Sam Jung of Chantilly, Va., earned his first AJGA championship after defeating Kyle Suppa of Honolulu, Hawaii, in a fourhole playoff. Ana Paula Ramirez of Pachuca, Mexico, won in the Girls Division after a sudden-death playoff with Madeline Chou of Santa Ana, Calif., at Talbot Country Club. Conducted by the American Junior Golf Association, the Junior All-Star at Talbot was a 54-hole stroke play competition played on the par—72 course at Talbot Country

Club. The event featured 72 boys and 24 girls, ages 12-15, from 22 states and three countries. The Boys Division played the course at 6,623 yards while the Girls Division played the course at 5,819 yards. The Junior All-Star at Talbot is one of 12 events in the Gary Gilchrist Golf Academy Junior All-Star Series. Specifically designed for boys and girls ages 12-15, the Gary Gilchrist Golf Academy Junior All-Star Series presents opportunities for younger players to develop their skills and earn entry into AJGA Open tournaments. The Series concludes with the Nike Golf Junior All-Star

Invitational over Columbus Day weekend for winners and top finishers in Gary Gilchrist Golf Academy Junior All-Star Series events. Jung completed his final round with a 7-over-par 79 to put him at an even-par 216 tournament total. Meanwhile, Chou tallied a 5-over-par 77, which put them each a 4-over-par 220 tournament total. Both players made par on the first hole of the playoff. On the second hole, both of their approach shots landed 15 feet from the hole. Chou narrowly missed the putt while Ramirez 's ball dropped for birdie.

"It means a lot to win because it took a lot of effort to get here," Ramirez said. "It's amazing because the competition plays so well." Chou finished in second with a 4-over-par 220 tournament total. Allyson Geer of Brighton, Mich., claimed third with a 224 tournament total.

STRENGTH & FLEXIBILITY!

DR. PETE ZEMO

At our Fitness Center I get many questions about golf and back pain. That seems to be one of the most common problems people have associated with the game, so I thought it appropriate to review some things.

The most common cause seems to be poor swing, which stresses the spine and back muscles during the rotational motions of the swing. This is magnified with those golfers who have poor flexibility and/or inadequate back muscle strength. I have talked about these factors before, if you recall my articles on yoga and pilates. These should be practiced by any serious golfers as they are some of the best ways to strengthen the core and improve flexibility. One should also work on exercises that target back muscles. If you have any weight training experience, the classic exercises are rowing, which can be done with weights, machines or rubber tubing, as well as pull downs (known in the gym as lat pulldowns). Also, you should incorporate back flexion/extension exercises which help target the paravertebral muscles (the one running up and down parallel to the spinal column). None of these take much time and should be done two or three times a week, not on consecutive days.



When you go out to play the game, remember to warm up your body by doing simple stretching exercises that focus on your shoulders, back, and legs. If time permits, going to the driving range and hitting some balls before you play will go a long way to getting you loose and minimizing muscle injury. Following these parameters should greatly reduce the chance that you are prevented from playing by back pain. Again, if you are not sure about how to accomplish some of these things, a brief conversation with a trainer at the gym will get you on the right track. It will only take a few minutes of instruction but could save you hours of pain.

On tour recently, a golfer bemoans the pressure generated by his playing partner hitting three consecutive birdies, and the worry associated with falling out of contention causes a loss of focus; he shanks the final three drives of the tournament and enters the clubhouse depressed, questioning his game plan and chance to succeed. Another golfer approaches and proposes, "just relax out there and you'll play better." Fantastic advice, but easier said than done. The noble suggestion requires paying equal, if not more attention to the mental aspect of the game than swing mechanics and ball striking; to do so, researchers recommend two critical shifts: Develop a greater understanding of the anatomy of relaxation, and practice under pressure.

Psychological stress during the performance of an athletic task can manifest into physical symptoms like muscle tension, elevated heart rate, shallow breathing and increased blood pressure, any one of which may lead to higher stress levels, distracting concentration all the more. World-class athletes learn to feel with their mind's eye instead of merely seeing

the competitive setting by habituating imagery into each practice session, providing sensory-specific intelligence the unconscious mind absorbs, integrates and recalls on demand.

Golfers at every level of skill acquisition will confirm, "Practice does not make perfect; practice makes permanent." Entering more tournaments with dreams of acquiring the necessary aptitude through experience will eventually improve the odds of winning ONCE. However, if consistency is a goal, proper mental preparation may alleviate hours, weeks, and years of inner turmoil while transforming the relationship between pressure and competition into a championship formula.





ROLLING IT

Have you ever watched golf on television and wondered why it seems that the pros putts lip in instead of lip out? It's all in how you roll the ball. Now you would think that a ball rolling is a ball rolling. But, there is a difference and this is probably one of the best lessons in putting I was ever given. A ball that is rolling true will work its way over the inconsistencies in the turf like it is on a mission to get to the hole. It has a better chance of staying on track.



All putts will start out with a little bit of skid. To roll the ball you want the putt to start out with as little skid as possible. To do this you need to have smooth acceleration through the impact zone. In order to have smooth acceleration, you need a smooth transition, or change of directions. In order to have a smooth transition, you need a smooth take-away. So how you start the stroke is very important.

Two drills will help you to get the feel for rolling the putt. First, if you have a putter with a flat spot on the back, you place a nickel on the putter and try to make a stroke where the coin stays on the putter instead of sliding off during the transition. This will help you to get a feel for a more smooth motion. Second, take some range balls that have stripes on the ball or add a thin stripe with a marker on your own ball. Set the ball on the green with the stripe in alignment to your target. Practice rolling the ball until you see the stripe appear as a thin line while it rolls towards the hole. If you are hitting the ball instead of rolling it, it will appear wider and wobbly. You probably have noticed that most pros have a line marked on their ball. Now you know why. It helps with alignment and the visualization of rolling the ball.

PRAUTICE PEREECT PULTING POSTURE POOR PERFORMANCE

7EVEN P'S

We have all heard about how important posture and alignment is in the full swing. But have you given thought to how important posture is during your putting stroke? Poor posture can be the main reason you are not making putts. A common fault I see is when players slouch and "lock" their knees. Knees should have a slight flex to allow the weight to stay balanced predominantly in the toes or balls of the feet. If you lock your knees the weight goes to the heels and causes you to "come out" of your putting stroke and not hit the putter on the sweet spot. This causes the putt to be off line and usually makes it difficult to get the speed right. Make sure you "Practice Perfect Putting Posture to Prevent Poor Performance! Now you know the drill!





2013 Middle Atlantic PGA Professional Championship







PGA Golf Management Program readies for a busy semester


As the sixth cohort enters UMES they will be met with numerous demands on their time, not to mention their regular classes. These freshmen must assimilate to college life and very quickly learn the importance of time management. These students are enrolled in fifteen credit hours of course work and then must meet their program requirements. "A few semesters ago the leaders of the PGA Golf Management Student Association (PGMSA) decided to model their program requirements after the PGA of America, where they must earn continuing education credits, better known as MSR points. It is the job of the PGMSA Secretary to record all earned points", said Chris Prosser, Internship Coordinator.

Students earn Program MSR points (per semester) by:

- Attending at least 3 PGMSA meetings (4)per semester
- Participation in at least four (of 8) PGMSA Tournaments
- Attempt or pass the PGA Playing (1)Ability Test
- Attend Player Development if (2)PAT not passed
- Attend guest speaker presentations
- Attending Middle Atlantic PGA Section (1)meeting
- Participate in outside tournaments (PGA's Jones Cup, Carolinas Cup, Mason-Dixon Line Challenge)
- Complete (1)Community Service projects
- Conduct Play Golf America initiative programs

"Everything is basically worth one point and each student must earn at least 10 points per semester", added Prosser. "It keeps the students involved in something that they love, keeps them engaged with program, and shows the importance of personal growth and community service, which is something that all PGA of America members do on a daily basis".set-up and run this tournament, so players are treated special, it's awesome", said Mike Veverka, UMES student. The competition was held on the Wannamaker Course that played approximately 6900 yards and a par of 72. Veverka tied for 5th overall with a three round total of 73-73-72=218. The tournament also includes a Championship Welcome Dinner where Blanco was awarded the 2013 Joe Stewart/Earnie Ellison Scholarship for \$1000.00. UMES student, Jon Seward, passed the required PGA Playing Ability Test while competing at the PGA Minority Championship. Seward said "It was great to come down here and play well enough to pass the PAT, now I can focus on my studies and work on becoming a better player".

Prosser added, "It has been a really good finish to semester that didn't produce a lot of playing time for the students. We started with a strong showing at the PGA Merchandise Show, had a second place finisher at the Carolinas Cup, a top five finisher at the PGA Minority Championship, two scholarship winners, and two students conquered the Playing Ability Test. This shows that we have some really good students and the University and program are better for having them."





"This Little Piggy went the distance"

When someone inquires about golf lessons I always ask, "What is it you would like to accomplish during your lesson?" The response is about 50-50 on either more distance or more consistency. I am going to explain how you can have your cake and eat it too! Here is a great drill to train your body how to use the strongest joint in your body to hit the golf ball effortlessly. Address the ball as you do normally. Raise the toes on your trailing foot off of the ground about 3 or 4 inches. Place a tee in the ground under your big toe or the ball joint on your big toe. Pretend like you toe is resting on the tee like a ball. Start your back swing keeping your leg motion extremely quiet until the club gets parallel to the ground then stop your swing in that position. The next motion is to turn your hips back and step the tee into the ground to load that joint of your foot with the majority of your weight as the club gets to the top. Stop at the




top and feel the weight loaded on your back foot. Now push off of that joint towards your target letting your arms drop to the inside as your body rotates fully to the target. What you will get is effortless distance and accuracy. The easiest way to attain both distance and accuracy is to predominantly use your legs to initiate the down swing of the golf club. Most people struggle by using the arms to initiate the downswing causing a slice or an outside to inside club path through impact. If you can learn to use your legs properly you will have no trouble getting to your left side during impact and your belt buckle with get to the target easier allowing you to become more accurate.













WHILE WE'RE YOUNG

They surely must be kidding with us? My suggestion would be to FIX their own house before they start preaching to the golf world!! If you think that's bad, how about this scene from a recent PGA Tour event. Due to heavy rains earlier in the week, golfers had to lift, clean and place. Player A hits it in the right trees; Player B hits it in the fairway. After an extensive search, Player A's ball is found. They then move the crowd, discuss the shot with the caddy, compute the yardage 5 times and finally chip it back out in the fairway. Here's the best part; the camera switches to Player B, who hasn't even lifted, cleaned or placed his ball. If we all followed the playing pace of the PGA Tour, we would have 6 hour rounds and that's just not acceptable! So before the PGA of America starts to try and get us to speed up play, why don't they send the message to all the professional tours? It seems like they are saying, "Do what we say, not what our tour professionals do." In my life experience that sort of leadership never works out really well.








