2011 MARYLAND INTERCOLLEGIATE GOLF TOURNEY AT RIVER MARSH



The River Marsh Golf Club hosted the Maryland Intercollegiate straight fourth The year. University Winthrop (Rock Hill, S.C.) men's golf team won the fourth annual Maryland Intercollegiate Golf Tournament held at the Hyatt Regency Chesapeake

Bay Golf Resort, Spa and Marina's River Marsh Golf Club on September 12 and 13. The team's winning 54-hole score of 829 topped the scores of 12 other universities and was highlighted by a course-record 63 recorded by Winthrop sophomore Damon Postal in the second round. The Winthrop golfers broke the school's previous 54-hole record by 18 shots.

The Winthrop golfers won the tournament by 11 strokes over the University of Pennsylvania. Finishing third was the team from Georgetown University. The individual competition resulted in a four-way tie between Postal, teammate Taylor Dickson, Max Marsico of the University of Pennsylvania and Brian Dorfman of Georgetown.



Ron has proven that he is a champion in mentoring by promoting over 15 golf professionals into Head Golf Professional positions. He also had an influence on promoting a young Dean Graves into the Head Superintendant position at Chevy Chase Country Club. Here is a list of professionals that have held Head Golf Professional positions after working for Ron: Bob Holzman, Dick Wilson, John Wallett, Noel Caruso, Gary Cecchett, Tom Weeks, Butch Holtzclaw, Chad Kufen, Pete Oakley, Brian Barrows, Tim Mumford, Jim Powers, Gary Pringle, Rich Durham, Mike Connor and Joe Wollaston. I am sure there are a few I have missed and I apologize for not including their names on this impressive list. Ron has touched the lives of his assistants and every employee that has ever worked for him. We are all better people for having the opportunity to work for him.

CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE GAME OF GOLF:

Junior golf has always been one of Ron's greatest passions. The junior program he established at RBCC was one of the finest in Delaware. He has always felt he had a responsibility to give juniors an opportunity to play the game and did not just help the members of RBCC. Since Ron worked at a private country club this was not always easy, but through the hiring of youth, the Rehoboth Junior Open golf tournament and the DSGA Scholarship Fund, Ron has been able to touch the lives of many juniors.

Ron was responsible for creating the best junior golf tournament that I was ever associated with. The Rehoboth Junior Open was

the premier junior golf tournament when I was a junior golfer. It was where I developed the passion to become a better player and have some of my greatest memories. There is no question that this one event was a big part of why I have pursued a career in golf. I am sure I am not the only one that feels the event had a great affect in their life.

Ron also worked with the section in hosting and promoting the Rehoboth Beach Pro-Am. This event always attracted some of the best players of our section and through Ron was well supported with the help of the RBCC members and community. After a conflict of section events reduced the number of participants, Ron gained the support of the DSGA to keep the event going. This event is still an active event and is well supported.

PLAYING ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

Ron's greatest playing accomplishment was that he had the dedication to play with his membership on a regular basis. These days it is hard to find a golf professional that plays golf as much as he does. He was always committed to making sure that he could find time to play. Ron had a few successes over his years. He was runner-up one year in the Toyota Cup and did continually support many Pro-Am events in our section. But his passion to play is what makes him stand out as a player. He did not and does not keep this passion to himself. Ron continually pushes his passion on his staff, friends and members. Ron does not comprehend how someone would not love the game of golf.

AWARDS WON:

Ron was awarded the DSGA Annual Award in 1986 and has been a member of the PGA's President's Council.

POSITIONS HELD IN THE INDUSTRY:

Ron got into golf by working for Hall of Fame member, Joe Aneda, at Newark Country Club. He worked for him as a teenager and left Newark to go to Rehoboth Beach Country Club to become the youngest Head Golf Professional in nation at the age of 20. That was the spring of 1966 and he just retired this year after 45 years of service. Ron has always been committed to the game of golf and his RBCC membership. There are very few professionals that can say they worked at one facility for 45 years. I feel this commitment alone is worthy for consideration of the Hall of Fame. Ron has always been there for his fellow professionals or anyone that needed his advice or help. Even though he is now retired, I am sure he will continue to support the PGA, the section and his fellow members.

Art Scott started playing golf at Ocean City Golf and Yacht Club in 1959 while he was caddying there. He had played all sports in high school but really enjoyed golf the most. With the help of Rick McCall, he turned professional in 1967 and took his first Assistant Professional job at Washing-

ton Country Club. His love for golf grew greater than ever through the years. Joining the PGA of America, he has now been a member for 42 years. His career highlights and tournament play came mostly through the Baltimore and Washington areas. In 1992, Art moved back to Berlin, Maryland and is semi-retired. Art is still playing and enjoying his great game of golf here on the shore.

JANE MASON



Carolyn Jane Schiller Mason was born with her twin brother C. Joseph Schiller, Jr., in Salisbury, Maryland on March 7, 1939. Her father, C. Joseph Schiller, was an accomplished amateur player and started her playing at Green Hill Yacht & Country Club when the Club re-opened in 1948. By the age of 16, she began competing

in the Maryland State Golf Association and

Middle Atlantic Golf Association's Women's amateur tournaments. She qualified to play in the USGA Junior Girls Championship in Florence, South Carolina in 1956. She graduated from Wicomico High School in 1957 and from the University of Maryland, College Park in 1962. She married Dr. Robert C. Mason in 1964. They had two sons, Lee in 1966 and Chris in 1968.

On a local level, Jane won Green Hill's Women's Club Championship 13 times, Nassawango Country Club's Women's Club Championship 3 times, the Delmarva Peninsula Golf Association's Women's Championship 12 times and the Pepsi Invitational 10 times.

Regionally, Jane won the Old Export Bowl at Cumberland Country Club Women's Invitational in 1966, 1967 and 1968, retiring the bowl. When the Tournament was renamed the Carol Boggs Invitational, she won the event an additional 7 times. Jane played and won the Lillian Paine Cup at Congressional Country Club in Washington, D.C. and the Farmington Invitational in Charlottesville, Va., tournaments which attracted national amateur players. She won the Maryland State Golf Association's Women's Amateur in 1966 and 1974, and the Senior Women's Amateur in 1992, 1993, 1995 and 2000. She won the Middle Atlantic Golf Association's Women's Championship in 1965, 1970, 1984, 1986 and 1994, and Senior Women's Amateur in 1989, 1990, 1991, 2000, 2001, and 2002. She also competed in the USGA Senior Women's Open Championship in 1994, 1995 and 1996. Following her competitive playing career, Jane became a Maryland State and USGA Rules Official. She was also a founding member of the Maryland State Golf Association's Women's Division, where she served as President in 2000 and 2001. In 2002, she was inducted into the Middle Atlantic Golf Association's Hall of Fame. In 2008, she was given the Maryland State Golf Association-Women's Division's highest honor, the Distinguished Service Award. Her playing career was impressive, but more than the many victories, she will be remembered for her sportsmanship, positive attitude and integrity. The game of golf has given her a lifetime of joy and fond memories, and she reciprocated with many years of service to the United States Golf Association, Maryland State Golf Association, Delmarva Peninsula Golf Association, and many clubs along the way. She currently lives near Centreville, Maryland.

PETE OAKLEY



Peter H. Oakley (born June 28, 1949) is best known for winning the 2004 Senior British Open, one of the major championships in senior men's professional golf. He is the younger brother of golfer David Oakley. Oakley was born in Panama City, Florida. He got started in the game at age 11 by his mother who thought a nearby nine-hole course would be a great babysitter for him

and his brother David.

Oakley was a long-time club pro at the Rookery in the Philadelphia-Delaware area where he won numerous sectional titles including the Delaware State Open 4 times. The biggest win of his career was his first on the Champions Tour, and came in a major – The 2004 Senior British Open played at Royal Portrush Golf Club in Northern Ireland. Oakley sank a 10-foot par putt on the final hole to win by one stroke and avoid a playoff with Tom Kite and Eduardo Romero. Oakley has done some excellent golf course design work as well. In 2001, he completed and opened (with partner Chris Adkins) a public course in Milton, Delaware called The Rookery.

Oakley was awarded the Player of the Year for the Philadelphia Section of the PGA of America in 1980, 1984, 1999 and 2000. His son's, Zac and J.J., are also golfers. Zac was a three-time All-American at Wesley College, and J.J. played at the University of Delaware. Oakley is a man of strong religious faith.

Oakley captured his first national title in 1999, winning the PGA Senior Club Professional Championship by three strokes, was runner-up in 2000 Championship and tied for 15th in 2001. Was a member of the 1994 PGA Cup Team that triumphed at PGA National Golf Club's Champion Course over Europe, 15-11. Winner, 2000 PGA Senior Stroke Play Championship. Winner, 1980, '82, '86, '90, '95 Delaware State Open. Winner of the 1989 and 1990 Philadelphia Open. Four events on the PGA Tournament Series. Competed in 1975, '80, '83 U.S. Open, 1983, '86, '87, '94,'95, '97 PGA Championship.

MARK HERRMANN

Mark Herrmann started in golf business as the Assistant Golf Professional at Hog Golf Course in August of at 23 years of age. Hog had just opened on July 17, Mark had graduated from University of Maryland where he'd played on the golf team four years and decided to the golf business. Head

Professional, John Medved and Mark began introducing the game to a golf starved area on the Mid Shore. The first few seasons Mark was on the lesson tee most of the day teaching and introducing people to the game. It was a great experience and many new friendships were established. The one thing that made Mark successful was his ability to remember and greet people by their names after only meeting them one time. He also took a genuine interest in their game and families. That ability was instilled in Mark by his first golf teacher at Turf Valley CC in the early 1960's by the great Bill Strausbaugh. Fortunately for Mark, his father had just taken up the game and joined the club and took lessons from Bill. Before he took a Job at Columbia Country Club, Mark observed Bill for several years and saw how he treated people and ran the golf operation. It was a great learning experience. The golf course was very well received by the golfing public from Philadelphia to Richmond and by the mid 1980's the course was playing over 60,000 Rounds. Golf Digest Magazine had also started ranking Public Golf courses and Hog Neck was rated in the Top 25 Public Courses from 1980 through 1992. That was a huge honor and really kept the number of rounds going.

Head Pro, John Medved, sadly passed away with cancer in July 1980 and the Talbot County Park Board appointed Mark as the Head Professional. He was 27 years old and very fortunate to attain Head Professional status at a young age. He had proven himself as Assistant and now needed to prove himself as Head professional. The key to his success was acknowledging customers by their name as he greeted them, treating everyone with respect and taking a personal interest in their game.

Mark developed a great Junior Golf Clinic with over 150 juniors attending which continues to this day. Many have gone on to be great golfers. Some attended College on golf Scholarships and Hog Neck Junior graduates have won both the Maryland State Golf Association Men's and Women's Championships.

Mark won Merchandiser of the Year for Public Courses in the Middle Atlantic PGA two different times in his tenure. He was fortunate to be at a great golf course with a great staff and a supportive wife. Mark retired with 30 years of service at Hog Neck Golf Course and Talbot County in August 2006 and is now a Loan Officer at Easton Bank and Trust in his second career.

ROBERT BRADWAY

Robert "Tuffy" Bradway was born on April 20, 1935 and died July 7, 1999. During the 64 years of his life, his accomplishments were plentiful. Tuffy, as he was affectionately known, was one of the most (and perhaps the most) multitalented athletes to emerge both from Dorchester county and the entire Eastern Shore. In high school, Bob was a three sport standout athlete. He was regarded



as a superior runner, passer, kicker and multifaceted high school football player. He was a two time all-state player and was named to the National High School Football All American Team in 1953. He was the only player from the Eastern Shore selected to the All State Standout Football Team and consequently received a scholarship to Shippensburg College in Pennsylvania.

In baseball, Bob was considered a natural. He not only excelled in high school competition but was the only teenage player in the Adult Central Shore League at the amazing age of 15. Due to his baseball prowess, he later signed with the Brooklyn Dodger organization and played in 52 minor league games. After his baseball career, Bob was a standout catcher in the popular Eastern Shore Fastpitch Softball League. In 1988 he was inducted into the Eastern Shore Baseball Hall of Fame and in 1989 he was awarded a Governor Citation by then Governor William Donald Schaefer recognizing not only his baseball talent but his wide-ranging contributions to Eastern Shore baseball. When Bob's playing days were over he turned to golf at the age of 30 and eventually became one of the premier golfers on the Eastern Shore. Bob joined the Elks club with little knowledge of the game but the same fierce determination to excel that he had always shown. He was given a 16 handicap and played his first club tournament in the "sixth flight". Bob was very observant of other golfers, was self taught and developed into a scratch golfer in only two years. In the next 24 years of competitive golf, "Tuffy" Bradway produced some amazing accomplishments:

- Six time green Hill club champion including five consecutive titles from 1977 to 1981
- Elks Club Champion in 1975 and also won the Green Hill Club Championship that same year
 - 1975 Exulted Ruler Champion at Elks
 - Four time winner of the DPGA invitational at Elks Club
- Two time winner of the DPGA invitational at Green Hill Country Club
- The Phillips DPGA Invitational at Cambridge Country Club Winner
- 1981 at the 24th Annual Salisbury Middle Atlantic PGA Tournament at Green Hill, Bob was a runaway winner in the amateur division shooting par 72 three consecutive days for a total of 216. That score was also third among the 55 pros in attendance and was only five shots off the winning pro score of 211
- Bob also won numerous charity golf event around the Eastern Shore

Unfortunately, Bob suffered a degenerative illness in 1987 that seriously curtailed his competitive golf. Eventually he lost both legs and several fingers and required a kidney transplant. After going through several years of operations and kidney dialysis procedures Bob, with the aid of two prostheses and specifically fitted gloves, was finally able to pursue golf again. His goal was to break 100 from the "white tees" at Green Hill. He was able to exactly accomplish that goal at the 1994 Green Hill Club Championship. It was fun to play golf WITH Bob Bradway, but he was a very tough person to play AGAINST. The word that first comes to mind when you think of Bob is tenacity. Bob never backed down from any challenge whether it was golf, illness or any of life's other Bob "Tuffy" Bradway was quite simply a "man's man", a great athlete, a great competitor and a great inspiration to all; particularly those who may be handicapped in some way. When it came time to face a challenge, Bob always met it directly, like a champion.



AVERY SMITH

Avery Smith was born February 5, 1912 in Irvington, New Jersey. He was a graduate of Wagner College in Staten Island, New York. Upon graduation, he was employed by the General Foods Corporation and then transferred to Pocomoke in 1946 where he served as Office Manager and Chief Accountant until his retirement in 1965.



Avery served on the Vestry at St. Mary's Episcopal Church while he and his wife Elma raised six children. Avery first organized the Pocomoke Boys Club in 1947 where he served as non-salaried Director and Athletic Coach for 22 years. It is estimated that more than 400 boys got a push in life as recipients of Avery's unselfishness. Most of the boys went on to star on the Pocomoke High School basketball team and then on to be successful in their life's endeavors.

Avery was also known as "Mr. Golf" throughout Delmarva. He spent more than 40 years teaching the game of golf to young people and was the founder of the Winters Quarters Junior Golf Program. That golf team was successful having developed four PGA professionals as well as countless award winners. Most notable was Charlie Houts who went on to play the PGA tour. At the 1989 Avery Smith testimonial dinner, Charlie said the three interests he learned from Avery, which he passed onto his daughter, were a good education, an interest in music, and of course golf. At that testimonial dinner in 1989, many praises for Avery came from various graduates of Avery's basketball and golf programs. A golf scholarship in Avery's honor began as a result of that dinner. Avery was also presented a plaque that night from the Delmarva Golf Association. Avery also founded the Pocomoke Little League in 1953.

Avery was a member of the Delmarva Golf Association, the Winters Quarters Country Club and Nassawango Country Club where he won the 1972 and 1975 Presidents Cup. Avery encouraged kids of all ethnic backgrounds to participate in his program during the days of segregation on the Lower Shore in the early 50s and 60s. This was very controversial at that time but it brought the youth of Pocomoke together. No matter what your ethnicity or economic background, everyone was equal! We learned respect! Avery Smith had a profound influence on many of the youth of Pocomoke. He taught sportsmanship and respect through competition on the diamond, the court and the course. Avery Smith died at home in Pocomoke on August 19, 1989. The induction of Avery Smith into the Eastern Shore Golf Hall of Fame will make every participant in Avery's programs very proud. Thank you Hall of Fame committee for selecting Avery Smith a member of the 2011 Inaugural Class.



JACK SLAYTON, SR



Jack Slayton, Sr. was the highly respected PGA Golf Professional at the Elks Golf Club for over thirty years. He was in the first class of twelve to become a PGA Master Professional. Jack was a PGA Professional but an instructor at heart. He loved to teach the game of golf and excelled in that area. His junior golf program has won fifteen south titles. His thesis is used

in the PGA Instructional book and has been published in many magazines. Jack's dedication to golf and his love of the game continues on through the twenty local golf professionals here on the Eastern Shore that were instructed though his junior program.

ROBERT P. "RICK" McCall

Richard P. "Rick" McCall was born in Bethlehem, PA on January 6, 1941. He graduated from Hellertown High School in 1958 where he played football, basketball, and track. He always had a passion for golf, and he began playing in 1947 under the tutelage of Jim Davis. He won many Junior Tournaments in the Lehigh Valley area. He graduated from the University of North Carolina in 1963.




He was an integral part of the Tar Heels Golf Team and as a senior was named the MVP. Rick became a PGA Professional in June of 1963 and began working at The Country Club of Northampton County, and worked for Billy Booe for two years. In 1965 Rick was named the Head Golf Professional at Maple Dale Country Club in Dover, Delaware where he remained for 40 years until his retirement in 2005.

At Maple Dale Rick was known for his junior golf programs, which were considered one of the best on the East Coast. Rick also coached the Maple Dale Junior Golf team, which won the Delmarva Peninsula Championship 28 times in 30 years.

In 1994 McCall was named Head Golf Coach at Wesley College in Dover, Delaware, where he had also coached from 1971-73. Since then he has won over 50 tournaments, 11 conference championships and had over 40 players named to the all conference team.

As a coach and teacher, McCall has developed many outstanding young golfers. Many of them played for Dover High School, winner of 17 Delaware scholastic golf titles, which is believed to be a national record. He has also had All American golfers from Wesley College, and five all Americans from his junior program. One of these is Heather Bowie, four time All American at Arizona State



Over the years Rick has been honored with several awards and titles; the DSGA Annual Award for his contributions to golf in Delaware, and the Pat Knight Award for his work with junior golfers. Rick was also honored by the Philadelphia Section PGA as Jr. Golf Leader, and he was named Division 3 Coach of the Year in 2003. In 2007, Rick was inducted into the Delaware Sports Hall of Fame.

Rick has organized several local golf tournaments including the Kent County Amateur and Open in 1965, the Fran Lore Better Ball Championship in 1981, as well as the Dana Reed Memorial Jr. Championship in 1986, which became the biggest Jr. Championship on the East Coast.

In addition to being the Head Golf Coach at Wesley College he also teaches at Wild Quail Golf and Country Club, where his son, Ricky McCall, Jr. is head Golf Pro and Director of Operations, and his grandson Tyler Smith is the Assistant Golf Pro. Rick continues to give back to the sport he loves by offering free senior clinics five days a week in the fall and winter, which he has been doing for the past seven years.

Rick has been married to Pat for 49 years, and they have 4 children; Susan, Kathy, Debbie and Ricky. They also have six grandchildren; Steve, Tyler, Michael, Lauren, Hunter, and Haydan and two great grandchildren; Parker and Tanner.






DPGA DISCOUNT COUPON BOOK


C'MON MAN!


How many times have you wanted to say this to someone on the golf course? I know I've wanted to shout this out plenty of times over the years with several of my playing partners!



"Alignment (or aim) is one of the most misunderstood and feared animals in the golfing jungle. If people aimed guns the way they aim a golf club, no

one would ever get hit. Wars would last forever, or at least until everyone got fed up with all the noise and went home. What a wonderful world it would be...but golfers would still be alignment deficient. Poor aim is one of the first things to go wrong in the golf swing. It's the chicken or the egg thing. First you begin to aim a little to the right, then you start to pull the ball left to compensate, then you aim more right, and so on, and so on. Next thing you know, you're aiming 50 yards to the right of your target and looping the club way over the top to swing outside-in in order to hit the mighty and completely ineffective pull-slice. Did bad aim happen first, or bad swing...one begets the other in a terrible circle of life. The way to avoid this loop of futility is to learn proper alignment early, practice it often,

and go to bed dreaming of railroad tracks. I can think of much blonder things to dream about, but none more helpful (if aim is your aim) then the classic railroad track. Imagine, if you can, that your ball is resting on the outside rail which runs to your target, and your feet are on the inside rail. The inside rail, being almost exactly parallel to the outside track, will sadly never converge with the outside rail, and will in fact slide harmlessly just so far to the left of the target...not actually hitting it. Luckily, it is the ball and not your feet that you most likely wish to hit the target with, so it just about works out for the best. With your feet now "parallel left" of your target track, your ball and therefore club, is now aimed dead at your intended victim. Now simply make sure that your knees, hips, and shoulders are all in line with your feet, and you are ready to launch the golf ball at your intended target.

One last tip...use alignment sticks to help you perfect this when practicing. Practice? Yes, once again you must practice to perfect...even something as simple as alignment.



So far, my reviews have been on cigars that tend to be in the full-bodied flavor range. Having enjoyed cigars for many years, I lean in that direction for my smoking enjoyment. Knowing that people enjoy cigars that are more on the mild side,

I went with a milder cigar for this review.

Romeo y Julieta is a brand from the Dominican Republic that has been consistently a favorite choice of mine when I want a mild cigar, with flavor and at a reasonable price. Having visited their factory in La Romana, I was very impressed with their quality control. Their Vintage series is great cigar for the golf course.

On The Range

I went with the natural cigar that had the blonde Ecuadorian Connecticut shade wrapper. It was a little bit veiny but otherwise very appealing in appearance with a hint of nuts in the aroma. It comes with a Mexican binder and Dominican filler tobaccos. I was looking forward to firing it up.

Front Nine

Right from the start it was smooth and creamy. The draw was consistent without any resistance yet it wasn't like sucking through an open straw either. The flavor starts building rather subtly, which is very nice for a cigar early in the round. This is also nice if you're playing an early morning round and still want to light one up.

Back Nine

For a full-bodied enthusiast, I was hoping the flavor would build a little faster but that wasn't a realistic expectation. I regained my patience and began to enjoy the fact that this was really good mellow smoke and it blended well with the late day round of golf I was playing. We weren't in a hurry to finish and the smoke was relaxing. By the end of the cigar I realized I needed a few more of these in my humidor.





SHORE UP WITH THE GAME COACH

CARSON LOVETT, MA, SPORT PSYCHOLOGY

A tool borrowed from the corporate world and team sport settings that may prove useful for golfers is The Exit Interview. The Exit Interview can aide in identifying points of reference for the competitive season to come.

Regardless of the performance outcome, the 2011 season provided a wealth of knowledge that can be used to lower scores and increase joy on the course. Reviewing past performances as an instrument to shape the goals for next season may create a foundation for a successful 2012. Once those goals have been established, it is recommended that they be written down in order to provide a visual motivation for accomplishment.

While considering the plan for next season, consider the fact that the greatest golfers of today in the quest to meet their goals and maximize performance are willing to seek instruction. Whether it is a book, a Game Coach, a Sport Psychologist or an Internet seminar, the best of the best understand the tremendously positive impact that education and consultation can have on performance results. As we conclude 2011 and look toward the New Year, prepare!

GOLF FITNESS - STRETCHES






I have had some questions at our Fitness Center about an unusual injury called "trigger finger". While this can occur in any sport, it is more prevalent among golfers because of the repetitive nature of the golf swing, especially if one grips the club too tightly. Your fingers and your thumb are bent by tendons that connect the corresponding muscle to the bone. To do this smoothly, the tendon en route to the appropriate

bony attachment passes through a ligamentous "pulley" that acts as a sheath around the bone and allows the tendon to slide easily. If this pulley becomes damaged, it can thicken and disrupt the natural movement of the tendon. This can make bending the affected finger difficult or it can even lock, sticking the digit in a straight or bent position, as if getting ready to pull a trigger. Untreated, it can progress to the inability to fully straighten the finger. The finger can become stiff and painful and may begin clicking as the tendon struggles to move through the pulley.

Prevention centers around using the correct and softer grip, wearing gloves for extra padding, changing club handle grips as soon as necessary and resting the hands between golf sessions. Treatment in the early stages involves resting the hand, using anti-inflammatory drugs for pain and sometimes even splinting the affected finger for a period of time. If it persists, steroid injections can be used effectively. If surgery becomes necessary, it can be an open procedure under local anesthesia where the surgeon slices through the damaged pulley, then closes the incision and applies a light bandage. Some doctors do percutaneous lysis using a needle to slice the pulley, but being a "blind" procedure, it risks damage to nerves and blood vessels that are near the sheath.

It goes without saying that if you think you are developing a trigger finger, seek advice early rather than later.







Child's Play

As I mentioned in an earlier article, I was fortunate enough to begin learning the game of golf as a child. I had enjoyed playing many other sports and baseball was my favorite. I played in little leagues and had dreams of one day making the major leagues.

Over time however, golf won me over. I enjoyed the fact that it was only up to me. Managers, coaches and teammates didn't have an effect on my success. Only I could take the credit or the blame for the outcome

of my round. I liked that.

Golf didn't come easy to me. There were certainly many better juniors than me, but that drove me to become better. The desire continues today to keep getting better and it comes from what I learned as a kid. That is one of the great things about the game of golf. It teaches children many valuable lessons to prepare them for life.

Golf can teach kids how to deal with the unfairness that life brings. You can hit a perfect drive down the middle of the fairway, watch it hit a sprinkler head and bounce into the water. Oh well, you deal with it and do your best to make your next shot a good one.

It teaches anger management. You can whine and stomp your feet all you want, but that won't get you what you want. The ball doesn't care and the game doesn't give in. Discipline and perseverance will deliver the better results. It happens slowly, but if you practice with discipline and perseverance, you will get better. Your hard work is rewarded.

As a young golfer, you learn to treat nature and others with respect. You take care of the natural surface on which the game is played and it's surroundings. You learn to keep the course in good condition and play quickly so others can enjoy it as well.

Golf also teaches honor and integrity. You learn early that you are your own referee. It doesn't do you any good to "enhance" your score by circumventing the rules. The truth will eventually be apparent to others.

Beyond all of those lessons are the memories created while playing with your parents, siblings and friends. I know the same thing is happening for them.





YOUR PATH TO PAR Richard Robinson- Instructor The Original Golf School



Golf's greatest players always practiced reflective self-evaluation. It was the key to Byron Nelson's legendary victory "streak". In 1944, following each round, he recorded observations in a little black book. He evaluated his experiences at the end of the year. In 1945 he won 18 tournaments, 11 consecutively, finished second 7 times and set a

scoring average 68.33 which has been surpassed only once in 66 years. The "secret" of Nelson's diary was not so much the details and statistics, but rather his desire for an honest self-assessment and the ability to formulate and execute a plan for improvement.

The cornerstones of performance are fitness, technique, equipment, and expectation. Fitness dictates technique and equipment decisions. Your physical attributes should determine the way you swing the club and the design of the clubs you swing. Increasing strength and range of motion will help your game. It is equally important to identify your physical limitations. This knowledge will be the starting point for improving your technique and if necessary modifying your equipment.

Fitness, technique, or equipment are important, but your ultimate improvement depends on understanding and managing expectation. Many physically fit players with good technique and the best equipment fail to meet their potential, because they do not recognize the need to identify and appreciate their average or typical performance. Others struggle, because a quest for

perfection precludes the experience of playing a game that more often rewards adaptation over perfection. Your ability to manage your game and lower your handicap begins with the knowledge that even the best players rarely hit perfect shots. Plan every shot with "average expectation." Hit every shot with "perfect intent".

Ben Hogan and Jack Nicklaus epitomized this philosophy, charting their expectations for distance identifying normal, maximum and minimum distance for each club. They meticulously mapped the course. They knew in advance, and could practice mentally and on the range, the shots demanded of the course design. Their success lead to an expanded use of distance markers, yardage books, GPS and laser devices common today, so quality information is now available as we play.

Charting your typical club distances is the first step to better course management. Use Hogan and Nicklaus' approach. Follow their example, identifying maximum and typical expectations. The goal is not to routinely strive for maximum distance, but to achieve the desired result with less than full effort. Creating an overlap of range for each club provides options for your best approach for a given shot, offering a margin of error for the less than perfect shot.


Knowing distances to targets and hazards is helpful only if the information leads you to a decisive and accurate club selection. Such decisions are personal and must feel right for you, without doubt. No one else's expectation matters. Consider Hogan's standard instructions to his caddies. "If I ask for the distance to a target, tell me the yardage. But, don't ever tell me what club to hit." The choice is always yours. 


TOOLS OF THE TRADE THINKING INSIDE THE BOX This teaching method

This teaching method was borrowed from a fellow golf professional that shall remain nameless...but rhymes with Lob Shmeckelman. It has been a fantastic way to help people find their swing plane! The majority of golfers tend to slice their shots. The slice occurs because one tries to hit at the golf ball which invites an extension of the dominant arm to start the down swing, instead of using their body and turning towards the target. This causes the club path to travel outside the target line before impact, to inside the target line after impact, creating spin that travels away from the golfer. Some people call this coming over the top, others just curse and say "I can't fix my banana ball!" An easy way to identify if you are swinging outside to inside is to look at your divot. If you see the divot pointing to the left of your target (if you are right handed), there is a good chance this is you. You don't want to end up looking like Tin Cup - buying the latest and greatest expensive training aids like the Explanar Swing Plane System, the Medicus, The Gyro Swing Trainer and specialized training gloves. Here is the easiest and usually free way of turning that fade into a straight pin seeking shot! Get to your local pro shop and ask for a club box used for shipping golf clubs. They usually have a bunch of them in the back room, then get to the range, pronto! Place the box length wise pointing towards your target and parallel to your feet. Set your practice ball just inside the box somewhere around the middle. Allow yourself the width of your club head plus an inch or two. Choose whatever club you like, then swing away Merrill! If your club path is outside to in, you will normally clip the box before you make impact with the golf ball. No worries, you will not hurt your club or even the box. What you will get is instant feedback on your club path and a great visual tool. The visual will help you see a barrier or wall outside the club's intended path or plane. The thought of the club swinging from inside to "hopefully" square then back to the inside is easier to perform with this tool in place. This is an easy and inexpensive way to get your swing on track and help save a little coin.






