MERCEDESBENZNATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP IN TEXAS @TPC DALLAS

Jim invited me to play in the Mercedes dealer championship one day after hearing it was a great tournament. We were told it was being hosted at Glen Riddle Golf Club and knew it would be a good day of golf. When we checked in, we found that it had a very strong field, and the competition was great. It was setup for a Callaway 2 man team scoring system. We were very fortunate to win the tournament and received an all expense paid invite to the national championship in Dallas for us and our guests!

The Championship was played at the historic TPC Four Seasons Las Colinas which was the home of the Bryon Nelson Classic for 35 years until 2017. Everything we experienced over the four day event was first class. The night of arrival they held a reception for over 500 people in a tent next to the iconic 18th green. They had loaner cars available for us throughout our time in Dallas along with planned activities for our spouses/guests while the tournament was being held. Tickets were given out for the Dallas Stars Hockey game on Monday night to sit in the Mercedes section of the stadium. The final night included an awards banquet which was held in the grand ballroom with a filet and lobster dinner. We learned that although qualifiers were team events, this tournament was an individual tournament, with each flight winner earning a trip to the world championship in Germany to represent the US. Day 1 was played on the TPC course and day 2 on the private members course, Cottonwood. Conditions were tough as the course was set up with tournament tees and greens, along with record low temperatures. Of the over 220 players, less than 10 players shot their handicap over the 2 days. The courses were incredibly difficult and a true test of your game (local knowledge would have been valuable).

This was certainly a memorable experience and I would highly recommend this as a must play event for next year!

The Mercedes Benz dealer championship. He said it was a first class tournament, and that I should play in it. I looked into it and saw it was a 2 man team event. I invited Jason Gulshen, who has been my long time partner from coaching a local little league team together, to playing partners on the golf course and we signed up.

The local qualifier was held at Glen Riddle, and there was a full field for the event. Knowing a lot of the participants, I was shocked at how many good players were competing in this event. Jason played incredibly well, going -4 on his own ball after 12 holes. I didn't play my best but it was enough for us to win the event! Prior to the day of the qualifier we had no idea there was a national championship, and a world event to follow. we won the qualifier, Samantha Martin, from Mercedes Benz of Salisbury contacted us and informed us that we would be going to Dallas for a chance to represent the US in their national championship. The experience was first class. From the venue at 4 seasons resort, to playing TPC Dallas, we had an incredible 4 days. Once there, we were informed that we would be playing as individuals and that one winner from 3 flights would advance to play in the world finals representing the US. Players from all over the country attended the national event. From California to Florida, Ohio and Massachusetts. We placed respectably but didn't make the top 3 of 300. Nevertheless, it was a once in a lifetime kind of event.



Balance& Sequence

One of the challenges I face in teaching the game of golf is to get the person to focus on what they feel within their bodies instead of focusing on the ball while making a swing. It's a difficult matter to overcome because we are so tied into what happens to the ball. As a human being, we are only capable of one thought at time. Sure, you can switch thoughts rapidly, but only one appears on screen at any moment. You can't make consistently good shots by focusing on hitting the ball and hoping you move properly. If you train your mind to move your muscles in the proper sequence, the ball has a better chance of going where you want it to go.

One of the main keys to swinging in the proper sequence is your balance. Balance and sequence are tied together like co-joined twins. If you are out of sequence, you will get out of balance. If you are out of balance, you will swing out of sequence. Winter is a great time to work on both balance and sequence. You can practice the moves indoors in slow motion without the interference of worrying where the ball goes.

The proper sequence, once your set-up is taken, is from the inside of your body, twist your torso (ribs, lungs, the whole package) away from the target, keeping your knees flexed and feet connected to the ground. Then, transition into the forward swing by driving from the ground, upward. If you are not in balance, the lower body will stop driving and the upper body will take over. The result will be inconsistent contact.

A great way to practice, no club needed, is to lay a yard stick or alignment stick on the ground. Take your stance on top of the stick with the stick located just behind the balls of your feet. You should feel like you can wiggle your toes and be in balance. Fold your arms across your chest, close your eyes and imagine you're standing on a balance beam. Create your swing sequence making your turn away and then the drive forward feeling as if you're staying in balance on top of the beam. With your eyes closed and the stick under your feet, you become more aware of your balance. You should be able to feel if your weight gets out beyond the stick. Naturally, your back foot will come off the beam and finish on the toes at the end. Your front foot should be settled nicely on top of the stick, supporting your finish position. Do this all winter long and you will begin to feel how your feet play an integral role in the creation of a powerful golf swing. You will also be training your mind to focus on the feeling of the swing versus the hitting of the ball.







THE LAGINATOR

While most articles you'll see for the next few months will revolve around the extensive rule changes, I decided to give you the gift of better golf over the winter months. I have been using this particular teaching tool with my students for a couple years and have seen great results. Yes I'm talking about The Laginator for Swing Balance. Many of you have seen or have used the Orange Whip. This is an Orange Whip on steroids. It actually sounds like something Schwarzennegar would say. The Laginator is a weighted swing tool that can be used indoors and out which makes it ideal for the winter. This 34" club simulator has a weight and a slide that will actually click to let you know when you have released the club. Most players tend to release the club too early when trying to hit the ball. The click will sell you out if you do! This tool will train you to rotate through the ball and let your arms release when the body stops allowing the club to swing. The click will be aimed at your target which is ideal. The slide will also help you to take the club back on plane properly as it slides down if the Laginator is taken back properly. It can be found at tsunamibarsports.com for around \$79. They also offer a lighter weighted version for juniors and ladies for around \$59. Well worth the money to find out where you lose your power. Now admit it, every time you have read "The Laginator", you have heard Arnold's voice in your head.

However, If a junior wants to excel at the game and compete in high School or beyond, they really should be in the Junior Coaching Program or receiving individual training.

17U Team..PGA Junior league has increased the age from 16 to 17 now for the 17U.

This is still recreational but can become very competitive if you are high school player this is still a GREAT way to play and compete at golf, especially on the Queenstown 17U team!





YOU KNOW THE DRILL

"OPEN MOUTH, INSERT... DISTANCE?"

There is good tension and bad tension in the golf swing. I see most players starting the swing with bad tension, the arms look like 2x4's, jaws clenched and lips pursed. These actions inhibit the swing from flowing and usually force us to "hit" instead of "swing". Good tension comes from the relaxed body coiling against itself through the swing allowing effortless power. Here is how to find your good tension and recognize where you may be inserting the bad tension. Simply open your mouth when you swing. With your mouth open it is difficult to tense the little muscles and it lets the big muscles do what they should do. You will find that it is difficult to keep the mouth open throughout the entire swing. Try it, I bet if you keep your mouth open through the entire swing, you will finally find that effortless distance and accuracy.

Now you know the drill!

Eastern Shore Yacht & Country Club

Almost a year after a fire destroyed the clubhouse at the Eastern Shore Yacht and Country Club three days before Christmas, a groundbreaking was held Saturday, Dec. 1, to mark the beginning of construction of the new clubhouse and a sports shop. Approximately 100 club members and dignitaries who participated in the groundbreaking attended the ceremony at the site of one of two new buildings to be built.

Steve McClaskey, who assumed the presidency of the ESY&CC just weeks after the fire, told the crowd that plans include a clubhouse to be built on the site of the old clubhouse and a sports center that will include the pro shop, a fitness center, lockers, showers, and access to the swimming pool. It also will serve the tennis courts and will be located directly in front of where the swimming pool now stands.

The new clubhouse will be approximately 7,000 square feet with the sports center adding another 2,000 square feet. The old clubhouse was 11,000 square feet.

McClaskey thanked the membership for their support and patience during the past year, noting that although he has only 12 years' experience with the club, many members have lifelong memories associated with the clubhouse, including weddings, holiday events and many other special occasions.

Peter Turlington, vice president of the ESY&CC board and chairman of the building committee for the new facilities, told the crowd that while the fire was a devastating setback to the membership, it also provided an opportunity to build a clubhouse that will include amenities not available before.

Turlington said the new clubhouse will include a members' lounge, a larger bar area with casual dining, a separate more formal dining area, a card room, a kids' zone where youngsters can play games and relax, and a covered porch and outside patio. It also will include a large catering kitchen near the pool to better

serve that area. In addition, the Boathouse Grill was expanded following the fire to host small gatherings and include outdoor entertainment.

David Grebe, incoming ESY&CC president, also thanked the club membership for their dedication and support, noting the club membership is looking forward to more fun times at the club following a year of planning and hard work to arrive at the groundbreaking ceremony. Board members first met the day after Christmas in 2017 to start the planning process and gathered input from club members in finalizing plans.

McClaskey introduced Jason Lumberton of Gateway Builders and Eric Catelliler of AWB Engineers, who will be involved in the building phase.

The sports center should be completed in the summer of 2019 with the clubhouse slated to be finished in the fall of 2019.

Other groundbreaking dignitaries included ESY&CC past president Eric Dodge, Sen. Lynwood Lewis, Del. Robert Bloxom, Accomack County Board of Supervisors Vice Chairman Donald Hart, Northampton Supervisor Spencer Murray, and ESY&CC staff Tricia Hare, Theresa Fahy, Vicki Baxter and James Jones.

Founding ESY&CC President Talks of Early Years

George McMath, founding president of the club, spoke about its formation and noted similarities between then and now. In 1959, when he was only 26, McMath was selling advertisements for the Eastern Shore News, the paper he and Ben Byrd had recently purchased, when Saul Glick of Glick's and Son in Onancock, said to him, "If you want to do something for the Eastern Shore, build a golf course."

After publishing some newspaper articles to determine interest, McMath became the head of a committee to build a golf course that quickly expanded to a family facility that included a pool, tennis courts, a dock and a clubhouse for social activities.

The pool at the new club opened in August of 1960 with interest so high that 236 out of 300 members used the pool in the first month with a total of 2,902 persons taking a swim in the first 29 days. However, two weeks later, Hurricane Donna hit the bayside and dumped salt water on the newly planted grass on the golf course, destroyed the dock and deposited numerous crab pots and several boats, including a large sailboat, on the property.

McMath said there were considerable challenges facing the board members then, just as the current board has endured challenging times following the fire that destroyed the clubhouse a year ago.

McMath recalled a meeting in the early months during which it was suggested that a hat be passed around the room to start the funding. He knew that would not make a dent in the amount they needed to build a club, but he didn't want to suppress the enthusiasm and so an actual hat was circulated. With 65 men in the room, a little over \$64 was collected.

But if money was tight in those times, prices were great bargains compared to today, noted McMath. The group was able to buy 125 acres on Pungoteague Creek for \$20,000, the cost of a golf membership was \$10 a month following a \$300 initiation fee, and when a formal opening of the club was held in September of 1961, a dinner

that included lobster stuffed with crab meat and shrimp cost \$4.50 per person.

McMath was the first president of the club and, given his relatively young age at the time, the only member of the first board still living.

But there are younger generations enjoying the fruits of the club. Bill Chandler, whose father and uncle were involved in the formation of the club, was among the Saturday's attendees who more than filled the seats in the tent erected for the occasion. Chandler recalled playing golf on the new nine-hole course as a teenager and has been involved in various activities at the club throughout his life.

Michael Murphy, also a teenager at the time the club opened, said recently that Arnold Palmer was quite the rage at the time the club opened, and many families went from spending weekends on the water to taking up golf on the new course.

According to a book written by McMath about the formative years of the club, during the first four months after the course opened in September of 1961, more than 2,000 rounds were played. Two months later, Paul Watson won the first golf tournament, defeating James Douglas, 3 and 2, while shooting a 77. A day later, Dr. J. Conway Smith made the club's first hole-in-one on the par 3, 153-yard ninth hole.

In 1965 the second nine was opened at the club, and two years later the Virgina State Open was held at ESY&CC with many leading state golf professionals playing, including Tom Strange, Chandler Harper, Claude King and Herb Hooper. Former PGA champion Chandler Harper won the tournament.


The course record is held by longtime member Jeff Shield with a 63 on the par 70 layout.




Along with Flexibility and Balance Training, increasing muscular strength positively effects health and performance. Weight or Resistance Training for golfers is necessary for three primary reasons: maintaining the proper spine angle, efficiently transferring body weight, and developing swing speed.

The final aspect of our sport-specific workout is Endurance Training. Golfers on Tour swing clubs hundreds of times during an event. Improving the ability to efficiently transport oxygen to the body's working regions and developing the overall endurance capacity of the muscular system can delay fatigue.





HOW TO GET OVER THE WINTER WHATEVER ...



Here it is winter, too cold to play golf outside; too expensive to travel South to play golf; how can we get over the feeling of "Whatever!" Well there are a few things that you can do to help get through winter and improve your golf game as well.

THINGS THAT YOU CAN DO AS A GOLFER IN THE WINTER TIME:

RE-GRIP YOUR CLUBS: Depending on where you look, it states that you should do this once a year or once every 18 months. You can do this through a professional or DIY.

MAKE A GOLF TRIP: You will need to head South this time of year if you want to play outside without 3-4 layers of clothes on. Most popular destinations in January and February...Caribbean, Hawaii, Australia, Florida, even Myrtle Beach.

HIT THE GYM: there are several workout programs now that are designed for golfers and the golf swing, seek professional advice or create your own routine.

TO CONQUER COMPLEXITY, MASTER SIMPLICITY.

Missing a short putt is the most frustrating shot in golf. If it costs you a match, or follows a great approach shot, it becomes infuriating. Missing a short putt is so offensive, that the traditional sporting gesture is to concede such nuisances "in the leather" and thus banish it's evil presence and effect. Of course, puritans of the rules, preserving the integrity of medal play, or gamesmen trying to aggravate you into a mistake, relish the opportunity to insist you putt out.

Throughout golf history suggestions to increase the size of the hole, have been proposed. Paul Harney, one of the PGA tours longest drivers in the 1960's, won 7 tour events though playing a limited schedule. He considered putting skill the measure of potential when mentoring aspiring tour players. Yet, to make the game more enjoyable for the average golfer, he initially designed the Paul Harney Golf Course on Cape Cod with larger holes, over 50 years ago. Today, his course remains a special place in golf history, but the experiment with larger holes was abandoned.

The best inoculation for short putt frustration is practicing short putts. Practicing short putts into a putting cup on the carpet of your home is a great winter skill builder.

YOUR

PLACE A BALL ONE FOOT FROM THE CUP.

Align the putter square to the center of the hole and place a coin at the heel and toe of the putter head creating a "gate" for the putter path, roll it in. This seems so easy we tend to overlook these benefits of practicing from one foot:

HEAD POSITION: You see the ball and cup simultaneously There is no need to move your head to see the result, so you learn to keep steady.

EYE LINE: The line between the ball and center of the cup is short. You will naturally keep the eye line parallel to the putting line and avoid tilting or rotating your head at address as often occurs on longer putts.

VISUALIZATION: Your eyes instinctively track the ball into the hole while keeping the head steady.

ALIGNMENT: At one foot it is easy to keep the heel and toe of the putter aligned within the hole and the face perpendicular to the putting line. You will make putts, even if the path of the club head is less than perfect, when the putter face is square at impact.

IMPACT: POSITION: You will naturally keep the club face square and moving to the hole. The cup and "gate" will help identify the extent and direction of any misalignment, giving instant visual feedback. You will learn to keep the shaft vertical at impact, since no significant follow through is needed from one foot.

STROKE LENGTH: An excessively long back stroke is a common error. Practicing a short putt encourages making a rhythmic short stroke to roll the ball in without jabbing at the

Putting technique helps consistency, but learning to trust your eyes and hands to get the ball into the hole without manipulating the putter is vital. Practicing the one foot putt helps you trust yourself to make any putt. The one foot putt encourages correct technique without thought. To progress place the ball two feet from the cup, putt through the "one foot gate" into the hole.








Harold Douglas Baines (born March 15, 1959) is an American former professional baseball right fielder who played in Major League Baseball for the Chicago White Sox, Texas Rangers, Oakland Athletics, Baltimore Orioles and Cleveland Indians between 1980 and 2001. Baines batted and threw left-handed. He is best known for his three stints with the Chicago White Sox, a team he coached with until 2015, before moving into a role of team ambassador and spring training instructor.

Upon his retirement, Baines ranked seventh in American League (AL) history in games played (2,830) and tenth in runs batted in (RBIs; 1,628). Noted as well for his power hitting in clutch situations, he is tied for seventh in AL history in grand slams (13), fourth in three home run games (3), and tied for seventh in major league history in walk-off home runs (10). Baines batted over .300 eight times and hit .324 in 31 career postseason games, topping the .350 mark in five separate series.

A six-time All-Star, Baines led the AL in slugging percentage in 1984. He held the White Sox team record for career home runs from 1987 until Carlton Fisk passed him in 1990; his eventual total of 221 remains the club record for left-handed hitters, as do his 981 RBIs and 585 extra base hits with the team. His 1,652 games as a designated hitter are a major league record, and he held the mark for career home runs as a DH (236) until Edgar Martínez passed him in 2004. He also led the major leagues in hits as a DH (1,688) until the mark was surpassed by David Ortiz on July 10, 2013. He was elected to the Baseball Hall of Fame on December 9, 2018, by the Today's Game Era Committee.

EarlyYears

Baines graduated in 1977 from St. Michaels High School on Maryland's Eastern Shore where, as a senior, he batted .532 and was named a high school All-American. The White Sox made Baines the first overall selection in the 1977 amateur draft. He received a signing bonus of \$32,000 - a record low for a first overall pick. The owner of the White Sox at the time, Bill Veeck, had spotted Baines playing Little League ball years before at the age of 12.

Professional Career

On Opening Day 1980, Baines made his MLB debut, starting as an outfielder with the Chicago White Sox. In 1982, he had 165 hits, 25 home runs and 105 runs batted in (RBIs). In 1984, baseball writer Bill James called Baines his favorite opposing player to watch, saying, "He is gorgeous, absolutely complete. I've seen him drop down bunts that would melt in your mouth, come up the next time and execute a hit and run that comes straight off the chalkboard. I've seen him hit fastballs out of the yard on a line, and I've seen him get under a high curve and loft it just over the fence." Baines ended the longest game in major league history (eight hours and six minutes over 25 innings on successive evenings) with a walk-off home run against the Milwaukee Brewers' Chuck Porter on May 8, 1984; the bat he used is currently kept at the Baseball Hall of Fame.

In 1986, a succession of knee problems began which gradually ended his fielding career, forcing him to become a regular designated hitter. Despite the knee ailments and the resulting lack of speed, he remained a powerful hitter, picking up 166 hits in 1988.

Baines holds the record for the most seasons by a player between 100 RBIs, with 14 seasons between 113 RBIs for Chicago in 1985 and 103 for Baltimore and Cleveland in 1999.



Baines' number 3 was retired by the Chicago White Sox in 1989. Midway through the 1989 season, the Texas Rangers acquired Baines, along with Fred Manrique, from the White Sox in a much-derided trade which sent Wilson Álvarez, Scott Fletcher and Sammy Sosa to Chicago. After the trade, the White Sox retired Baines' #3 on August 20, 1989, a rare occurrence for a player who was still active in the major leagues (the number would be "un-retired" each time Baines returned to the White Sox, and he wore it as a coach).

In 1990 Baines was traded to the Oakland Athletics for minor league pitchers Scott Chiamparino and Joe Bitker, and he helped them reach the postseason only to be swept by the Cincinnati Reds in the World Series. In 1992 the Athletics returned to the playoffs, only to lose to the Toronto Blue Jays in the ALCS.

Prior to the 1993 season, Baines was traded by the A's to the Baltimore Orioles for minor league pitchers Bobby Chouinard and Allen Plaster. Baines batted .313, .294 and .299 over his three seasons with Baltimore. He returned to the White Sox as a free agent in 1996 but was traded back to Baltimore midway through the 1997 season; he helped the Orioles reach the playoffs, losing to the Cleveland Indians in the League Championship Series.

His final contract with the White Sox was not renewed following the 2001 season, after his third stint with the team. He finished his career with 2,866 hits, 384 home runs and 1,628 RBIs. His career RBI total is 30th all-time; prior to his induction, he had the ninth highest RBI count among retired players not elected in the Hall of Fame; his hit total ranks 41st all-time.

CoachingCareer

Baines' fourth stint with the Chicago White Sox began when he was named bench coach in March 2004 under new manager Ozzie Guillén, his White Sox teammate, from 1985 to 1989 and in 1996–97.

In 2005, as a coach for the White Sox, he earned a World Series ring when the White Sox won the 2005 World Series.

Honors

On July 20, 2008, the White Sox unveiled a bronze statue of Baines at U.S. Cellular Field prior to their game against the Kansas City Royals; it is the seventh statue featured on the park's outfield concourse.

In August 2009 the Orioles announced that Baines would be inducted into the Orioles Hall of Fame as the 46th member. In his seven seasons with the Orioles he batted .301, had 107 home runs, and 378 RBIs as their designated hitter.






Now that Harold is done swinging the big stick, he enjoys swinging a skinny graphite club.

He picked up the game of golf around the age of thirty. When he was playing with the White Sox he would play in charity tournaments and being the athlete he is, quickly worked his handicap down to an eleven. He has played charity tourneys at Pebble Beach and Pine Valley. He is a proud member of THE RIVER MARSH GOLF CLUB and plays whenever he can. He won The 2018 Tour on the Shore ProAM Championship at Bay Creek. His career low round of 73 was at CAMBRIDGE COUNTRY CLUB. He also has a hole in one at HARBORSIDE INTERNATIONAL.

Harold has always been a generous person. For many years, he has helped raise money through golf tourneys in the area to benefit underprivileged children through scholarships. The Harold Baines Scholarship Fund Tourney helped countless kids obtain their goals. The thing he misses most while playing and coaching MLB is his family. Harold is a proud husband to Marla and they just celebrated their 35th anniversary. He is also extremely proud of his children; Antoinette, Britni, Harold, Jr. and Courtney. While on the road he also misses his mom's homemade crabcakes!
