Recently I had the privilege of taking 8 junior golfers and their families to Scotland for some junior golf competition. During that trip we also managed to go to the third round of The Open Championship at Carnoustie to see how the best in the world get it done. The kids followed their favorites and my wife and I were extremely fortunate to have a small environment, sit down Q&A session with 5 time Open Champion Tom Watson.

MR. WATSON was asked a multitude of questions and he answered them all with grace. One of the things he said during the session resonates with my main goal of the trip. When asked, "What is the most important advice you can give to a young golfer?" His reply was simple. "Play in as many competitions as you can. Play with players you conceive that are better than you." He added, "Watch what the better players do and mimic their styles and routines." He proceeded to explain that the more you put yourself in to pressure situations in golf, the easier they will be to handle. The more experiences you have in those situations will be like adding more skills to your game.

When we were offered the opportunity to take these juniors on this trip of a lifetime, my main goal was to have the juniors gain valuable playing experiences. True Scottish links golf is definitely not what they were accustomed to playing and thankfully most of our players excelled! Bennett High's own Savannah Scott even took home the win in one of the events. The best part of Mr. Watson's advice is that it is not only applicable to juniors. If you strive to get better at the game, no matter your age, go out and do the same. View the pressure as a reward and you will definitely see your game improve.

THE PERSONAL BLEND OF TECHNICAL SKILLS, PHYSICAL AND PSYCHOLOGICALATTRIBUTESTHATGUIDESHOTMAKING DECISIONS. US OPEN CHAMPIONS ARNOLD PALMER, BILL CASPER, BEN HOGAN AND JACK NICKLAUS PROVIDED GREAT ILLUSTRATIONS OF THE EFFECT OF GOLFING STYLE.

Arnold personified the aggressive "Go for Broke" approach. Hit it far, find it and hit it again. Like Seve Ballesteros decades later and many young players today this style was based on his ability to hit long drives AND scramble from the consequences of an errant tee shot. The legend of Arnold Palmer began at the US Open in 1960. Trailing by several shots going into the final round, his drive reached the par 4 first green. He missed the "eagle," but began his "Charge" to victory. Arnold's golfing biography could be summed up in that one shot.

Casper could not, and thus did not, attempt to overpower a course. Like Palmer, Casper made one shot that confirmed his faith in his style. On the third hole at Winged Foot, a long uphill par three with a hazardous green complex, Casper chose to play a six iron off the tee short of the green and hazards. Seemingly forfeiting strokes, Casper relied on his wedge and putter to score 3 on this hole all four rounds and win his first US Open.


In 1966 Palmer and Casper battled head to head at Olympic. In the final round, Palmer's attacking style created a near insurmountable lead. But, Casper's steady conservative style ultimately prevailed. Palmer's reflection of this tournament provided a key insight. His bold style brought him to a near record breaking performance, but thoughts of changing his style to protect his lead was disastrous.

Which style is best? The one that fits your goals and personality. "Arnie's Charge" is appealing especially in match play or scramble formats. See each hole as a challenge to be mastered. Attempt to make your best shots and damn the consequences. A birdie or eagle, on a difficult hole is a memorable personal trophy. Casper's conservative approach improves consistent medal play scores, which lower your handicap. Try the 120 year old British Stableford scoring system (points for each hole: bogey=1, par=2, birdie=3, eagle=4) it rewards both styles, speeds up play (double bogey=0, so just pick up) and one bad shot won't ruin your day.

Which style is best? The one that fits your goals and personality. Developing your best style requires clear understanding of distance control. Casper's decision lay up on a par three took as much confidence as Arnie's attempt to drive a par four. Each chose to "attack" based on a realistic assessment of what they could do best.

To choose to go for it or to lay up requires a realistic assessment of your distance capability. Hogan and Nicklaus charted maximum (what they could do) and regular (what they wanted to do) shot distances. Nicklaus' chose 15 yards less than his maximum, Hogan 25 yards less. The club they could hit 155 yards was their choice for 130-140. Embracing this philosophy creates margins for error and removes doubt of success. If you "go for broke" you know can make it. Decide to lay up to an "attacking distance" you know you can make it.

Develop a style that you enjoy and make decisions that feel right to you in the moment. Choose the shot and club that creates a comfortable shot, not one that requires perfection.

HOW I BECAME THE AVIS BROWN-RILEY STORY

How did a little seven year old girl from the inner city become a Champion in Golf, a successful manager in a Fortune 500 company, survive breast cancer, and learn to Became a Champion in Life? Well, you are going to have to read her book: Building of a Champion, How I Became a Champion in Life, the Avis Brown-Riley story.

Avis' journey in life is truly amazing and she is sharing it with the world. Her amazing journey began 54 years ago in San Diego, California. She is the second youngest of five siblings, born to Gordon Sr., and Harriet Brown. Her father introduced her to the game of Golf, and her hard working, humble and devoted parent's sacrifices paid off.



Avis began playing golf at age 7, won her first Junior Golf tourament at age 8, and won the prestigious San Diego Junior World Golf Championship at age 10. As a member of the San Diego Junior Golf Association, Avis won over 50 golf tournaments, and represented San Diego in team events. During her final year of Junior Golf, she amazingly won 10 of 16 events, finished second twice and third three times. She also won the San Diego Junior Golf Association; Junior-Golfer-of-the-Year 5-times.

Avis was the number one player on the Samuel J. Morse High School Boys Golf team, and during her senior year, she played in the Andy Williams San Diego Pro-Am with United States Open Champion Jerry Pate. Immediately after her High School Graduation, she became the first and only African-American to win the San Diego City Women's Amateur Championship. Avis attended the United States International University, a Division I college on a golf scholarship; she was ranked 25th in the nation, and played in the NCAA Women's Championship every year.

Avis received her degree in Communications and after college, traveled the United States, much of the time alone, playing in mini tour golf events. She had the pleasure of meeting her idol, Golf Professional Calvin Peete, and played golf with the legendary tennis star, Althea Gibson. Her professional golf career is highlighted in 1988, when she shot a seven under par 65 (a women course record) to win the Michelob Classic at Canyon Crest Country Club. She won the local pre-qualifying in Los Angeles, Ca. to play in the United States Women's Open at the Funny Farm Country Club in Baltimore, Maryland. She is one of five African-American's to play in the United States Women's to received eligibility status for the Future's tour in 1990 and 2006.

A CHAMPION IN LIFE!

After 25 years of playing competitive golf, Avis took her life, organization and people skills into Corporate America. She currently serves as an Operations Manager with FEDEX. In November 2009, Avis had a vision and dream; to write a series of Books, the first being: Building of a Champion, and travel the world, in the hope of inspiring children by sharing her amazing story. Along with her business partner; her brother, Gordon Brown, Jr. they began to put the pieces in place.

In early 2010, Avis was diagnosis with Breast Cancer. Avis' oldest brother Gordon Brown, Jr. once told her, "It is not the adversity that you face, but how you face the adversity, that defines you as a person and builds character". Avis will tell you "it was the toughest eighteen holes of golf she had ever played". It was her strong faith in God, a strong family support system, and the Desire, Dedication, Determination she learned and demonstrated during her Golf career that helped her to win the battle.

According to Avis, "It's not the number of times you stand in the winner's circle that makes you a Champion". Avis wants to share with the world that Champions are winners at succeeding in life; and everyone's success meter is different, whether in sports, the classroom, or the business world. "We all benefit from sharing knowledge, providing opportunity and empowering people with life-skills". Avis served as a High School Golf Coach and 25 years as a teaching professional for the San Diego Inner City Junior Golf Foundation. "Golf has always been my passion; it has provided me and my family with wonderful memories. Being bless with a special talent, my dream

for the world, is that every women and child has the opportunity to experience the game of golf".

No matter where she is at, work, church, golfing events, or speaking engagements, you will always hear Avis say, "What a great feeling, being able to give back to the children in the community". No matter how long her day has been, Avis finds time on Facebook, watching and analyzing golf swings, mentoring and providing these words of encouragement; "Follow your dreams, don't give up, never give up!", to her many Facebook friends (youths) from Africa and the U.S.

Avis is an inductee of the San Diego Hall of Champions and the African American Golfers Hall of Fame, where she serves as a Board Member. In July 2017, she gained her LPGA Certification. Avis and her team published her first book: Building of a Champion in the February 2018. 

HIGH SCHOOL GOLF

By William Knopf, Head Coach Washington High School

KNOW THE RULES: GOLF RULES 101



Rules are the things that people either hate or love. People either follow and obey them or ignore and break them. Golf is the only sport where you must not only know the rules and apply a penalty on yourself when an infraction has occurred. Trust me if you're not honest and don't obey the rules of golf, the Golf Gods will always find a way to even the score. So what are the most important rules or things to know about when playing golf? On August 15 the players and coaches from the Bayside South found out first hand from the pros themselves. Jack Skilling (Great Hope Professional), David Combs (Nutters Crossing Professional), Johnny Martin (Bay Club Assistant Professional) and Mark Simshauser (Great Hope Assistant Pro) took their time to introduce, explain, and help coaches and players with some basic skills, rules 26 & 27, and other playing rules.



HAZARDS: RED, YELLOW & WHITE STAKES

Each one of these stakes has a different way to assess a penalty and drop for your next shot. Rule 26 refers to water and lateral hazards (red and yellow stakes).

RED STAKES symbolizes lateral water hazard. With this stake you have more options than a yellow stake (water hazard), your options include dropping within 2 club lengths where the ball entered the hazard (no closer to the hole), dropping 2 club lengths on the opposite side of the hazard (no closer to the hole), or drop as far back from the hazard as you like with the hole and entry spot in line.

YELLOW STAKES represent a water hazard, there are less options for this hazard. Your options include; you can drop where the ball entered the hazard, drop as far back as desired with the entry position and hole in straight line, or re-hit the ball from its last known position.

WHITE STAKES represent out of bounds, to me the hardest penalty in golf. When the ball crosses the out of bounds stakes, you only have one option, re-hit from the original position with a 1 stroke penalty (stroke and distance).

Unplayable lie occurs when the ball comes to rest in an area that the player is not able to play or advance it (except if it is in a water hazard). When this occurs the player takes relief (2 club lengths no closer to the hole) and a stroke penalty.

Relief from a man-made obstacle (cart path, control box, fence, etc.) Occurs when your ball comes to rest and your next shot is inhibited by a man made obstacle. If this occurs you can take relief with 1 club length no closer to the hole without a stroke penalty.

Even though these rules cost you strokes and make your score increase, they are actually avoidable and give you options when an infraction occurs; and as Yoda says "in a dark place we find ourselves, a little more knowledge lights our way."



Positively NØT Negative


In the movie Talladega Nights, Ricky Bobby's father told him "If you're not first, you're last!" So, unless you're first, there's nothing positive? Golf can be that way as well, if you let it. There is only one winner in an event, but there is so much more to be positive about. Odds are you will never play a perfect round of golf where every shot is as solid as it could be and dead on target. Even after your best round ever, you will think of shots you could have improved upon. One of the great lessons that golf teaches us is how to over come negativity. You can walk off a bad shot, throw your club in the bag and pout about how you don't have it today. Or, you can take it as a challenge to persevere, overcome this situation and turn the downward spiral around. You really only have to have one good shot per hole to make par as long as it is near the last shot of the hole. You can hit a drive in the woods. Pitch it out to the fairway and either knock the next one close or chip in the following shot for par. It doesn't have to be text book. If you give up after hitting into the woods, or go for the "miracle shot" instead of pitching out safely, you'll give yourself less of a chance to save the hole. You have to practice positive thinking just as much as practicing any mechanical part of the swing. If you miss a makeable putt, tell yourself you'll make the next putt, or the next one after that. If you are lipping out or skimming edges of the cup, but not

falling, you're doing a lot right. Tell yourself you'll make them all the next time out, if not today. We've all had those putts, where no matter how long the putt is, you just know you're going to make it. And you make it! You can create that feeling for every putt. If you putt with that feeling, you are freeing yourself to make a better stroke which improves your chances of making it. If it doesn't go in, well, you'll make the next one.

If you are disappointed in any particular aspect of your game, turn that negative energy into a positive by being more disciplined in your practice to make the weakness a strength. Look at the practice time with enthusiasm, knowing you're getting better. Give your self reachable goals in your practice such as improving your getting up and down percentages in the short game area. If you know you can get up and down from anywhere around the green, it takes the pressure off your long game.

A friend of mine once said to me "You never give up. Even on the last hole of a bad round you keep trying." I would rather walk off the course knowing that no matter what I shot that day, it was the best I could do. Even if it was the last shot of the day I'm about to play, I want it to be the good one that will be there the next time I tee it up too.

Stay positive and the negative will stay away!



GOLF PSYCHOLOGY SHORE UP! WITH THE GAME COACH

The many hours, days and weeks athletes devote to practicing and playing leaves them with a treasure trove of mental and physical feedback. The body's message is visceral and easier to understand and act on compared to the ambiguous wave of mental observations concerning task execution. Many top golfers turn to Sport Psychologists and Game Coaches to help navigate this ocean of information. In the attempt to apply all that can be learned and benefit from our dedication to detail, researchers say the time and place an athlete chooses to examine, evaluate and adjust his or her golf game are critical components in the skill development process.

Scientists from Europe and the United States studying eighty golfers found that those who spent their time between shots engaging in activities unrelated to the outcome of the previous stroke outperformed the golfers who verbalized between shots concerning the specifics of their swing. The results showed the greatest effect among skilled golfers who discussed technique for five minutes before attempting another putt. Beginners were unaffected, presumably because of their low baseline performances.

The team of investigators explained the conclusions as a function of verbal overshadowing, which triggers the brain to focus more of its attentive capacity to language centers instead of the regions within the brain that support the required skill. The self-talk process of breaking down the stroke activates areas of the brain that deprive target centers of necessary stimulation. The findings suggest that focusing on correcting mechanics during competition can have a detrimental effect on performance. Self-analysis serves skilled golfers best during practice sessions when shaping routine.

On The Tour, the advantage may go to the golfer who keeps in-depth cognition at bay.


