As you drive down Route 64 toward White Sulphur Springs, you have the feeling that you are driving into a majestic place...A WORLD APART. Nestled in the Appalachian Mountains lies a golf course with a storied past and a PROMISING FUTURE. The Greenbrier Resort opened the Old White golf course in 1914 and it has been etched into the legacy of American golf. For almost a century, people have come from all over the world to play golf at The Greenbrier. US Presidents, Royalty, celebrities and golfing legends all agree that the courses are among the very best in the world. One of the first golfers to play Old White was President Woodrow Wilson. In 1936 a twenty three year old Sam Snead came to The Greenbrier for his first professional job. Later becoming one of the world's greatest players, winning a record 82 PGA tour events, he kept The Greenbrier close to his heart. His long relationship with The Greenbrier continued until his death in 2002 while he was still named as the Golf Professional Emeritus. In 2005,

The Greenbrier named the legendary Tom Watson the resort's second Golf Professional Emeritus, a position he still holds today.

Over the years, The Greenbrier has played host to the Ryder Cup '79, Solheim Cup '94 as well as multiple PGA Senior events. Even with its rich and storied history, it couldn't help but feel the crunch of a tough economy. Once booking up to sixty five thousand rounds a year on their three courses, The Greenbrier's numbers dwindled to twenty seven thousand rounds in 2008. The Greenbrier's former owner, CSX Railway Corp., put the resort into bankruptcy in March 2008. In May 2009, The Greenbrier was acquired by a third generation West Virginian, Mr. Jim Justice. I can't help the feeling that this man was hand chosen by God to lead The Greenbrier into a future that will rewrite history. Jim has dedicated himself to the goal of returning The Greenbrier to its rightful prominence among the world's greatest resorts. Prior

to purchasing The Greenbrier, Mr. Justice spent most if his time deeply involved in his family's business. His strong interest in agriculture led him to start the Justice Family Farms, LLC in 1977. The corn, wheat and soybean operation has grown to over fifty thousand acres in four different states and is now the largest grain producer on the East Coast. Mr. Justice is a humble man that has stayed true to his family's traditions. A major supporter of youth programs, he is also the President of the local Little League and continues to coach basketball to kids of all ages. He is currently the girls head basketball coach at The Greenbrier East High School. Justice played golf for the University of Tennessee and later Marshall University where he became captain of their golf team for his junior and senior years. He played for the legendary golf coach Joe Feagenes and remains friends with him to this day. Mr. Justice's foundation is simple; a sincere commitment to the Lord, family, his employees and the community.





Mr. Justice has made quick work of getting The Greenbrier back on track as the world took notice July 26th through August 1st at the Inaugural Greenbrier Classic. In its inaugural year, the tourney was able to attract some of the world's greatest players including Jim Furyk, Sergio Garcia, Kenny Perry, Boo Weekly, John Daly, Matt Kuchar, JB Holmes and many others, but The Classic belonged to Stuart Appleby as he made history shooting the fifth recorded 59 in PGA history. Breaking Sam Snead's course record of 60, he came from seven strokes back to win The Classic by one stroke over the young 2010 Ryder Cup team member, Jeff Overton. Appleby drained three long birdie putts on sixteen, seventeen and eighteen to close out the historical round and raise the Crystal Dome. The entire event was first class and I highly recommend to all who read this to attend next years Classic. For less than \$150, you can receive a weekly badge plus access to great concerts. This year's concerts featured Brad Paisley, Carrie Underwood, Reba and Rascal Flatts. The players are also accessible for autographs for the fans and you are assured a time that you will never forget.

I completely forgot about pitching! I got distracted: 1st by Phil Mickelson; than by the Ocean City summer beach bumming. I've been promising to teach you how to pitch, and this issue I am

The art of pitching has been lost in the fruitless pursuit of distance...swing as hard as you can and hope it lands on the planet somewhere. What happened to touch? What happened to lofting a shot up over a bunker and having it land like a butterfly with sore feet? Let's go back and learn a scoring skill! After all, most of us are trying to lower our scores, not win a long drive

The keys to hitting great pitch shots are

- 1. Control the trajectory
- 2. Control distance

Controlling trajectory is easy...the higher you want the shot to go, the more loft you should use. Seems simple, but you would be surprised how many times I see players trying to loft a shot high with an eight iron ("cause it's my favorite"). Experiment with wedges: Pitching wedge ~48 degrees; Sand wedge ~56 degrees; Lob wedge ~60 degrees...How high can you go? The higher the loft on the club the higher the ball will fly and the softer it will land on the green. If you have trouble stopping the ball on the green, try a more lofted wedge. Note: if you have enough loft on the club, you won't have to "help" the ball in the air! Helping is BAD! Simply make sure the club bottoms out under the ball (preferably through some grass), and the loft of the club will launch the ball skyward (with some luck and a lot of praying to your favorite golf god!)

Controlling distance is a little tougher...however, we're going to try and keep it simple. Don't complicate things by opening your stance, and changing your swing, setup regular and let the club do the work. Try choking down on the club (not strangle), and vary the length of your motion to control the distance. We are making our best golf swing here, just not all the way back and all the way through. Try half the way back and half the way through, or 3/4 back and 3/4 through. The idea is to create less and less swing speed in order to hit short high shots. Swing your arms, hands, and body to match the length of your motion. The smaller the motion, the less your arms, hands and body will work...less motion = less power = less distance; more motion = more arms, hands, and body for more distance. Also, please allow your weight to shift from foot to foot in rhythm with your motion (it really, really wants to!).

That's about it! You now have the knowledge to go out and PRACTICE! You gotta practice in order to develop the touch with various clubs (SW, PW, Gap Wedge, Lob Wedge, etc.) so you can use it on the course to lower your scores. No more LIFT, CHUNCK, AND SKULL!!




Are all of your golf shots going awry? Check your address. I mean your home address, your driveway more specifically. There just may be some useful golf tools right in your own driveway. Some people use driveway markers to mark the edges of their lane so they can keep their car on track. These markers have become more popular year after year, but not in your driveway. They can be seen in many golf bags. Ironically they also are used to keep your golf swing right on track. They are about 42 inches long and about a guarter of an inch thick. They usually come in many bright colors such as fluorescent yellow or construction cone orange. You can find them at most hardware stores for about \$6 bucks each. These sticks can be incorporated in many ways to improve your golf game. Okay, got some, now what?

One of the contributing factors to a golf shot gone bad usually begins at the address position. Most right handed people tend to aim too far to the right and come over the top to "pull" the ball on line. This habit will tear down your golf swing little by little. It can make you block your shot way right and it can also make a good golf swing turn into a quick snap hook that will tear your heart out. These shots will destroy your confidence and cause you to question every club in your bag. You can lay the sticks down on the range putting the outside stick pointing directly at your target. Place

another at your feet parallel to the target line stick similar to train tracks. These tools will help you keep yourself square at address position. Another golf shot killer is poor ball position. They are also useful when put down perpendicularly to check ball position in your stance. Taylor Made makes a set of alignment sticks very reasonably priced that are perfect for the job. You can stick them into the ground to check your swing plane or you can incorporate them into your grip to work on your short game. It helps you

keep the grip ahead of the golf ball during the swing. These things have more conventional uses than a Swiss army knife. They also have some unconventional uses, such as an attitude adjuster during junior clinics (for you catholic school kids). Of course I am just kidding. If you are serious about improving your game and you don't feel like dropping hundreds of dollars in the latest "insert-name-here" video and prop, invest in some alignment sticks!

"YOU KNOW THE DRILL'

SPLITTERP DRILL

One of the most common problems I encounter while teaching a right hander is when they try to hit the golf ball too hard with their right hand. This usually results in a fade or a nasty slice. A great drill to learn muscle memory of the natural rotation of the hands and forearms is the split grip drill. Here's what you do. Grip a club normally with your left hand. Then take your right hand and pinch the club right below the grip on the shaft with your thumb and index finger only. Take a normal swing and make sure you swing to the finish. This should result in the inability for you to swing with your arms and hands only. The club will wobble and hit you in the right forearm unless you swing properly. Practicing this drill will teach you how to turn your core to swing properly instead

of hitting the ball from the top of the swing. If you are left handed, read the article backwards.

Now you know the drill!



A VITAL ROLE IN THE SUCCESS OF PGA GOLF MANAGEMENT STUDENTS

The UMES Golf Academy fulfills a dual role in the success of all UMES students including the PGA Golf Management students. Marshall Cropper, Director of the UMES Golf Academy oversees the facilities and resources dedicated to golf on the UMES campus. These facilities include the UMES driving range, short game practice area, indoor practice area, and the golf simulator.

The UMES Golf Academy was originally the brainchild of the UMES President, Dr. Thelma B. Thompson. Dr. Thompson has always recognized that the game of golf is used as much as a business tool as it is used for recreation. Having an understanding of how to play the game, the rules, the history, and etiquette of golf can serve all UMES graduates well within their chosen industry. With this in mind, the President called on UMES alum, Cropper, and asked him to start the golf academy. With few resources to get the academy up and running, Cropper did the best he could with what he had to work with. He started with the indoor facility that consisted of a hitting mat and a net designed for students to work on their full swing. Next to the indoor facility Cropper designed the indoor short game area. Students learned the fundamentals of putting and chipping in this area. Currently, the indoor facility still has the hitting mat and the net, but also includes a classroom area and the dual camera V1 computer swing analysis system. The indoor short game area currently houses the golf simulator. With the facility up and running, Cropper then started teaching the Beginning Golf class for the Exercise Science Department: EDPE 151. This class offered UMES students a chance to learn exactly what the President wanted them to learn, the basics of golf.

Since the inception of the UMES PGA Golf Management Program in 2008, the UMES Golf Academy's role on campus has been expanded. PGA Golf Management students enjoy having an option on campus of facilities to choose from while not in class. "If a student has an hour break between classes, the UMES Golf Academy facilities give that student an opportunity to work on their game, whether it is at the driving range or simulator, without having to leave campus for one of our partnering golf courses", said Chris Prosser, UMES PGA Golf Management Internship Coordinator.

"Marshall has a lot of time and sweat invested in the success of the PGA Golf Management Program and all UMES students. All he is trying to do is give the students a chance to experience a great game that most of them have never been exposed too before in life. The University appreciates everything Marshall has done to promote golf at UMES", said Prosser. BY BILLY DILLON

The long hot summer is winding down and the new equipment season is getting started. Ping gets us going this fall with the release of their new K 15 line of clubs. The K 15 line has replaced the multi-material Rapture line of clubs, but at a much lower price. At first, the clubs appear similar to the G 15 line, even sporting the the same color scheme of red and silver. However, Ping is calling the K 15 line "game-improvement" and the G 15 is still considered "performance".

The new K 15 driver looks like a slightly flattened G15. The driver features patent pending Straight Flight Technology that utilizes an external weight pad that moves 10% of the clubhead's mass towards the heel. This weight placement provides a natural rotation

through impact. The weight pad is visible from the bottom but the design of the club hides the pad at address. The k15 driver




not only replaces the Rapture V2 but also the G15 Draw. If you want to hit it STRAIGHT, you gotta try the K15.Priced the same as the G15 while replacing the Rapture is sure to make this a popular club.

The K15 irons again look almost identical to the G15s but once again they are designed to help hit straight and as far as possible. Like the Rapture irons, the K15 features a titanium face for straight ball flight and maximum forgiveness. The next best thing about the K15 is the set comes WITH hybrids. The hybrids are available in a 3, 4, 5 or 6 and you can choose how many or few hybrids you want with the set (a standard 3 and 4 iron are not available). The K15 line will complement the G very nicely, and although it is targeted at the mid to high handicap, if you want

long and straight you gotta try them. Ruddo's Golf located in West OC and Lewes DE should have the K15 early September.

Golf is alive and well on Kent Island. Playing at the Blue Heron Golf Course in Stevensville, the Men's Senior League continues to draw many senior golfers of varying skill levels and experience. With membership now at 70 golfers, this senior league offers challenges for all skill levels. The front nine, developed in the 1960's, has small greens, a meandering stream, and some ponds to challenge every golfer. The small rounded greens certainly test the player's short game. Bigger greens as well as larger water features were built in 2002 as the back nine was developed. These larger, undulating greens demand that a player have a sharp eye and good putter.



GOLF FITNESS


In this article I want to take a closer look at shoulder injuries in golfers, especially the rotator cuff. The shoulder joint is the 4th most injured, after the elbow, wrist and lower back. The rotator cuff, made up of the SITS muscles (supraspinatus, infraspinatus, teres minor and subscapularis), is a



teres minor and subscapularis), is a DR. PETE ZEMO network of muscles and tendons that helps hold together the shoulder joint. These muscles grise from the scapula and


the shoulder joint. These muscles arise from the scapula and their tendons attach to the head of the humerus, forming a "cuff" at the shoulder joint. The shoulder is the most flexible joint in the body, capable of almost 1000 different movements. However, it possesses basic instability because its articulation point (the glenoid fossa of the scapula), is quite shallow. The rotator cuff muscles help "push" the humerus into the glenoid fossa to help maintain stability during arm movements such as elevation.

Injury to these muscles and tendons occur when they are overused and/or abused by ill-advised motions. I see these in the gym all the time. Common examples are people doing military presses from behind the neck or doing lat pulldowns to the area behind the neck. These can cause injury because the cuff is being stretched beyond its normal range while being "under load" from the weight that is being used. Injuries can be anything from mild strains to partial or complete tears of the muscles and tendons.



It is important to remember that as we age, ligaments and tendons lose elasticity and degeneration of bones and joints can occur (arthritis, bone spurs, etc.). As in any sport, injuries to joints can be minimized by utilizing proper technique (e.g. The golf swing), good warmup and muscle strengthening. For golfers, periodic tune up lessons from a professional can keep swing basics in good form. Rotator cuff exercises can be used to keep these muscles toned and strong. A session or two with an experienced trainer would apply here.

Remember, if and when an injury occurs, you cannot "work through it". Cessation of the provoking activity, rest of the joint and consultation with the appropriate medical authority, usually an orthopedist, should pertain.


By this time of the year most golfers have experienced the gamut of emotions that ebb and flow during competition. The roller-coaster ride of consciousness can wreak havoc on the confidence of even the most veteran athletes. Research has shown that confidence is the factor that most consistently distinguishes highly successful athletes from their lesser counterparts. The ability to gain and maintain confidence throughout the competitive season is a crucial determinant of skill acquisition and performance.

Psychological barriers often prevent athletes from maximizing their performances by affecting belief. Prior to Roger Bannister's landmark achievement of running a mile in less than four minutes, most claimed that the feat was impossible even though several milers were clocked with times of 4:02 and 4:01. Sport Psychologists were eager to point out that during the year after Bannister's accomplishment, at least 10 runners had broken the four-minute mark. Was it that everyone suddenly got faster? The most likely answer is that Bannister's peers observed the demolition of a self-imposed psychological limit which altered their expectations, and the new-found confidence resulted in improved performance.

Jack Nicklaus has been famously quoted for saying, "As long as I'm prepared, I always expect to win". It is this type of championship mindset, during practice and in competition, that allows our physical skills to mature and blossom. Our thoughts, how we feel and how we behave are interrelated. Understanding the power and necessity of confidence on the golf course and how to nurture it systematically will increase awareness, may lower your handicap and could lead to more enjoyable outings. And maybe when we are 70 we will be able to stick an uphill 100-foot putt just like the Golden Bear!





BAYSIDE HIGH SCHOOL GOLF

Maryland's High School golf season takes place in the fall primarily during the months of September and October. Coaches are permitted to begin practice on August 14, with the conclusion of the season marked by a three day state tournament which is held at the University of Maryland golf course in College Park just 9 weeks later. Thousands of high school golfers prepare their game for the ultimate test (State Tournament) in a very short season that sometimes presents three matches a week. Unfortunately, a golf match takes longer to complete than most high school competitions, so the diminishing length of daylight hours in the fall tends to restrict the duration of the season.

SPECIAL THANKS: The most important aspect of Bayside golf is having a venue to compete on. The conference is extremely fortunate to have the support of many local courses that welcome us to their facility and have a tremendous sense of pride that they are supporting junior golf and making a difference in the life of a kid. A special thank you goes out to everyone who helps make our season possible.

TEAMS ARE FORMED: High School programs near the center of the state in high population areas on average have no problem fielding a team of very talented golfers; simply due to the enormous pool of contestants which tryout for their team each year. Typically they hold two or three tryout rounds and the players who score the lowest averages make the team and the remainder are encouraged to try again next year. On the other hand, there are numerous schools in the more rural areas of Maryland, such as the Eastern Shore, that are often faced with the daunting task of having to actually recruit players, many of which have never even played golf before but may show promise. In fact, there are very few schools on the shore that have to make cuts during tryouts to reduce the number of players on the team.

MATCHESS In District 8, which is the entire eastern shore of Maryland and includes eighteen high schools, the region is divided in half forming the Bayside North and Bayside South Conferences. Each conference plays ten regular season matches in a "group" style format in which all nine schools participate at every match. Schools are allowed to bring five golfers to compete in the stroke play format in a total field of 45 golfers. At the conclusion of the round their scores are posted with the highest score out of the five from each team not counting. The remaining four lowest scores get added together for a total team score.

points for second place, three points for third place, etc.; which means that as the season progresses, the lower a schools' cumulative total points the higher they are ranked. A conference champion is announced at the end of the season and awarded a trophy

DISTINICIT MATCHE All eighteen Bayside schools are invited to participate in the District match, which is also the qualifier for who advances to the state tournament. Coaches are asked to bring their top 5 golfers to compete for not only the coveted District Champion trophy, but more importantly, for a chance to showcase their talents at the University of Maryland. However, this qualifier only permits a limited number of golfers to move on to the 'big show'. This year the District match will return to the beautiful River Marsh Golf Course in Cambridge, Maryland on October 7th. In the field of 90 golfers boys must shoot an 83 or better to advance and girls must score a 92 or better in order to qualify for the state tournament as an individual. In order for a team to qualify all four players and compete at the state tournament in the team category, the total team score must total 340 or lower. All four players of a qualifying team will also be competing in the individual category as well.

which is comprised of selected high school golf coaches from every district in the state meets and discusses aspects of the tournament such as location, dates, rules, and any changes that

should be made. Home field advantage in golf is huge compared to most other sports. Most sports are played on fields that have the same dimensions no matter where in the state you are competing. Golf courses throughout Maryland differ tremendously. Every match presents new challenges with different layouts, grass types, elevation changes, and other facets of course design. Eastern shore golfers primarily play on courses which are flat and every year the state tournament is played on courses which are extremely hilly. The suggestion to rotate the state venue from eastern shore, to centralized, to the western shore has been discussed several times, but unfortunately gets voted down. Even though hilly courses present new challenges for Bayside players, they still seem to persevere and do well at the state tournament. Congratulations to all the past players who have excelled at the state tournament and good luck to all 18 schools from District 8 this fall! It's September. Are you ready for some golf and football? Many of us enjoy the seasonal change and the traditional festivities of fall, including cheering on our favorite football teams. Golf and football offer ultimate contrasts in sport: team versus individual, contact vs non contact, adrenaline rush vs. adrenaline control are a few examples. Yet despite the obvious differences, there are lessons of the gridiron that will help your golf game.

The popularity of golf and football changed dramatically fifty years ago when Baltimore's John Unitas and Philadelphia's Norm Van Brocklin and Sonny Jurgensen filled the air with passes. The 2 minute drill was created and come from behind scoring rallies brought drama and excitement to football stadiums throughout the nation. At the same time, Arnold Palmer and Jack Nicklaus brought gridiron psychology of power and attack to golf. A stark contrast to the cerebral controlled style of the Hogan Era. Bold attacking play was the new way to play, and has remained imprinted in the minds of golfers to this day.

Are you ready to attack the golf course? Well, before you reach for your 460 cc with the urge to grip it and rip it, consider the purpose of the attack. Every hole you play is like the final drive of a championship game. Like the QB you want to make the winning score. The key to victory is choosing the right play, getting the ball to the right player, attacking the defense in its most vulnerable spot. So coach, who is the star player, or club, in your bag?

Knowing your shot making tendencies is the first step to "bold attacking" play. Football strategy seeks to get the ball in the "scoring zone". If a touchdown is needed the objective must be the end zone. But most often a close game is determined by the last minute field goal. In such cases, the task is to advance to the point at which your field goal kicker has a high probability of making the scoring kick. Golf presents a similar challenge.

When seeking to "attack the pin" you want to go to "your best shot". Tournament players often want a "football" field length approach of 100 yards, with the expectation and probability a wedge shot will be close enough to make a one putt. This is not a standard true for all players. Inconsistent distance control on shots 100 yards or less is a common challenge. Determining your personal "attacking distance" is essential. If you are just as likely to hit a 7 iron on the green from 140 yards as a wedge from 100, you can play a shorter and often easier approach from tee or fairway to your "scoring zone", then attack with confidence. Don't add to the pressure of forcing an approach as close to the green as possible. Like the football coach you just need to get close enough to make the scoring play.
