

The creation of world renowned architects Pete and P.B. Dye, Rum Pointe Seaside Golf Links is one of the most beautiful courses you will play. Nestled against the Sinepuxent Bay, seventeen holes of this world class, public layout offer stunning views of the water, wildlife, and Assateague National Seashore Park. The mini-Rum kegs that serve as tee markers remind one that three hundred years ago Blackbeard and Captain Kidd used this area for smuggling. You probably won't find any pirate loot, but what a treasure Ruark Golf has left us.

The friendly and professional staff keeps Rum Pointe in top condition, the bent grass from tee to green is in perfect autumn shape. The undulating greens and green-side areas offer excellent lies but challenging shots. The higher handicapper will benefit from generous landing areas in the fairway,

while his single-digit partner will be enticed to gamble like a Buccaneer over the numerous freshwafer lakes. Club selection should not be a problem for the visitor; Rum Pointe provides an excellent yardage book in addition to outfitting its carts with the latest GPS system. A nicely stocked pro shop, driving range, three-hole putting course, and restaurant round out the top-of-the-line amenities. The distance from the Black kegs, 7001 yards,



makes the course capable of hosting a PGA tour event (and they wouldn't be disappointed), but the distance from the middle tees, 6523 from the Blues, 6004 from the Whites, and 5276 from the Reds, makes it very playable for golfers of all levels.

The eighth and sixteenth fairways, which stretch directly along the bay, also offer prime views of Captain Charles Radcliffe's house, built in 1740 and one of the oldest structures in Worcester County. Legend has it that during the Revolutionary War, British troops came ashore to conscript locals for the king's service. When Radcliffe's son refused to join, he was hanged from a nearby tree. There are indications that he still haunts the property. Whether or not you believe in ghosts, your golf spirit will be lifted by a day at Rum Pointe's Scottish-style links.

# TWO-TIME STATE CHAMP BREAKS COURSE RECORD AT EAGLE'S LANDING





# GO NAVY!

#### OCEAN PINES BOB REIFSNYDER



OCEAN PINES – After the 1956 Army-Navy football game, a hard fought 7-7 tie, Sports Illustrated writer Don Parker wrote of sophomore guard, Bob Reifsnyder, "the young giant took charge of the Navy team and, through his own single-minded determination, aroused it into such momentum against the precise, confident Army that soon the confidence and precision were gone. He tackled viciously, almost as though he were conducting a personal crusade against the Black Knights."

50 years later Reifsnyder, now 71 and a retired school teacher and football coach from Long Island, New York, enjoys golf and the retired life in Ocean Pines.



"Golf is a great retiree's game," explained the affable Reifsnyder. "It keeps me outside, and it takes a large part of the day. My favorite golf memories are of all the enjoyment and friends I've made through the game."

Currently an 11-handicap (he's been as low as a 9), Reifsnyder said he considers The Ocean Pines Golf and Country Club, designed by the famous Robert Trent Jones, to be one of the top-three courses on the Delmarva Peninsula.

"It's such a beautiful course," he said. "It's fair, but it's challenging. You can't stray too far, especially on your approach shots. I tell my friends you can't miss anywhere but short. Take the ninth hole for example. You miss left you're in water, miss long or right and you're in bunkers or out of bounds. There are no bailouts except short. But it's great. I love the course."

Reifsnyder says he enjoys playing in tournaments since, "the competition is still there, but I'm not getting beat up like I used to in football." That may be, but do an Internet search and you'll find that it was actually Reifsnyder's opponents receiving most of the punishment. In fact, Reifsnyder became such a force in college football that in 1957 "Reef" was a unanimous All-American selection, and also won the

Maxwell Trophy as the season's outstanding player. That same year his beloved Navy team defeated Mississippi in the Cotton Bowl.

Reifsnyder's break-out game came against bitter rival Notre Dame, who they actually beat twice during the career of Notre Dame great and Heisman Trophy winner, Paul Hornung. To this day Reifsnyder's squads are the only Navy teams to beat Notre Dame twice.

"Ah yes," said Reifsnyder laughing. "That was a big thrill."

Unfortunately, Reifsnyder ruptured his achilles tendon at the beginning of his senior year, which ended his college career and resulted in his being decomissioned from the Navy. At the advice of some NFL doctors who thought they could fix him, he played three seasons in the NFL, bouncing around between the Los Angeles Rams, New York Giants, Los Angeles Chargers and New York Jets, but as he said, "I rode the pine. It was a disaster. The injury never really healed and I had lost the thing I was known for, my speed and mobility. Once that was gone I was never the same player. It was crippling, and more than anything, I'll always be a little disappointed because I never found out if I could make it at that level."

Reifsnyder is still a season-ticket holder for Navy football games, and just returned from the 50th reunion of the Cotton Bowl team.

"Man, that was a blast," he said. "We had a great time. I got to see old friends. We played some golf. It was really nice."

Just remember, if you see "Reef" out on a course somewhere, be sure to shout out, "Go Navy!"

Goslee finished with a 2-day total of 6 under par (68-70), 2 shots ahead of Winters (71-69), and 3 shots clear of Baltimore's Suburban Club PGA teaching Professional Mark Evenson (70-71). Host PGA Professionals Jack Skilling (73-71) and Mike Callender (80-69) finished in 4th and 5th place respectively. Green Hill member Chris Mason won low amateur gross honors firing a very strong 71 the second day to finish at 149.

The Salisbury Open was one the most popular tournaments in Maryland during the 1970's and 80's but ceased to be played when sponsors dropped out in

the late 80's. When Mr. Skilling came to Green Hill in 2005 he had the vision of bringing the event back to life since he had played in it in 1975 and '76 as junior golfer. Though it took 3 years to make it happen, the Salisbury Open is once again available for Professionals and amateurs to compete in a 2-day individual stroke play championship.

The first day, Sunday October 5th, was actually two events in one: a 4-man pro-am with 1 PGA Professional and 3 amateurs, as well as the individuals' scores counting as the first day of the 2-day Championship. The second day, Monday October 6th, saw 10 Pros and 11 amateurs tee off for the second round of the Championship. weather was fantastic and the golf was quite good with 5 professionals and 1 amateur besting par for the day.

#### SHOREUP!

#### WITH THE GAME COACH

Carson Lovett, MA - Sport Psychology

Many of the world's greatest athletes have stated that a most powerful technique for improving sport performance is Mental Imagery. Tennis legend Chris Evert visualized anticipated responses to certain points of a match based on her opponents' style of play. Olympian Dwight Stones imagined performing every high jump successfully before beginning his approach to the bar.

The great Jack Nichlaus breaks down a good golf shot into three parts: 10% swing, 40% set up and stance, and 50% the mental image of how to execute the swing. He goes "to the movies" in his head and believes that this practice is key to concentration and a positive approach.

Scientists seeking to support such anecdotes ask how can simply visualizing the performance of a sporting task help improve the athlete's performance of the task. In a landmark study, researchers monitoring the electrical activity in the leg muscles of downhill skiers found that when the athletes imagined the roughest part of the course, the highest levels of activity were recorded. This heightened level coincided with when it would be necessary for increased leg muscle activity.

It is believed that mental imagery may induce a pattern of specific autonomic responses similar to physically practicing the task. The muscles become innervated as if performing a skill, and the construction of a repeatable game plan takes place within the pathways of our nervous system.

We want a naturally fluid golf swing; so we drive buckets of balls off the tee attempting to automate the performance and achieve consistency and accuracy. This practice physiologically strengthens the body and subsequently, the neural pathways that control the muscles used to perform the swing. When we merely imagine executing the swing perfectly, it has been proven that we are actually programming our muscles and preparing our bodies for optimum performance. A regiment that successfully combines both, and yields superior results.

Ellen Davies, a member of Ocean Pines Ladies Golf Association, won the Women's Delmarva Golf Association title at Ocean Pines on Tuesday, September 9th, 2008. # FROMT on putting!

How to make more putts? What a question. Technique, putting aids, bubble levels, string lines, laser sights and more. How did something so simple get so complicated? Putting is the epitome of simplicity. Keep very still...everyone can do that, swing arms back, swing arms thru. Can it get any easier? Well, yes. The problem is, once the hole is there, tantalizing you from 20 or 30 feet, suddenly this simple movement is not so easy. You have to get it just right. But what do you have to get just right? The swing? The tempo? What??? Again, simple. To make any putt, all you need to get just right is the direction, and the distance.

Let's start with direction. If you can't get the direction right

on

straight putt, you can forget breaking putts, so let's get the ball rolling straight. Find a putt on your local putting green that rolls perfect straight from about 6 to 8 feet. It this putt over and over again unyou almost never miss it. Yes you have to practice. Using two boars or yard sticks to create a visu path to the hole helps a great deal. Once you can confidently man a straight putt over and over, you have defeated direction and comove on to distance.

Distance control is all about FEE But what is feel and how does of obtain it? FEEEL is the instinction ability to make something roll or a certain distance by semi-automa control of the length of swing. On obtains this by PRACTICE. Yes again the dreaded practice. Since short putts are easier to judge, let's start

feet from the hole. Make a couple of practice strokes to get the FEEL for a 3 foot putt, then hit 3 or 4 putts from that spot. Move 6 feet farther from the hole and repeat. Practice swings, 3 or 4 putts from the spot. Move back again and again until you are 40 to 50 feet away. Now move 6 feet closer each time until you are back to start. You will probably find that your distance control gets worse the longer the putt. This is normal, though it is also improvable.

Practice direction and distance control with these methods, and I guarantee that you will make more putts. If you feel that your technique is so poor that you cannot learn distance and direction control, take a putting lesson from a PGA Professional to correct any problems.



BRIDGEVILLE – Lucky the man who wakes up in the morning looking forward to work.

Heritage Shores Club golf course superintendent, Dave Clem, says he considers his job more pastime than work, and says he still loves getting on the course bright and early in the morning.

"I have a very good crew, thank goodness," said Clem, 39, of Lewes, while standing on the veranda overlooking the course's unique rectangular 18th green. "It's not a job to me, it's more of a hobby. "It was an amazing thing to watch and be a part of," explained Clem of the multiyear process to prepare the course for a major championship. "I came in at the tail end of the green reconstruction process, so I got to learn from the very best."

He used those lessons well, as he was hired



by Heritage Shores Club in 2005 before construction on the course had even begun. know pretty much where everything is underground. When I see a contractor digging a hole along the road I think, uhoh, there's a 10inch mainline right there."


Clem's pedigree shows in the greens and fairways. 





If you can't find humor in golf, you have none. No other game is quite so easy to laugh at, no clothes so easy to poke fun at, no movement made so unnatural and silly by those attempting to master it, and no announcers so over dramatizing what can be viewed (by the uninitiated) as boring and mostly not violent or dangerous in the least. I hope to bring you humor if you lack it, laughter if you get it, and instruction if you need it. Pay attention to the pictures, because if a picture is worth a thousand words, then words are worth diddly. If a

baby can learn to work a remote control (later to lose said control in the same vacuum of space that contains all of the missing dryer socks and dark matter) by watching dad turn the T.V. on and off, then you can learn golf by looking at pictures of golf fundamentals. No, I take that back. It would be like learning to paint by staring at the Mona Lisa. However, pay attention to the pictures, study them, comprehend them, and use them to help give you a deep and meaningful understanding of what the associated words are trying to say or describe. As Mark Twain (a famous golf critic) said, "golf is a good walk spoiled". Which is to say; "give me a round of golf, sunshine, air, close friends, beer, etc. and you can keep the golf". That's not quite it either. The game of golf is not only fun, it's addicting, it's rewarding (at times), it's challenging, it's ephemeral (now you have it, now you don't), and it's traditional. I highly recommend getting it...which is to say understand what it's all about, why people, otherwise normal people, get so inexplicably rapped up in it. In other words, don't just learn how to play golf, learn what it means to be a golfer. It's like just knowing that how to move the chess pieces is not enough to play a good game. You must understand and be one with what the game is all about. Golf has an incredible history, tradition, and allure. Be careful, or the greatest game may just become understood and enjoyed...by you.




A fantastic week was spent at the University of North Carolina attending the Tarheels Golf Camp. The camp was run by the UNC ladies golf coach Sally Austin, as

#### JIM KRALL STEPHEN DECATUR HEAD GOLF COACH

Jim Krall took over the helm as Head Golf Coach of Stephen Decatur High School ten years ago and gave up coaching football to concentrate on his passion for golf. During his tenure he has taken players to the Maryland State Tournament every year. Krall's best finish came three years ago when the Decatur team finished in second by only one stroke. "It was an awesome accomplishment to finish so high in the state out of all of the schools in the 1A/2A classification." Now that our school population has grown to over 1300 students, Stephen Decatur High School must compete in the 3A/4A classification. That division is extremely tough. Last year the Decatur team of all underclassmen qualified and experienced the tougher division for the first time. "It was definitely an eye-opener". This year we know what it's going to take to be successful.

Krall's team will travel to The Hyatt Resort in Cambridge and play the River Marsh Course on Tuesday, October 14 for the District Title. This tournament also serves as the state qualifier. Teams must shoot a combined score of 340 (4 scores) or better to advance to the states as a team. Individuals can qualify for the states by shooting an 82 or better and ladies can qualify with a 103 or better. The State Tournament has been held at the University of Maryland Golf Course in College Park every year except the year of the sniper when it was moved to Clustered Spires GC in Frederick, Maryland and this year it will be at Potomac Ridge GC in Waldorf, Maryland due to the closing of The University of Maryland course for construction. Krall believes his team has the talent to qualify as a team and feels very comfortable going into the Districts.

This year's varsity team is the most balanced from top to bottom. competition to be in the top 5 each week has been fierce. Krall uses a qualifier before every regular season match to give all his players the ability to earn a trip to the event. "The tension and level of competition is incredible, however, I think it makes them stronger in the long run. If they can't handle the pressure they shouldn't be on Varsity to begin with. Only one player has handled that pressure since the beginning of the season and has qualified for every match; senior Jenny Sullivan. She has been our rock all year. She is currently ranked 4th in the Bayside South Conference overall and 1st among female golfers. We can always count on a Jenny posting a good number to help the team. She is long off the tee and has great touch around the greens." Jenny is currently looking at many different colleges and hopes to play golf at the collegiate level. Jenny has the entire package. She is smart, athletic, and has an awesome personality. She will make any college coach very proud to have her on the team.

"Sophomore Jake Miller is our number 1 golfer this year. He was off to a slow start but has made up a lot of ground during the season. He is ranked #2 in the Bayside South Conference. Jake is an outstanding golfer with a tremendous amount of talent. He is very composed and calm on the course. He will always post a low score and has been greatly responsible for our success this year. Jake still has two years remaining of eligibility.

He will surely earn the respect in state before he graduates. Kevin McNelis our team's number 3 golfer. Kevin has tremendous amount of passion for the game. He works feverishly on his game year round. Kevin aspirations has entering of the career in golf industry. He has been a very important member of our squad this year. Connor Gebhart and WELCOME TO Sichau Eric have been battling for position each week. Sometimes the success of a match comes down to them. If they're on we win, if they're off

than they will advance to the states. The State of Maryland is trying to boost female participation in the sport so they allow us to bring any extra girls who may have a shot of qualifying.

This year's team strength has been depth of talent. I am blessed to have 10 golfers on the Varsity who are very gifted. I will lose 4 seniors to graduation this year and miss them terribly, but should still be strong with the underclassman. The team's weakness has been lack of consistency. Each match puzzles me. I never know which team will show up to play. It has really been a roller coaster of a season this year. We battled back and forth with Parkside High School, which has been our nemesis for the past 5 years. Last year we won the Bayside South at the last regular season match. This year Parkside took it away from us at the last regular season match.

One aspect of Decatur Golf which has proven to be a real asset is a Junior Varsity Program. Four years ago I asked SDHS Principal Lou Taylor if I could start a JV golf program and he gave me the go ahead. Coach Scott Lenox has taken on that program since its beginning and has done a wonderful job. He gets the 9th and 10th graders prepared for the varsity level. Almost my entire Varsity team is made up of players that went through Coach Lenox's guidance. I have tried to promote JV golf throughout the league to no avail. We are the only school in our conference with a JV team. It's a shame that our JV team does not have anyone to scrimmage." The Bayside South consists of 9 schools.

Pocomoke, Snow Hill and Stephen Decatur High Schools are from Worcester County. Trip information is downloaded and saved to the office computer system. Mosquito management consists of more than merely controlling the adult

population, which alleviates the problem,

but ignores the source.

Ponds and lakes without moving water can be treated as well, so as to reduce the larvae before they mature into biting adults. 

## HERITAGE SHORE COURSE Review



BRIDGEVILLE, DE. – Seventeen ponds, a couple wildly multi-tiered greens, a dozen scary looking tee shots and that infernal Delmarva wind, and what does it all add up to?

Fun! Flat out golfing fun. Lots of drivers, lots of birdie putts, lots of fun.

The new Heritage Shores Club golf course, two miles north of Seaford just off Route 13, is one of those rare courses that combines beauty, visual intimidation, playability (fairness), and excellent conditions to remind you why you play golf in the first place.

Designed by Arthur Hills, the same architect who designed The Links at Lighthouse Sound, Heritage Shores features generous landing areas framed by large, beautiful bunkers, intimidating but avoidable water hazards, and some of the finest fairways and putting surfaces on the Delmarya Peninsula.

Complementing the beauty of the course are the clubhouse and banquet facilities, as well as the veranda overlooking the 18th green.

Heritage Shores' first hole, a 378-yard par-4 from the white tees, sets the tone by, frankly, looking harder than it plays. Mounding and water off the tee really don't come into play except from the tips, and the green complex is flanked

by only one bunker.

Even the 469-yard par-5 second hole, the hardest handicapped hole on the course, gives you options. The long, sweeping dogleg left is flanked by water up the entire left side, but the landing areas for the tee and second shot are generous, and at just 469 yards (511 from blue, 558 from black) the green is reachable in two anyway. The green itself is guarded only by a mound and a large apron

that is shaved around the green's entire circumference, which puts pressure on the chipping game, but also makes upand-downs possible.

The third, seventh, thirteenth and seventeenth holes are all short, possibly drivable par 4's, but like all good short holes, present the golfer with choices. Errant efforts to go for it all will result in maddening bogeys or worse, while well-struck balls make birdies and eagles distinct possibilities.

A signature hole at Heritage Shores is the long par-4 fifth hole, which looks intimidating off the tee but really has no trouble in or around the landing area,

leaving another be a u t i f u l approach over a wetland to an ampitheater-like green c o m p l e x. Careful of going too far right, though, as trees will block your approach.

The 506-yard par-5 fifteenth hole presents the course's highest pucker factor, by featuring a creek running across the fairway at an angle, about 100 yards away from the green, leaving the golfer the choice of laying up for a 150-yard approach into a very intimidating, wind and waterprotected green, or trying to bomb a fairway wood to barely carry the creek, but also leaving a chip shot approach.

Heritage Shores' par-3's are satisfying as a group, presenting a mix of midlength challenges to complex greens. None are absurdly difficult, nor are they easy. Bad shots will be penalized, but good shots will be rewarded.

Finally, the 475-yard par-5 18th hole seals the deal with a stunning finishing hole to a unique rectangular green protected on the left and back by water. Despite the short length, only the bravest, or most foolhardy, golfers will attempt the green in two, though it's there if you want to try. Framing the hole in the background are the bright white pillars of the curving veranda, the clubhouse and the banquet facility.

Combine all this with very reasonable rates, top notch practice facilities, and a super-friendly staff and Heritage Shores adds up to one thing. Fun golf. And isn't that what it's all about?


