotten from that win."

Off the course Adkins said he enjoys spending time with his wife, Glenda, two children, Jason, 24, and Jaclyn, 22, and saltwater fishing. Adkins also own a restaurant in Rehoboth Beach called Blue, which serves "contempory seafood." The Rookery is located in Milton, DE. 9 Miles north of Rehoboth Beach. GOLF TRADITION Runs Deep at UMES

Dr. Harry Hoffer, Director of the PhD Program in Organizational Leadership at the University of Maryland Eastern Shore has lived two separate lives entangled with education and golf. This past PGA Tour Player now educates and directs PhD hopefuls. His love of golf runs deep and has been reignited by the addition of the PGA Golf Management Program at UMES. The PGA Golf Management staff relies on Harry's experience and sees him as a mentor when mixing education and golf.

Harry's grandparents came to America as immigrants of Austria and Germany. To make money and put food on the table, Harry's father, George and his brothers caddied at Cedar Rocks GC in Wheeling, WV in the late 1920's. This was the start of golf in the Hoffer household. George Hoffer cleaned clubs and worked his way up the golf business ladder and eventually became an Assistant Professional. George became an Amateur Champion in West Virginia and after turning professional won a combined 11 West Virginia PGA and Open Titles. In 1950, when Harry was eight years old, George became the Head Professional at Spring Valley in Huntington, WV. During this time George became friends with another West Virginia native, Sam Snead. George competed in the 1953 US Open at Oakmont, became the Head Professional at Sleepy Hollow in Hurricane, WV and also became the first golf coach at Marshall.

With that kind of pedigree, it is obvious to see how young Harry eventually became a tour player. As a junior, Harry won numerous amateur titles in the Tri-State Area consisting of Ohio, Kentucky, and West Virginia. In 1960, Harry captured the individual and team state High School championships. He was offered 38 major college scholarships, including every school in the Big Ten Conference. His heart was with Notre Dame, who did offer, but Harry decided to play golf for Marshall University. In 1962, Marshall won the Mid-American Conference as a team and finished tenth in the nation at the NCAA

Championships at Duke University. Harry was the only MAC member to qualify for individual play. The NCAA Championship in those days consisted of two team rounds with the low 32 players qualifying for the individual match play format. Harry made it to the third round of match play. In 1963, he qualified for the US Amateur and again made it to the third round of match play.

The Open that year was played at Baltusrol in New Jersey. Harry flew in the weekend before the Open and played a few solid practice rounds. On the Monday before the Open, Harry decided to fly back to school and take his final exams for his Masters Degree. He flew back to Baltusrol on Wednesday night ready to go for the first round on Thursday. Harry admits this is one of the biggest mistakes he made in golf. To his credit, he figured that this Open would be the first of many. Admittedly Harry was in culture shock. When he arrived at the course on Thursday, he sees Palmer, Player, and Nicklaus. Harry said, "I stood there behind the ropes watching these guys practice putting, forgetting that I was aloud. I said to myself, Yea, I qualified for this." He went on to shoot 80, 81 and missed the cut.

Harry played full time on the PGA Tour from 1968-1971. He was married with three kids at the time. "It was difficult just to survive. It was different back then; I had to pay my own insurance, money was scarce, and I had a six month old child that had lived in 15 different states." Harry decided that his golf career had to be secondary.

Harry made decisions that would change his life. He enrolled in the PhD Program at Antioch University in Ohio. After graduating, Harry entrenched himself into Secondary Education and over a 15 year span was the Superintendent of Schools in Ohio, West Virginia, and Delaware. Harry then came to UMES in 2002 with the challenge of building the Organizational Leadership PhD Program. Seven years later the program is going strong.

Harry still has golf in his blood. He makes occasional appearances at Pro-Ams and Celebrity Golf Tournaments. He also coaches a local High School golf team. Although Harry is kept very busy with his PhD students, he always makes time to talk golf, pass on his experiences, and help the people of UMES. Harry Hoffer is undoubtedly a rare find.

The Back Swing

■BY BOB BECKELMAN



If you've tuned in each issue, then you've got your setup all good to go. You're standing there with a proper grip and athletic posture. Now all you have to do is move. With good pre-swing fundamentals, this will be e-z.

Our first move is called the "back swing". And that is exactly what we're going to do. Swing the club head "back"! Not IN! Not OUT! & Not UP! Just BACK! Get the club head moving back as if you were trying to hand the club to someone standing a ways behind you...reach back. Your body should stay fairly centered over the golf ball during this part, though a little backward movement of the body is O.K. Less is better. Also, keep your eyes on the ball (both eyes). This will keep you from moving your head excessively.

As you swing the club head back, keep your forward arm (left for righties and right for lefties) as straight as possible and allow your forward shoulder to begin to turn under your chin. This is why we set up tall with our chin high...your chin must be up off your chest in order to allow your shoulder to turn underneath it. Give the back swing a little momentum and it will carry the club back...then up and over your back shoulder. Your forward arm should stay straightish while your back arm folds under the club to support it. When to stop the back swing? What a question!!! When you run out

to stop the back swing? What a question!!! When you run out of flexibility, your head will begin to move, your forward arm will begin to bend, and you will begin to loose your posture. Just before all this starts to happen is the perfect time to stop. For most people, short and simple is best. Too much movement on the back swing creates complications that have to be overcome in order to hit the golf ball with any consistency. Short, simple, and powerful. Power does not come from a long, sloppy back swing...it comes from a solid efficient setting of the back swing.

At the top of the back swing, your shoulders should have turned ~80 to 90 degrees around your head, your forward arm should be straightish and your back arm bent ~90 degrees with the elbow pointing down at the ground, your feet should still be solid on the ground with most of your weight on your back foot, your knees should be apart, and your head should be just about where it started. The club is now SET directly over your back shoulder in a great position to one day attack the golf ball (tune in next time). Hopefully you don't have to think about all this, most of it happens naturally...if you allow the club to swing BACKWARD!

There is a long-standing joke among pro football players that kickers make the best golfers – implying, of course, that they practice more on the driving range than on the gridiron.

Ocean Pines Golf Course Assistant Professional, Brock Boland, 25, explains it a little bit differently.

"Actually, the mechanics are the same in the two motions," explained the ex-pro kicker. "You make power with the same muscles, and in kicking, just like in golf, you have to keep your leg on-plane."

Boland, 25, said he first picked up a golf club at the age of 9, but added that he didn't really begin playing seriously until about four years ago. That's because all his time was spent honing his kicking skills, first for Salisbury University, then for the Canadian Football League's Saskatchewan Rough Riders and the San Jose Saber Cats.

Then he tore a quad.

"So that was pretty much it for kicking," he said. Luckily, what takes most people a lifetime took Boland almost

no time at all, and he became a professional golfer a year later, after passing the PGA's Player Ability Test by shooting 75-76 at Maple Dale in Dover, Delaware. In fact he said the highlight

of his golfing career was making a birdie on the par-5 18th hole at Maple Dale to pass the PAT on the number.

"I did it when I had to," he said. "That was a great feeling."

An even greater feeling, he said, than his double-eagle on a 540-yard par-5 in Myrtle Beach. "I can't even remember the name of the course! We walked up and found the ball in the hole."

Boland is engaged to be married to his fiancee, Emily Ewald, a teacher at Crisfield High School.

Tools of the Trade

This article is intended to educate the reader on the clubs that local professionals are using. Other golf magazines show you what Professional golfers are playing. Many of their clubs are not available to the playing public. The rest of the clubs are tweeked daily in tour vans. I want you to know what great local players are using that is also available to you. It will also show the importance of having your clubs fit to your abilities and how it will heighten your game.

"LET'S DO LAUNCH!"

Circa 1984, after a few years working and playing at my local club north of rural Pittsburgh, the game had taken a significant hold on me. I still fondly remember the feeling of hitting my 43 and a 1/4", 150cc persimmon Titleist driver "on the screws" literally. The clubface had screws holding the insert into the face. The sound and feel was unbelievable.

I had a friend that just bought a metal headed driver. The size and shape was similar to the wooden driver. I was curious and couldn't wait to hit it. It sounded like I was sitting in the bleachers at a little league baseball game. It looked ridiculous. I was sure it was a fad. But then, after a longer than usual walk down the fairway I knew days of a wooden driver were quickly behind me. Twenty-five years later, I am resigned to the fact that I would hit a toaster tied to a stick if you told me the ball would come off hotter. Inflation and technology have hit the metal driver hard. Drivers have been the most sought after market ever since. They have pushed the limits in all the categories. Maximum size is 460cc's, that is more than 3 times the size I learned how to hit. Co-efficient of Resistance, (COR -.083) face thickness. This stat was the springboard to the huge leap in distance. One big name company even had many drivers recalled in the 2000-2001 seasons because the too thin face was non-conforming. Now (MOI) moment of inertia is the next big thing to stop the face from twisting during impact. Supposedly letting you hit the ball straighter than ever. Now that these limits have been set, manufacturers are now lengthening the driver slowly. Today new drivers are likely to be closer to 46" then the 45" players have been used to for the last 20 years. More important is the launch and spin created by the impact of the driver. Finding a local PGA Professional with a launch monitor is your key to hitting your best drives. Each persons preferred launch angle and spin is slightly different. Launch angles are controlled by a couple of factors. One factor is the actual loft of the club and the second is the kick point on the shaft. The spin is controlled by the amount of firmness or torque of your shaft. Please see your local Professionals and have them find the best driver suited for your game.





WHEN ASKED TO SAY WHEN HE FIRST STARTED PLAYING GOLF, 71-YEAR OLD STUART SCOTT LAUGHED.

"OH BOY. 100 YEARS AGO?"

The reason it probably feels so long is because Scott, who works as a club fitter and club maker at Deer Run Golf Course in Berlin, has packed about three lifetimes into his years, including 35 years as a principal in the Worcester County school system, 40 years service in the Army National Guard, 50 years of marriage to his lovely wife, Ruth, and four years now with a private pilot's license.

"I actually started golfing in 1969 at Fort Mead," he said. "We were at summer camp and on the weekends some of the men in my unit would play golf. I bought a starter set at the PX. A lot of the guys were in college, and very good golfers, so I learned pretty quickly."

Scott himself has a Bachelors in Education from Salisbury State University (now Salisbury University) and a Masters in Education from Nova Southeastern University in Fort Lauderdale, Fla.


In January of 2000, Scott attended a weeklong instructor's class at the Professional Golfing Teachers Association (PGTA) and became a certified instructor. He now does custom fitting and club making, as well as lessons, out of his shop at Deer Run

"The most important thing I learned about golf instruction is that everybody is different. We'd all like to be Tiger, and that's great to aspire to, but we are individuals with individual swings. As a teacher you have to be able to adjust your lessons to players' swings, and help them get to their potential. And it's important to remember that golf is fun."

While Scott said he works closely with several brand name club manufacturers, he said his fitting process will allow golfers to select the right clubs no matter what brand they choose. "I don't charge for the fitting," he said. "I figure if a person has a good experience with the fitting, maybe they'll buy their clubs from me."

SHORE UP! WITH THE GAME COACH

CARSON LOVETT, MA, SPORT PSYCHOLOGY

In sports and competition there exists an optimal state of performance typically referred to as "The Zone". During this period of psycho-physiological efficiency athletes perform at or near the peak of their potential. This ideal and complex frame of mind has been researched from numerous perspectives yielding inconclusive results. The many athletes of various abilities that have experienced the phenomenon have reported most of what we know about being in "The Zone". These similar characteristics were noted: No fear, no analysis, narrowed focus, effortlessness, personal control and a slowing of time.

We have been able to recognize when we are in "The Zone" but trying to get there on demand has been virtually impossible, and likely unwise. Of all the athletes interviewed, none reported being able to enter "The Zone" – they just found themselves there. And many stated that upon revelation, they were unexpectedly and quickly out of "The Zone". It is relative to driving your car and slipping into a daydream of golfing in Bermuda. Your subconscious is able to steer you safely until your conscious realizes what is happening and then you jerk the wheel. In the athletic zone, we perform with greater efficiency when guided by our subconscious. Thinking causes tangible processes in the brain that alter neuromuscular activation and motor performance.

Getting into "The Zone" results from preparation and trust. Attending to and processing only the cognitive activities and cues that pertain to the skill about to be executed precipitates the type of fluidity reflected within "The Zone". When you find yourself there, recognize and enjoy it. When you leave, remember!

Then prepare to get back and trust that you will.


