RAY TARANTO OF EASTERN SHORE GOLF MAGAZINE CELEBRATING 8 YEARS OF UNITING GOLF ON THE SHORE

If you have worked with Ray Taranto, you surely know that he puts his whole heart into everything he does. He is a great family man with a great passion for his work. If you ask him what the most important aspect of business is, he will give you one simple answer. "Great relationships!"

Ray was born on July 15, 1969 in Silver Spring, Maryland to Mother Helga and father John. Growing up with his brothers Ellis and Tony and sister Christy, Ray always had an intense passion for the world of sports. His father worked in the Government Printing Office which exposed him to the vast world of the printing industry. He also credits his mother and her incredible work ethic for setting the standard for his determination.

When Ray was 18, his father and brother invited him to play in a charity golf event where he fell in love with the game. Many years later he suffered the sudden loss of his dear friend and business partner Kenneth Kertesz. After Kenny's passing, the real estate market took an awful

turn and Ray lost everything. It was the toughest two years of his life full of tears and heartbreak. After being knocked down, Ray staggered back onto his feet and decided to move his young family (wife Holly, Bryce (3) and Blaine (2)) to the Eastern Shore to start over. Working three jobs to try and make ends meet, he found his first golf related job in 2006 as an Assistant Golf Professional under Steve Reeves at Ocean Pines Golf & Country Club. Ray then accepted a position as the Pro Shop Manager at The Bay Club under PGA Professional, Rob Bailey. It was there that Ray had the idea to grow the game by uniting the golf organizations, players and courses of the Eastern Shore providing an outlet where everyone could stay connected.

He published the first edition of Eastern Shore Golf Magazine in the fall of 2008. The same year, Ray founded the Tour on the Shore, an amateur golf series which hosts players of all ability levels to compete at incredible courses all around the Eastern Shore. The Tour has grown from a 2 day

championship to a 22 event series with a 2 day championship. The Tour on the Shore has turned in over 5000 rounds and generated over 1 Million Dollars in revenue for golf on the Eastern Shore. More importantly, it has forged some absolutely amazing relationships and unified the golf scene on the Shore.

After meeting some of the most outstanding people in the golf business, Ray founded the Eastern Shore Golf Hall of Fame in 2010 which honors individuals with 20 plus years involvement with golf on the Eastern Shore. This organization provided the platform on which a scholarship program was created and has to date provided \$10,000 in scholarships to the students of the PGA Golf Management Program at the University of Maryland Eastern Shore. This relationship with UMES is growing the game right here in our backyard and benefitting the youth in our community.

This past spring, Ray added the Junior Tour on the Shore, providing an outlet for children ages 6 to 18 to come together to learn, play

and compete on all levels at some of the area's best courses. The Junior Tour was greatly supported by the UMES PGA Golf Management program, awarding a fully paid 4 year college scholarship to the high school point's leader, Tanner Leonard of Berlin, MD. The Junior Tour also provided a separate \$1,000 scholarship to a very deserving former junior golfer, Cecily Sass of Ocean City, MD. This Junior series has brought true joy and excitement to Ray and the company in anticipation of what these young golfers are going to achieve in their futures.

He has recently been named the 2016 Business Person of the Year through the Ocean City Chamber of Commerce for his work in and around the community. He feels truly blessed and very humbled for this recognition.

Although many joke that Ray golfs for a living, he does spend countless hours supporting local charity tournaments, junior golf events and community fundraisers. He also donates a tournament section in the magazine that allows for free advertising of the area's charity events to help spread the word and boost participation to aid in the success of these events! When Ray isn't working, he is spending time with friends and his family (Holly, his wife of 16 years, and their three sons, Bryce (14), Blaine (12), and Braxton (2).



WHO INTRODUCED YOU TO GOLF? AT WHAT AGE?

My father introduced me to golf around the age of 5. He was a golf course Superintendent which enabled me to spend a lot of time each summer on the course. I would tag along every morning usually spending the day hunting or fishing. One day I wanted to do what all the grownups were doing so my father took me into the pro shop. The only club they could find that was cut down to my size was a left handed Sam Snead 7 iron and that's how I got started playing left handed. I do everything else right handed.

I won a couple AJGA events but my most memorable junior highlight would have to be the Western Junior Amateur when



I was 17. After two rounds of qualifying stroke play, the top 16 advanced to match play. I played very well advancing as the #2 seed. Still riding the wave of confidence from playing well in the previous match I was 4 under and 4 up at the turn. There was a wait on the 10th tee box so I wondered over to see who had won their morning matches as well. I just happened to look to see who I would play in the next match if my current match continued the way it was going. I almost threw up my lunch when I saw that I would play the winner of the Ted Purdy/Tiger Woods match. Assuming Tiger was going to win, I knocked three people down trying to get to the pro shop to call my dad and tell him the news. He immediately booked a flight to Chicago! I have no idea what happened from that phone call to the 10th tee box but the back nine was completely opposite of the front and I lost the match on the 18th hole. I still remember to this day the disappointment I felt when my father showed up at my hotel room that night with the biggest smile on his face yelling "We are playing Tiger Woods!", and I had to tell him with tears running down my face "No, we're not!" That sucked!

CAREER GOLFING HIGHLIGHTS?

I was fortunate enough to win a Mercedes Benz Dealer Championship Qualifier along with Stan Botts (Net winner). We teamed up to win the next stage, Eastern Sectional Finals at Pinehurst where I was low medalist. We then advanced to the National Finals at Augusta Country Club. We finished second as a team and I advanced to the World finals in Stuttgart, Germany as an individual. Representing my country, alongside 42 other countries, was an unbelievable experience. Winning the individual World Finals still feels like a dream that I had. The most recent highlight would definitely be qualifying for The Tour sponsored by Under Armour National Finals to be held at PGA Golf Club Florida May 5th, 6th, and 7th 2017.

WHEN DID YOU FALL IN LOVE WITH HEALTH & FITNESS?

I fell in love with health and fitness at an early age. To say it's in my genes would be an understatement. My father is a bodybuilder and at age 73 he is still a physical freak of nature. I couldn't be more proud to say that his most recent accomplishment is finishing 6th in the 2016 NPC Men's Masters 70+ National Championship! He's won several Mr. Pennsylvania titles as well. There are two photos on my phone that I show people on a daily bases, my beautiful daughter and my ripped father!



Some years ago I wrote about golf stretches. I think it is an article worth repeating, so here it is again. The ideal situation, if you have the time, is to do stretches after a little light cardio - rapid walking or jogging to warm your muscles up, followed by some progressives stretching.



HERE IS A GOOD SEQUENCE...

NECK STRETCHES neck flexion followed by side to side neck stretches, all done gently. **SHOULDER STRETCHES** holding you arm across your chest and pulling gently on your elbow for posterior muscles. Holding a club behind your back with arms straight and lifting arms away from back for anterior shoulder. BACK moving upper body side to side while facing forward to work lateral muscles. Follow this by toe touches to stretch lower back. Remember, only go to point where you can feel the stretch. There should be no pain involved. Follow this with trunk rotation to complete back stretches.

LEG STRETCHES these should cover the hamstrings, quads and calves. There are multiple ways to do these. Hamstrings can be done by placing your straight leg on a bench or chair and bending forward. Quads are best done by grasping your ankle while steadying your upper body on the wall or a chair, then pulling up on your ankle to stretch the anterior upper leg. Calves are done by bending forward with your leg straight while keeping your foot completely on the ground.

If you can find a resource that shows pictures of these stretches, it will help a lot, especially if you are not familiar with stretching. The other option is to talk to a trainer at your gym or go to an aerobic class that concentrates on stretching. After you have completed stretches, you can move to the practice area to hit balls prior to your actual golf round.



Roller Coaster Ride By Rob McDonald

It is often said that golf is a roller coaster ride. Up one day and down the next. Even for golfers at the professional level they have their up and down weeks. One way to shallow out the differences in the peaks and valleys is to find your successful rhythm and pace to your swing and then maintain it.

You can have excellent mechanics, but if your rhythm is off, you will play poorly. You can have flawed mechanics, but with good rhythm, play well.

Using the roller coaster image can help you to build a good rhythm to your swing. Picture a roller coaster sitting on the tracks waiting for the passengers to load on to the cars. It is at the low, level part of the track. From there, it starts out slowly as it approaches the tracks heading upward. It slowly chugs up the hill until it begins to round the top and begin it's decent. As it heads downward, it builds speed. The fastest part of the ride is right through the bottom. Then, it begins the slow trek upward again.

Try to start your golf swing the same way. You want to start out slowly enough, choosing your chest and back muscles to create the motion while keeping the hands at a moderate pressure level. As you reach the summit of the turn away, feel your lower body drive begin to get the forward swing started. From there,

the momentum builds as the arms and club fall into the bottom of the swing. This is the fastest part of the swing. You shouldn't try to hit the ball with a quick release at this point. It would actually slow the process. The release will happen naturally as you head back upward again to the finish.

Start with some shorter, easier swings using this rhythm visualization. As you get the feel and are seeing better shots, you can increase the momentum and keep the purity of contact. When you play, try focusing on the rhythm on every shot and not the possible results and you should see more consistency in your shot making.

'INTERVIEW' WITH JANE MASON

BY WENDY R. WALLER INTRODUCTION BY GREG BASSETT



at Green Hill Country Club just south west of Salisbury, the woman who ranks as perhaps the best golfer to hail from Salisbury will be celebrated at the 58th annual Pepsi Invitational Golf Tournament. This player is known not just for her amazing array of victories, but for the sportsmanship she exhibited, the always-positive yet alwaysserious attitude she displayed, and the sense of integrity she instilled in all things related to golf. Jane Schiller Mason was born with her twin brother Joe Schiller Jr. in Salisbury on March 7, 1939. Her father was the great Joe Schiller, a renowned public official and accomplished amateur golfer. As a young woman, Jane joined her father in competing at Green Hill Yacht & Country Club in Quantico, and by 6 was challenging the region's best golfers in state and regional amateur tournaments. In the Class of 1957 at Wicomico High School, she graduated from the University of Maryland at College Park in 1962. She married Dr. Robert C. Mason in 1964, and they had two sons, Lee and Chris. The Mason brothers are regarded today as among the region's best amateur golfers. There are few if any local tournaments that Jane Mason hasn't won. She won Green Hill's Women's Club Championship 13 times and Delmarva Peninsula Golf Association's Women's Championship 12 times. In 2002, Mason was inducted into the Middle Atlantic Golf Association's Hall of Fame. In 2008, she was given the Maryland State Golf Association's highest honor, the Distinguished Service Award. Beginning today, she will serve as the Honorary Chairman of Pepsi Invitational at Green Hill, an event she has won a record 10 times. In advance of her Pepsi duties at Green Hill, Mason sat with fellow golfer Wendy Routenberg Waller for the following interview:

Q You're a Salisbury native, and you've lived on the Eastern Shore for many years. What's special about this area to you?

A Oh, I love it because its rural, not congested, and there's a lot of water. I think you always love where you're from. This has always been home to me, even though I don't live here much anymore. I have a place in Florida and live there in winter, and I live in Centreville in the summer. That's nice, too. I'm on the Shore. That's what matters.

Q You started playing golf with your father, Joe Schiller, and your brother, Joe Junior (a twin brother), when you were 9. What was it like playing with them?

A Oh, I loved it. Dad was a very good player, and he was a very good teacher. He encouraged me and gave me a lot of opportunities. Of course, he wanted Joe to be the golfer because he was the son. Joe was a good golfer when he was young, but he sort of got away from it some. And I just plugged along and kept playing, and loved it. I was always the athlete anyhow. I played a lot of sports in high school. I played basketball, volleyball, softball, and hockey. I had 12 varsity letters when I graduated. So I played

Q Did being twins spark some competitive spirit? Have a little rivalry with your

A No, not really. He was a really good golfer when he was young. He was social, and he was very handsome. That helped, too! I don't remember him ever saying, "Oh, well, you won again." He was always encouraging me.

Q What was practice like? Did your dad stay involved in your development as a golfer?

A I've always done a lot of practicing. It was important, and it is still important in order to keep your game and have one that repeats. So I did a lot of that, always. I went to the junior tournaments, the state ones, and Dad would take me. He encouraged me and gave me the opportunity. And you need that support. You've got to have it to get to the next level.

Q Did you ever take lessons?

A Yes, Tused to take lessons from Harry Offutt who was from Easton. He was the pro here

(at Green Hill) many years ago. My father, too, of course, taught me.

Q In the 1950s you began your competitive career, a time when women were expected to stay home as housewives and mothers. Yet, some women were redefining their roles. I'm thinking of Lucille Ball and how she was always trying to edge in to the males' world and Althea Gibson who won at Wimbledon. You chose to be an athlete. Who were your role models or biggest influences at that

A Probably Mickey Wright – you know she was a wonderful golfer. And Louise Suggs who was quite a fine young pro at that time. I admired them but was trying to do my own thing, be as good as I could be – and have a good time. I never thought I would be a professional woman golfer. It wasn't an aspiration. No, I wanted just to play and enjoy it, go to college, and teach. I was a physical education teacher. I also wanted to get married and have a little family. That was really what I wanted to do.

Q Wow, but after just seven years of playing golf, you qualified for the USGA's Junior Girls' Championship in South Carolina. You were only 16!

A Oh, really? That's right, I think Mom took me down there. It was nice, I enjoyed it. It was a goal to practice and work to get there.

Q So you did set tournament goals?

A Right. As I got older, I enjoyed the regional tournaments – the Maryland State Amateur, the Middle Atlantic, and all the invitationals we had. We had the Cumberland Invitational, the Farmington – that was in Charlottesville, a big tournament, and we had the Lillian Payne Cup at Congressional (County Club). There were so many tournaments you could play in. It's very interesting. You know, you think in time that things progress and get bigger, but when it comes to golf, it hasn't happened that way. Look at all these invitationals that are gone now. Golf was growing in the 50s, 60s, 70s, 80s, and I guess into the 90s, but it seems like it's made a turn. I guess more women are working. You think maybe that's it?

Q Yes, I think that's a big part of it. I was just going to ask you about your family

and how you balanced it all.

A When the boys – I have two sons, of course – were little, I couldn't go to the Maryland State or the Mid-Atlantic because they were just babies, so I took some years off from that. You know, I played locally in one-day things. I just didn't play in the tournaments where I had to travel because I had to raise my sons.

Q And you introduced them to golf. Was that their favorite sport?

Yes. I think Lee played a little baseball in high school, but golf is their thing. They

Your competitive career spanned 50 years?
Yeah, I figure I've been playing golf for 65 years. No wonder my body is worn out! Q And you've won multiple club championships and many Mid-Atlantic titles, and I'm just wondering if you have a favorite competitive moment or maybe you could tell a story about something in particular that meant a lot to you.

The Middle Atlantic (Golf Association's Women's Amateur) is probably where I was

most successful because I won five Women's Championships and six Seniors, and I am in their hall of fame. That was a proud time. Receiving that award (induction into the Middle Atlantic Golf Association's Hall of Fame) and then, of course, the **Eastern Shore Golf Hall of Fame**, too. That was where my son Chris gave his talk (induction speech), so that was a very gratifying moment for me, too. And winning, you know, it wasn't everything, but it always picked you up a little bit when you won. Made you feel good. But it wasn't awesome. I've always thought that the most important thing in golf is the friends you meet and the friendships you make. That's what it's really all about. It's a social thing. But if you win, you know, it's nice.

Q In 1995, you also elevated the sport for women by helping to form the Maryland State Golf Association, Women's Division. What was it like bringing about that change?

A That was a big thing and something I'm very proud of and enjoyed so much. I was the second president of the Women's Division, and up to that time, the men of the Maryland State (Golf Association) ran our tournament. And it's a match play tournament, and you know, I don't think they even wanted to do it. One day, a girl got her award in the parking lot, and that was when we decided we wanted a division of the Maryland State Golf Association. We could've just gone on our own, but we wanted to be part of the men's association so that women could work together with men in a bigger organization with more opportunities for the championships and so forth. More funding, too, that was important – and more outreach, all of it. So it worked out very well.

Q Were the men skeptical?

A Oh, yeah, it wasn't easy. But it was well worth doing for women's golf, I'll tell you that. Today, they're wonderful. I've been to a few of their events, and I think the MD State (Golf Association's) Women's Division is one of the best women's organizations in the county.

Q What finally convinced the men? Did you have to get a little mean or did you just wear them down?

A I think we did wear them down a little bit. We had Pat Kaufman who was a lawyer up in Washington and a very good friend of mine, and she was great. She knew how to handle things and get them done.

Q And you also found time to be a USGA Rules Official?

A Oh, yes, I was on a committee the Mid-Amateur Championship and Committee it tournament) could be anywhere in the country, and you go and do the rules. So that's what I did for - not a long time - maybe four years, and then I got off That of that. was enough. There was lot traveling involved, but it was a great experience.

Q Well, I don't
know yet. But we
hope that after this
article and your interview
on PAC 14 in early June,
a lot more people will comebecause you've touched a lot
of golf lives! There's lot of talk
these days about trying to

make golf faster to play as well as more accessible financially. What do you think about the future of the sport? What would you like to see?

A I would like to see it continue to have people participate in these tournaments. That's why I really congratulate the Pepsi and the women who run it - because it's still here. That's a real credit to you - that you've kept it - because so many are gone. Of course, the Pepsi has been one of the best invitationals in the whole state, and people have always come from Baltimore, Washington, and Virginia to play in it. So it's a real credit to the gals through the many years.

Q One of the things I like best about being a golf fan is that we get to know our athletes pretty well through print and visual media, and we feel connected to them as people. Who do you connect with, as a player and a person?

A One I've always admired is Julie Inkster, and you know even as she's gotten older, she still gets back in there and plays once in a while. She's still pretty good. And she has a husband and a family, so she certainly is somebody I have admired. And today, I'll tell you, there are so many good Asian women – although I don't know them as well. They're little, and they hit the ball a ton. They have brilliant short games. And how about Michelle Wie? She's had putting problems, but she's coming back. She's doing pretty well. Our American women aren't as dominant as they used to be.

Q As I've been talking with you and learning about your accomplishments, I keep thinking I'll hear this champion's voice, but I don't. It has never been about ego.

A No, no never. But I so much wanted to win the Maryland (State Golf Association's Women's) Amateur, and I did a couple of times, runner up four times, I think. I wanted to do that. The Middle Atlantic, also. It may have been nice if I had won the U.S. Amateur (United States Golf Association's Women's Amateur Championship), but I couldn't do that. I played in the Senior Amateur (United States Golf Association's Senior Women's Amateur Championship) when I had more time, and I finished ninth. That was the best I did, but that was okay.

Q You have also won the Maryland State Golf Association's Distinguished Service Award. Tell me about that.

A That was a good one, too. That really made me proud. I so wanted to give something back and to be able to do that was great. They recognized me for the tournaments. I was the one who decided we should have a Maryland Women's Open for professional women golfers. We held our first one in 1997 at Bulle Rock. And we still have a Maryland Women's Open today.

The purse is maybe \$15,000. They come play, win money, and they need it. Not the girls on the main tour. It's for the girls who are working their way up on the mini tours. They play Columbia, Chevy Chase, Baltimore Country Club - so we have good venues. I'm really proud of that. Not many states do that.

Q And you're still making change... This year, you are the Honorary Chairman of the 58th Annual Pepsi Invitational at Green Hill, a tournament you've won 10 times! You and fellow golfer Carol Mears are spearheading changes to the format this year. Can you tell me about that?

A Well, I am very honored, I really am. I think it (the change) is good! The format is a four-ball championship with an individual competition with it. So you'll play with your partner, and the best ball of each hole will be the one you record on the scorecard. And then the individual will also record her score. A little thing on giving advice during play... If your partner is playing in the individual tournament as well as the combined tournament, then you can give advice to each other. But if both of you are playing as individuals and as teammates, you can't give advice. I got that out of the rule book, so we want to be sure we adhere to that. It's kind of interesting. It's a good format because, these days, people seem to like playing with a partner better, so it gives you more contestants, but the ones who really want to fight it out by themselves - they can do that, too. I think it's great. How are they doing on their entries, do you know?

Q Well, taking all these accomplishments into account, what would you consider to be your greatest achievement in golf?

A: Wow - I think it's all the friends I've made along the way, to tell you the truth. It's the friendships and being a part of the Maryland (State Golf Association's) Women's Division – it's certainly something I'm very pleased I did. I'm very grateful that I was able to play, that my husband allowed me to go play and compete and do the best I could. I've had a good life. I'm very blessed.

Q For those of us who are beginning golfers, it seems that improving our games and competing well is a balance between practicing - but not too hard, wanting to win - but not too much.

A You're right. You can't want it too much. And you know I had the advantage of starting so young, too.

Q: Do you think that you played without fear? How did you deal with the pressure?

A Oh, sure. But at the end (of a match), you get a little nervous. When you're leading by a few, you don't want to have an 8 or something. You don't want to blow it. But that was probably my greatest asset – I was consistent. I was on a pretty good keel, but I was fast. I did things quick. That was why I was a good basketball player. I made 1,000 points during my basketball career in high school. I think I was the first woman on the Shore to do it. Since I was quick and fast, I was probably not as calm as some on the course, but I was able to do it. I was steady because I practiced a lot, and my swing repeated.

Q What have you done over the years to be so fit?

A Well, even now, I go to the gym twice a week. I do some biceps and triceps – weight training. And then of course with this shoulder (a torn rotator cuff), I'm doing a lot of exercises and stretching. And stretches, I probably should've done a lot more of because they're so important. I think they're more important than the weight (training), but I do think I need it now more than I did when I was younger because I'm not as active, and you want your body to be solid.

Q I've been thinking that golf is like smoke – one minute we see it and the next, we don't. And when I mean see it, I mean see your swing in your mind's eye, the trajectory of the ball in the air, the line to the hole, but sometimes you just can't. What advice can you give for improving your game?

A Practice. Practice and practice, and you know, take some lessons. Get yourself someone you trust and take a few lessons and just practice and work on it. And you know it's probably good to take videos of your swing, too, because you can't see yourself.

Q: So have you seen yourself on video and analyzed your swing?

A Yeah, sure. I don't want to look anymore though (laughing), but I used to.

Q Do you ever watch David Feherty on the Golf Channel? He does this neat thing at the end of his interviews – a one word, question and answer game with his guests. I hope you'll play with me...For instance, irons or woods?

A Woods... now. Before, irons, but woods now – they're easier.

Q Driver or wedge?

A Driver... now.

Q Bette Davis or Marilyn Monroe?

A Bette Davis. I admired her and liked her work.

Q How about Elvis or Chuck Berry?

A Hmm... probably Elvis. He was popular when I was young, and I liked him.

Q Arnie Palmer or Jack Nicklaus?

A Jack. It would be hard to decide between the two of them, but Jack is closer to my age. I admired both of them, but Jack was a good family man.

Q You kind of answered this one already – Lopez or Inkster? A Yeah, Inkster. Well, that's a hard one, too, because Lopez was great. She really was. But I think Inkster is still able to do it. Julie also had more flair.

Q Augusta or St. Andrews?

A I've never played either one, but you'd have to say St. Andrews because it's the place where it all started, you know. Wouldn't it be something going across that bridge? I've never been there.

Q Going back to our Eastern Shore roots, where our conversation began today... Soft shell sandwich or hard crabs?

A Hard crabs!

YOU CAN TEACH A 'BULLDOG' NEW TRICKS!

Here we go! Turns out that you can teach Bulldog new tricks! This is the third installment as we check in with our favorite morning show host to see how his golf game is improving. We are about four months into the process and as we learned in the last issue, sometimes you need to tear down before you build up. The tear down process can be extremely frustrating and it takes personal resolve to get to the next level. When last we checked on Bulldog he was struggling but had an extremely positive attitude. The big numbers would show up during each round. With his busy schedule, he took the time to practice. We started this segment with a 20 handicap and had the goal of reaching a 12. I am happy to report that we are more than half way home. As of the last handicap update he has dropped to a 17.2 index and is trending to a 15.5 index currently. While the swing changes haven't fully been integrated we found ways to improve his game through some key aspects of the game. We changed focus for the time being to balance, stance and decision making. With balance came swing stability. He quickly found that club head speed isn't achieved from swinging harder, but by swinging faster. We worked on his stance that also enforced the balance aspect of his swing. We examined the risk he would sometimes take when trying to recover from an errant shot. The sum result of these things was confidence. He now steps up to the ball with a new found confidence of where his ball is going. The next 4 or 5 rounds are really going to tip the scales in his favor. I believe his last 5 rounds have all been in the mid to low 80's, if he does that for a few more rounds the high scores currently being counted in his handicap are going to be pushed out and he could realistically meet our goal by the time you are reading this article. To stay up to date on his progress tune into "The Rude Awakening Show" on Ocean 98 every Thursday morning at 8am to hear The Golf Report. We will keep you up to date on all things golf in and around our area!

Wow, what a difference a few Very often you hear people comment that when they start taking lessons they get worse before they get better. THEY ARE RIGHT! I'm happy to say I have made the turn and I'm starting to get better. It's not an easy ride and I hope anyone reading this and thinking about taking lessons is willing to put in the time and effort. It's tough and it's a commitment. We all have busy schedules and sometimes trying to fit in some range time is a challenge. There is no substitute for practice. And practice with a purpose. The biggest difference I am seeing now (other than lower scores) is the confidence I have when standing over the ball. I "know" now that I can make the shot whereas before I "might've" been able to make the shot. I'm sure there are some more big scores in my bag but I assure you they are becoming fewer and fewer. My 20 handicap is now down to a 15.5 and I look forward to moving into the C flight of the Tour on the Shore. 

YOUR PATH TO PAR

Tension is one of the most fascinating aspects of golf. Are you a "pressure player"? Do you want to be? Many golfers seek the sanctuary of a beautiful golf course to escape tension and relax. Others crave the competition of matches, scores and tournaments. Individual desire and threshold for tension varies, but understanding its effects is a valuable gift offered by the game to every player.

Pressure is often considered a psychological factor. perception is the basis for "gamesmanship". It is an attribute that the etiquette of the game seeks to control by diminishing deliberate distractions by fellow players and spectators. Yet, all golfers know there is no escape from the distractions one's own mind.

It is useful to know that psychological pressure is merely a stimulant to physical performance. In this regard, pressure is like a cup of coffee. A little may get you alert and ready for the challenges that come your way, too much may give you tremors, headaches, a racing heartbeat, and lack of focus. Pressure may be stimulated by our psyche, but it is manifested in our physiology.

If you are a "pressured player" you are not likely to play your best under any circumstances. Consider these common pressure indicators:

GRIP TENSION: A light grip pressure depends on hand strength. You need a firm grasp of the club, but not so much as to create tension in the forearms and upper arm. Do not press hard with the thumbs.

JAW TENSION: Tense jaw and neck muscles will restrict your ability to make a good turn away and through the ball. Wearing a mouth guard is actually a good idea for some players.

Leg bracing: The ability to create a stable platform for backswing rotation is important, but too much tension inhibits the proper release of leverage and force down and through the ball.


QUEST FOR BACKSWING TORQUE: Turn to your own resistance point. PGA champion Jimmy Walker's full shoulder turn is a function of flexibility, not effort. Twisting for a bigger turn or contracting muscles to create torque beyond your natural range of motion is counter-productive and possibly injurious.

THE NEED FOR SPEED: Intentionally moving the arms as fast as possible inevitably destroys the technique that produces real club head speed.

FIRING THROUGH THE BALL: Like fast moving arms, intentionally "snapping the wrist to hit the ball" is a flawed concept. Firing the right side is a consequence of good technique not the cause of it.


NEVER UP NEVER IN: Be sure to get the ball to the hole, bear down, clench your teeth, firm up that grip, stand solidly, don't move, and give it a solid wrap. Then do it again after knocking the first putt six foot past the hole. Seriously, roll the ball to the hole; get it close, many will fall in. Just watch Jordan Spieth.


Pressure players never "CHOKE". Why? "pressure proofed" his game by understanding and defining "choking". Nicklaus said: "Choking is simply trying too hard!" Improve your skill, improve your fitness, but most of all enjoy the quest to be your best.

TOOLS OF THE TRADE

"MAY THE FORCE BE WITH YOU"

Here is how the best players in the world have utilized Boditrak to maximize distance and accuracy while making it look effortless. Learn how to make your ground force work to your advantage. We recently invested in the BodiTrak pressure mapping system that accurately displays weight pressure and transfer throughout the swing. Here is how you can make the force be with you. Lateral Force + Rotational force = Ground Force. Lateral force is how quickly and when you transfer your weight from your trail foot to your lead foot measured in centimeters per second. That is what you see when a great player will "pause" at the top of the swing. That pause is when the weight shifts forward. Rotational force is core rotation that returns the club through the ball and is the cause of the downswing. This is what you see when the club appears to sink into the downswing. The core rotation starts from the ground up. After the weight shifts, the knees drive and the hips and core rotates through the ball. When the hips stop the club releases, essentially the body releases the club with very little effort. The common mistake we see in

amateur swings can be a variation or lack in any one of theses forces. This causes the club to unwind from the top down rather than the ground up, usually resulting in a fade or slice. Let's say, for example, that the average golf swing takes 1 second. That breaks down the back swing at.75 seconds and the downswing to .25 seconds; this is a 3 to 1 ratio and has been shown to be the most efficient tempo. This is when we should turn the club to the top and transfer our weight from loading our back foot 80% to our front foot 80%. All we will have to accomplish is a nice, quiet core rotation during the final .25 seconds. Trying to accomplish the weight transfer and the core rotation during the downswing leads to swaying or sliding and makes accuracy and timing a nightmare.



YOU KNOW THE DRILL



BY STEVE MENZ

"SWING FASTER, NOT HARDER"

I see it time and time again, players trying to blast their drivers. I see them grip it harder, grit their teeth, hold their breath and try to muscle the ball. This will mostly lead to a loss of accuracy and diminish their chance at real distance. If you want pure distance with great accuracy, learn to swing the club faster not harder. To achieve this we do it like we walk faster. Quiet and relax your upper body and move you legs faster. Think of that quick walk where you take quick strides while keeping your upper body and arms quiet. This is really evident watching Usain Bolt demolish the field in the Olympics while sprinting, his head remains steady as his lower body flies. His arms aren't pumping out of control. Now you know the drill.

Now you know the drill!



IMAGINE YOU HAVE NEVER PLAYED GOLF OR EVEN KNOW WHAT IT IS.

You are transported to a driving range. In front of you are 10 of the greatest Champion golfers of all time. Jack Nicklaus, Tiger Woods, Lee Trevino, Arnold Palmer, Ben Hogan, Byron Nelson and Bobby Jones. We even add a couple of modern players, Jordon Spieth, Bubba Watson, and Justin Rose.

WHAT DO YOU OBSERVE?

One of your observations may be that although all the players have amazing control over the golf ball, they are all swinging differently? They are all great, but they don't all do it the same way.

WHICH ONE IS RIGHT? THEY ARE ALL RIGHT...FOR THEM.

Golf is ultimately a game of ball control, what the ball does. It is not as much about what the swing does, as what the ball does. The shape of the swing should be judged by the impact it causes.

Last month we highlighted the "3 Most Important Variables in Golf". The "Club Face" which is controlled to the largest degree by our grip. The "Swing Path" controlled by our shoulder alignment and the "Angle of Approach" controlled by our posture.

Once we have a basic knowledge of these variables, we have a real chance of improving and helping ourselves.

Swing positions can be important, but only as it relates to how it effects the ball. No two people or swings are "exactly" alike.

HERE ARE 2 KEY QUESTIONS TO ASK YOURSELF:

- 1. IS MY BEST SHOT, THE VERY BEST THAT I AM CAPABLE OF?
- 2. IS MY SWING PRODUCING THAT SHOT ON A **REGULAR BASIS WITH QUALITY MISSES?**

If the answer to either of these questions is no, then there is a need to change our set up and or our swing in order to become the best ball striker we can be.

Rather than teaching all people to swing the same, (a method) our approach is to help each individual find the most repeatable movements that create the best impact possible in a repeatable fashion, FOR THEM.

ANY CHANGES MADE ARE ALWAYS WITH THIS END IN MIND.

Of course it is easier to help a highly motivated new player to develop these movements in the beginning of their golf journey, however, experienced players are often very surprised to see how a small adjustment can create big benefits.

The ultimate goal in golf is to have master control of the golf ball in all situations with disciplined focus and little or no distractions while performing.


