BIRTHPLACE? & HOMETOWN? Lancaster, PA WHO INTRODUCED YOU TO GOLF? WHAT AGE? My dad, 10th birthday. HIGH SCHOOL SPORTS? Soccer, baseball, golf GOLFING HIGHLIGHTS? Summer before 10th grade: I dropped my handicap 15 strokes in that summer. First broke par at 17. Shot 2 under 70. Won 4 tournaments during my senior high school golf season. Have been a scratch golfer since the age of 19 Shot 69 in 2006 us open qualifying but got beat in a 4 hole playoff. Had unofficial course record of 64 at a course down in Florida for a couple months. Won 2011 Club Championship at OCGC. Won by 7 shooting 72-70. CAREER HIGHLIGHTS? Graduated with honors from college and was named MVP in my college. Got married 4 ½ months after I met my wife. FAVORITE FOOD? Picking Crabs, pizza, calzones, strombolis. My wife also makes a fantastic butterball turkey breast in the crock pot . FAVORITE BOOK? The bible. FAVORITE FOOTBALL TEAM? Big Blue. HOW BOUT DEM COWBOYS!!!! FAVORITE TV SHOWS? The Office, Pawn Stars, Royal Pains, Sportscenter, Dog the Bounty Hunter, CSI Miami just to name a few. Hobbies? Golf, Jet ski, Water skiing, watching movies, Lazy days. FAVORITE GOLF COURSE? Lancaster Country Club, Bay Hill Club and Lodge, Lighthouse Sound, Orange County National Golf Center and Lodge, Bay Creek. FAMILY? Wife- Chasity of just over a year. Daughter- Lilliana Grace was born this year. WHERE DO YOU SEE YOURSELF IN 10 YEARS? Wherever God leads me but I love this area and I hope to have a house here and in West Palm beach, Fl. I would like to be a member at a few courses around here and down in Fl. Whatever job I have, I pray I will have enough money to afford these things and provide for my family. We want to have more kids as well so hopefully we will have some more little golfers running around. I also would like be able to go on missions trips as well. Anything PEOPLE DON'T KNOW ABOUT YOU? I wish I was sponsored by Nike. I always say that I am the only person that has head to toe nike but doesn't get paid. I have moved 14 times since I was 13. I have lived in PA, MD, FI, AZ. I have never had a hole-in-one but I have holed out for eagle on par 4s about half a dozen times. I have a degree in Professional Golf Management. Jim Furyk grew up 20 minutes from where I grew up. I have never traveled outside the continental USA but I would love to for golf and pleasure. I put crazy food combinations together but the always turn out great. For example: I will make scrambled eggs but put cheese, ranch, taco bell sauce, and bbq sauce in it. My wife hates the smell when it's cooking but it is honestly delicious.



It is hard for me to narrow down to just one golf story so I have two. The time I shot 69 in the US open qualifying and my career low of 64. In 2006 at the US open qualifying at MetroWest GC in Orlando, FL I made the turn in 1 over. I remembered the year before, a guy in my group said at the turn "I'm on the wrong side of par." He went on to shoot 4 under on the back and move on to sectional qualifying. I said the same thing and birdied my first 3 holes on the back to get to 2 under. I made par on the next few holes and I come to 17 and make a 20 footer to go to 3 under. On 18, I left my birdie putt on the lip and posted 69. That was only good enough for a playoff. 7 guys for 3 spots. 2 spots were taken on the first hole and after we all played, it ended up being 4 of us for 1 spot. One guy was Matt Borchert who played on the PGA Tour a couple years ago and Sam Saunders who is Arnold Palmers grandson. We made pars on the next 2 holes and then Sam holed a 30 footer for birdie on the 4th hole. He was very kind and gracious just like his grandpa who I had the fortune of meeting just a couple months previously. It didn't turn out how I hoped but it taught me that I can hang with anyone and can handle big time pressure.

When I shot 64, that was cool. I really don't remember much of the round. I was just in the zone. It was at a course called Diamond Players Club in Clermont, FL but it is now called Sanctuary Ridge. I was even through 6 but then I eagled 7 and birdied nine to turn in 3 under 32. I think I birdied 6 of 7 holes at some point. I was hitting shots to a foot and making long putts. It was one of those days where I could see the break and the line of the putt before I hit the putt. Just like in the Tiger Woods video game only in real life. I came to 18 8 under and I knew I was. I hooked my drive in the bunker and drew a bad lie. I made bogey and ended with a 7 under 64. I learned later that was a tied course record but it got beat a couple months later. Needless to say, I won all the money that day.

WHY I LOVE PLAYING TOUR ON THE SHORE.

I enjoy playing on the tour because I love competition. The guys I play against like to have fun but are also competitive. You have to play well to win. I also like the courses down here. I wasn't sure where I was going to play tournament golf when I moved down here. I am thankful to Bob Beckleman for telling me about the tour.




WHY I LOVE PLAYING TOUR ON THE SHORE.



IT'S A GAME OF RESPECT.

Golf has been around for a few centuries now. Technology has brought about many changes to the game, however, there are still many aspects about the game that have endured since Mary Queen of Scots began knocking the little ball around the links. One of the most important features of our great sport that has endured

is the idea of respect.

When is the last time you saw a baseball player arguing with an umpire? How about a football or basketball coach yelling at the referee? You probably don't have to think too hard to come up with that image. When is the last time you saw a professional golfer arguing with a rules official? It is a rare event if it happens. It's all about respect!

When you walk onto the first tee and stick a tee into the ground, you bring with you the tradition of respect. The Rules of Golf begin with Etiquette for a reason, respect for your fellow golfers. Respect for the course. Respect for rules. Respect for the game and traditions.

When you take divots, make ball marks on the green, make footprints in the sand, you repair your damage done to the course so that the others playing behind you have the same opportunity for a good lie that you had. You call penalties on yourself so that your fellow competitors have a fair opportunity to compete with their acquired skills over yours. If you are not keeping up your pace of play, you are affecting the enjoyment of others who happen to be playing behind you. If the course marshal informs you that you are behind, guess what? You are probably behind. Out of respect for others, you should do your best to get caught up. Being on time for your tee-time will help everyone behind you tee off

at their scheduled tee-time. On a busy day, if you are late, it has an effect on the rest of the day.

Respect for the course means that you do as little damage as possible while playing, for the same reason. When the cart sign points for you to leave the fairway for the cart path, you do so to minimize the damage done as the carts begin to congregate near the green. When it is cart path only, there is a reason for that. Too much damage would be done to the course that would make it less appealing and leave the possibility of players behind you getting a bad lie in the ruts left behind by your cart.

The USGA has a saying "If you're not playing by the Rules of Golf, you're not playing golf!" Respect for the rules means counting all of your strokes, penalties, carrying fourteen or less clubs and posting your scores for handicap accurately. There is a noose hanging in a tree near the first hole of a course down in Florida. Sandbaggers beware!

Respect for the game and traditions may seem a bit snobby or meaningless to some people. It is however, one of the most important aspects of the game that we can teach others. It is the reason that you don't see our players arguing with officials. You don't see the parents at junior events acting worse than the children like you see at little league games. It teaches children that you can deal with the difficulties and unfairness in life with persistence, calmness and perseverance instead of tantrums and cheating.

While we may see others not quite living up to the standards of respect that the game of golf brings with it, we should do our best to teach it to them and the new people coming into the game. If we do this, our great game can continue to be a game of respect.



Billy Casper had 51 PGA Tour wins in his career, placing him seventh on the all time list. He won 3 major championships: the 1959 and 1966 U.S. Opens, and the 1970 Masters Tournament. He was a member of the United States team in the Ryder Cup 8 times in 1961, 1963, 1965, 1967, 1969, 1971, 1973, 1975, and a nonplaying captain in 1979. Casper has scored the most points in the Ryder Cup by an American player.

On the senior circuit, Casper earned nine Senior PGA Tour (now the Champions Tour) wins from 1982 to 1989, including two senior majors. Casper was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame in 1978.





It wasn't even close. Steve Wheatcroft eagled the final hole to polish off his first career win in record-setting fashion at the Melwood Prince George's County Open. The 33-year old Indiana University grad shot a final round 7-under 64 and lapped the field by a Nationwide Tour-record 12 strokes.

Wheatcroft finished at 29-under par and splattered his name all over the record book while picking up a first-place check for \$108,000, which moved him from No. 32 to No. 2 on the season money list.

"I'm absolutely over-the-top ecstatic. I've been out here for five years and never won," he said. "I wanted to make that next step and I wanted to do it in a big way."

It wasn't big, it was huge. The list of his accomplishments would take several pages but perhaps the most impressive was his score of 255, the lowest 72-hole total in the 22-year history of the Nationwide Tour. The old mark of 258 was set by Chris Smith at the 1997 Omaha Classic and later matched by Daniel Chopra at the 2004 Henrico County Open.

The Pennsylvania native moved to the front with his 10-under 61 in the second round and never turned around to see who was following. He set Tour records for the largest 36-hole lead (seven) and the largest 54-hole lead (eight) before slamming the door in Sunday's finale.

"The first time I felt really safe was on 14 green on Sunday. I probably had 18 feet left for par," he said. "That was a huge boost for me. Fourteen and 15 are nasty holes if you don't get it in play and things can change. You give one or two back and it shrinks and all of a sudden everyone's thinking they have a shot."

They were wrong. Wheatcroft kept the pressure and closed with a 5-foot birdie at No. 15, two-putted for birdie from 40 feet at No. 16 and then finished with a flourish.

"I wanted to go out with a bang," he said. "I'm kind of a tv ham and the 18th green on Sunday is about as good as you're going to get."

Wheatcroft rolled in the eagle from 20 feet to finish off the week but the celebration will have to wait. He will join fellow pros and amateurs on Monday as they try to qualify for the U.S. Open, which will be played about 30 minutes away at Congressional Country Club.

SHORE UP WITH THE GAME COACH

CARSON LOVETT, MA, SPORT PSYCHOLOGY

The feedback we receive from our performance is a critical component in the skill development process. The amount of time spent practicing and competing during a season of golf provides ample opportunities for the athlete to examine, evaluate and make adjustments to his or her golf game. As we attempt to apply all that we have learned and benefit from our dedication to detail, researchers have warned golfers to beware of the phenomenon known as "Analysis Paralysis".

It has been a long-standing belief in the world of golf that focusing on correcting mechanics during competition can have a detrimental effect on performance. A team of scientists from Great Britain and the United States studying a group of eighty golfers found that those who spent their time between shots engaging in activities unrelated to the outcome of the previous stroke outperformed those who verbalized between shots concerning the specifics of their putting. The results showed the greatest effect among skilled golfers who discussed technique for five minutes before attempting another putt. Novices were unaffected, presumably because of their low baseline performances.

The team of investigators explained "Analysis Paralysis" as a function of Verbal Overshadowing, which triggers the brain to focus much of its attentive capacity to language centers instead of the regions within the brain that support the required skill. It seems that the self-talk process of breaking down the stroke activates areas of the brain that deprive target centers of necessary stimulation. The findings suggest that self-analysis serves skilled golfers best during practice sessions when shaping routine. During competition the advantage may go to the golfer who keeps in-depth cognition at bay.

It so happens that as I am writing this article it is also the final day for our beloved visionary and President, Dr. Thelma B. Thompson. I personally cannot thank President Thompson enough for her efforts in bringing the PGA Golf Management Program to the Eastern Shore and to UMES. Her support of this program, I believe is unequalled by any of the other nineteen university presidents that have the privilege of offering such a unique curriculum. Although many UMES personnel played a part in the programs creation, make no mistake about it, the PGA Golf Management Program is Dr. Thompson's vision.

She tells the story of when she was going through the interview process for the Presidency and the first time that she saw the UMES campus. "It looked like a golf resort to me", she stated. Dr. Thompson always understood that golf is a vehicle for business. All she really wanted for UMES students was to have an opportunity to learn the basics of the game so that when they entered the real world and were invited to play in corporate retreats, charity events, or any other type of tournament they wouldn't have to sit on the sidelines.

Enter Marshall Cropper, UMES alum and Hall of Famer. President Thompson entrusted Cropper to make sure that her vision of golf at UMES would become a reality. Cropper, as he says "begged, borrowed, and stole" whatever he could get his hands on to make the UMES Golf Academy a student friendly amenity. As the story goes, a local reporter came to UMES to do a story on golf at UMES and the Associated Press picked up the story and reprinted it. The AP copy ended up in Florida on the desk of Earnie Ellison, who handles diversity issues for the PGA of America. Ellison called President Thompson about UMES and the impact that golf has on the campus. Ellison then visited the campus and the idea of bringing the PGA Golf Management Program to UMES was born.

Approximately five to six years and close to 60 students later, UMES is on the verge of graduating the first cohort of PGA Golf Management students. A lot of people were skeptical and said it couldn't be done at a small historically black university on the lower Eastern Shore, but President Thompson never wavered in her belief that this is the right university at the right time. Apparently she was right and the largest sporting association in the world, the PGA of America, agreed with her.

I truly only had one opportunity to spend a few minutes alone with President Thompson. We were on a PGA trip in Florida and we had a few minutes by ourselves in the lobby of the hotel in Palm Beach. I tried to make some small talk with her, but she quickly started talking golf and education with me. This was the moment when I truly felt her passion for this program and how much it means to her.

Dr. Thompson, you mean a lot to the students and all faculty that are associated with this program. We appreciate your relentlessness, passion, and vision. You will be missed.



'Tee it 4ward"

"Tee it forward?" What the heck? The golf legend Jack Nicklaus has already endorsed and is now promoting along with the PGA and USGA the national golf initiative, "Tee It Forward", which affords golfers to play from a distance based on how far they can accurately stroke it off the tee. Did you get that? What a novel concept? That kind of makes



Seriously, this has been a long time coming. The PGA initiative "Tee It Forward" is a great concept which I believe will be embraced by all skill types of golfers. The fact that having it supported by the Golden Bear makes it clear that the golf industry is finally awake from its hibernation and beginning to move off of some of its archaic concepts to realize that golf is actually played by all levels of golfers. Those courses around the nation that are not only long, but very challenging and difficult, where the average player frequently loses fifty balls, shoots a one-eighty, and finishes in seven and one-half hours, are no longer appealing to the casual golfer. The "one-size fits all" model has become an antiquated concept and now has become pertinent that courses allow for the option of multiple tees and intelligent layouts so that they challenge the best of players, yet allow beginners to grow into the game, and furthermore, allow the more limited shorter ball hitters and the casual golfer to fully enjoy the game experience without compromising the overall design of the course. I've been preaching this for years. Golfers should have the availability and comfort to play from the set of tees that suits their ability.

At the Deer Run Golf Club, located in Berlin Maryland, we have always supported golf for enjoyment. 









Looking for that mysterious swing plane? Here is a drill that just may help you get in line! Address the ball normally then take your right hand off of the club. You are now holding the club with only your left hand. Take the club back with your left hand only to the top of your swing. Stop at the top of the swing, place your right hand on the club and turn your core or your belt buckle, back to your target. I usually see people get off plane when they start the down swing with their right hand from the top causing the club to reroute into an over the top move. This practice will help you stay in the slot! Normally your non-dominant hand will not be strong enough to take the club off of plane. Now you know the drill!

GOLF FITNESS - STRETCHES



I have been asked numerous times to review some proper stretches before playing. The ideal situation, if you have the time, is to do stretches after a little light cardio – rapid walking or jogging to warm your muscles up, followed by some progressives stretching. Here is a good sequence:

Neck stretches – neck flexion followed by side to side neck stretches, all done gently.


Shoulder stretches – holding you arm across your chest and pulling gently on your elbow for posterior muscles. Holding a club behind your back with arms straight and lifting arms away from back for anterior shoulder.

Back stretches— moving upper body side to side while facing forward to work lateral muscles. Follow this by toe touches to stretch lower back. Remember, only go to point where you can feel the stretch. There should be no pain involved. Follow this with trunk rotation to complete back stretches.

Leg stretches - these should cover the hamstrings, quads and calves. There are multiple ways to do these. Hamstrings can be done by placing your straight leg on a bench or chair and bending forward. Quads are best done by grasping your ankle while steadying your upper body on the wall or a chair, then pulling up on your ankle to stretch the anterior upper leg. Calves are done by bending forward with your leg straight while keeping your foot completely on the ground.

If you can find a resource that shows pictures of these stretches, it will help a lot, especially if you are not familiar with stretching. The other option is to talk to a trainer at your gym or go to an aerobic class that concentrates on stretching. After you have completed stretches, you can move to the practice area to hit balls prior to your actual golf round








Everyone has bad days. For Rory McIlroy, April 10th qualified. Just nine holes away from his first major golf championship, "the Green Jacket" and golf superstardom, he suffered an epic meltdown at The Masters. Just as all seemed well, he made the turn on that beautiful day and his day turned abruptly for the worse; missed fairways and greens coupled with putts, which only a short time before rolled beautifully in the hole, were way off there mark. A big lead turned into a bitter loss as the entire golf world watched.

Shortly after, Rory called his dad, Gerry, who worked three jobs so his son could pursue his golf dreams. Rory told him not to worry; that he was fine, that what the world saw was merely a bad day. He did not drastically overhaul his swing or change his clubs or caddie. His calmness extended to how he approached his game going forward. He began preparing for the U.S. Open in June the same way he did other tournaments.

In the end, the 22 year-old McIlroy did not just stay the course, he conquered the course. He shot a U.S. Open record 16-under par at storied Congressional, capping the title on Father's Day, with Rory sharing the special moment with Gerry shortly after he walked off the 18th green, victorious.

Lately, investors have experienced their own bad days, with the markets of both Europe and here at home in disarray. Debt ceiling squabbles in Congress, high unemployment figures, European economies and banks stressed. Some may be compelled to do something with their investment portfolio, to change course for merely the sake of change.

History however tells us a different story. "Stormy days" such as those we are seeing currently in the markets of the world are more commonplace than we might imagine. Historically, some type of "crisis" has occurred causing market unrest nearly every 3 to 4 years. So, our advice in times like these is, consider Rory's reaction to his "stormy day" at Augusta and not to react in a fit of emotion. Sound investment plans and especially portfolios of those needing income from their hard earned money in retirement should be designed to weather these "stormy days". Abraham Lincoln once said "Its not a matter of the days in your life, it's a matter of life in your days" and sound investment planning should be constructed with a long-range view in mind providing you a calm shelter when these "storms" occur. With life expectancies reaching well into our 80's investors and especially those currently retired, should know, we will most likely have more years on the golf course than we had in our career. YOUR PATH TO PAR Richard Robinson-Instructor The Original Golf School



What is the favorite aspect of your golf game? Driving for distance, accurate approaches, pitching, chipping, putting? It is a rare golfer who is satisfied with their current game. Everyone sees potential for improvement. Even the all time great tournament stars strive to be better. Yet, an honest appreciation for what you do best is the foundation for building a better game.

Golf provides a unique mix of physical, mental, emotional, and social challenges. We may play the game with others, compete and compare scores against others, but in the end, the game we play and the rewards it affords are our own. How you find enjoyment in the game is the foundation of your personal golfing style. Understanding your style is a key to enhancing your enjoyment of the game.

Your style may be athletic or technical, powerful or precise, intuitive or cerebral. Your style can be altered by improved skill, fitness, and understanding of the game. But the way you are currently playing, your "now" game, is the one that counts to play well today and improve in the future.

Golf is a game of efficiency. The fewer strokes taken the better. The challenge is to find your best path from tee to green and into the hole. If you like to bomb it off the tee, go for the gusto. Just be prepared to play less macho recovery shots. If accuracy is your game, maintain your discipline and avoid the temptation to occasionally press for distance, which will most likely destroy your balance and tempo. If your drive is a bad show but you pitch, chip and putt for dough, then relax off the tee. Hit clubs that get you in play and to the green consistently. Just because par allows for two putts per green, does not mean you have to take them. Who cares if you take three to get on the par fours, if you knock your first putt in the hole.

Paul Runyan, known as "Little Poison", was a diminutive man with incredible putting skills. His victory in the 1938 PGA over Sam Snead remains the most lopsided victory in PGA match play history. In the 1934 US Open at Merion, Runyan could not drive to the fairway from the final hole championship tee. Playing to his strength, Runyan pitched from the back tee to the most forward tee. A fairway wood, iron approach, and one putt was his path to par. In 1950, Ben Hogan's classic 1 iron approach to the same hole lead to a par and the US Open championship. Two different ways to the same score.

If you play all aspects well, but are seeking to do better on longer and more difficult courses, commit to learning better technique and improving fitness. 



AUCTION & GOLF GALORE





So far, my reviews have been on cigars that tend to be in the full-bodied flavor range. Having enjoyed cigars for many years, I lean in that direction for my smoking enjoyment. Knowing that people enjoy cigars that are more on the mild side, I went with a milder cigar for this review.

Romeo y Julieta is a brand from the Dominican Republic that has been consistently a favorite choice of mine when I want a mild cigar, with flavor and at a reasonable price. Having visited their factory in La Romana, I was very impressed with their quality control. Their Vintage series is great cigar for the golf course.

On The Range

I went with the natural cigar that had the blonde Ecuadorian Connecticut shade wrapper. It was a little bit veiny but otherwise very appealing in appearance and a hint of nuts in the aroma. It comes with a Mexican binder and Dominican filler tobaccos. I was looking forward to firing it up.

Front Nine


Right from the start it was smooth and creamy. The draw was consistent without any resistance yet it wasn't like sucking through an open straw either. The flavor starts building rather subtly, which is very nice for a cigar early in the round. This is also nice if you're playing an early morning round a still want to light one up.

Back Nine

For a full-bodied enthusiast, I was hoping the flavor would build a little faster but that wasn't a realistic expectation. I regained my patience and began to enjoy the fact that this was really good mellow smoke and it blended well with the late day round of golf I was playing. We weren't in a hurry to finish and the smoke was relaxing. By the end of the cigar I realized I needed a few more of these in my humidor.







TOOLS OF THE TRADE

THROWING DARTS

Each time I start working with a new student I ask them what they hope to accomplish by taking instruction. Inevitably the first response is that they are looking for more distance. But every once in a while you get that dream come true as the student states that they would like to be more consistent. One of the most common hurdles that instructors face is a student that tries to hit the golf ball too hard. They try to generate more club head speed with their arms from the top of the swing to gain distance. In reality, distance comes mainly from other factors. Proper weight transfer, centeredness of hit, solid rhythm and balance are the main factors that lead to more distance. Coincidently, they also lead to swinging easier and swinging easier will make you a more consistent ball striker. I like to compare the speed of the golf swing to the serve of the tennis ball, but not the first serve. It is more like the second serve after a fault. The first serve is meant to make an ace, while the second serve is meant to get the ball in play. It is hit much easier for accuracy. It is also much like the game of darts. You probably wouldn't throw a dart as hard as you can when standing at the line if you wanted to be accurate. You would make a smooth throwing motion and stay in balance. So when the main focus in golf is how accurate you can be, swing at about 75% of your

power and stay in balance. When you watch a professional hit a golf shot, they make it look effortless and their distance seems unbelievable. The simple truth is the professional can swing much harder than they do while



staying in balance; they just tone it back to about 75-85%. Here is what you can do to become more accurate. Try hitting one more club into your target. If your next shot is in your 8 iron range, hit a 7 iron and swing easier and in balance. Most players rarely hit the ball past the hole on any given shot on the golf course. If they are in their "8" iron range, the shot may call for an absolutely perfectly struck 8 iron. I believe it was Ben Hogan that said he only hit 3 shots per round that flew exactly as he intended. And after all of these years he is still the moniker of the perfect golf swing. My father used to joke that at least 95% of short shots don't go in. I think the percentage is a little higher, but I am glad he always stressed that point to me. So if you would like to start throwing darts on the golf course take at least one more club and swing easier. Learning to swing in balance will certainly help you become a better ball striker and over time you will gain more distance.




