GOLF PSYCHOLOGY

SHORE UP! WITH THE GAME COACH

CARSON LOVETT, MA SPORT PSYCHOLOGY

As you tee it up for the final swings of a tumultuous 2020, consider these five tips researchers agree will help you leave the baggage behind.

Whether you have practiced and played more or less than normal during this challenging year, when you approach the ball to start the next round, accept that you are the golfer that you are. Whatever technical stage of development your swing is in, that is who you are for the upcoming shot. Physically, there is nothing you can do to suddenly become Bryson DeChambeau. The best option to manage the potential for success and failure is to be the best version of you.

The goal for each round should be to focus on the process required to execute each shot, not the score. The pressure to "play well" or "go low" shifts the emphasis to consequences instead of methodology, and the resulting performance anxiety limits the ability to attend to important cues. Fully concentrate on the process; the score will be there in the end.

Stay present! More than 90% of the time spent golfing is between shots; how a golfer manages these critical periods of time will greatly affect the amount of mental energy available to complete the task. Having a plan to stay and play in the moment will suppress anxiety about past and future shots.

Neutralize emotions! Overreacting to every up and down that occurs during a round of golf makes it difficult to have the calm necessary to clearly think through the process. If you hit a hole-in-one or the worst drive ever, once the ball stops rolling, that shot is over. Assess the feedback and move on.

Monitor your self-talk! Are you encouraging? Self-compassionate? Do you make excuses? Are you being too critical? How you talk to yourself as you perform may help or hamper performance. Speak wisely.

HIGH PERFORMANCE MACHINE

My Last article "In the Moment" was essentially defining what is meant by being in the moment during your golf swing. This month I am taking a slightly different approach on the same subject.

Every time I hear it, I cringe. "I want to get my swing to where I just have my muscle memory make it work for me." You're in the wrong sport if you're waiting for that to happen. I can stand in my set-up formation all day waiting for my muscles to make my swing for me. It's not going to happen. In other sports, you are reacting to either a ball or another player coming at you. In golf, the ball is stationary. You are starting from a static position. Your brain must send signals to your muscles in order to get them to function. You must take responsibility for your motions. Relying on muscle memory is like waiting for someone else to hit your shot.

I recently read an article on how many people enjoy driving the older cars of the 1960's and 1970's. Today's cars have superior handling and sensors that alert you if you are approaching another car or traction control that takes over the drive train if it detects a slippage in the tire's adhesion to the road. In the older cars, you could easily oversteer or understeer and go into a spin or slide. Racing drivers can utilize that to their advantage. They are in tune with the entire operation of their vehicle and its connection to the track. They can feel if the engine isn't firing properly or if the response is just a hair off or if everything is just right and they can go for it. They are an integral part of the high-performance machine.

How does that fit in with golf? If you want to have the consistent high-performance results like the pros you see on television, you can't rely on "muscle memory". Your body is your high-performance machine and you must be aware of every moving part. The pros don't make a swing in which they don't already know what they want to feel throughout the entire motion. During the creation of the swing, they are aware of their grip pressure, balance, tempo and rhythm. They are aware of what body part is creating motion and what parts are going along for a ride. This doesn't mean you have to concentrate on every moving part of your swing, but you must be aware of the entire swing while concentrating on something like the rhythm and tempo or balance during your motion.

If you want to gain a better feel for the motion, try swinging slowly, with your eyes closed. You will be able to better feel your balance as well as rhythm and tempo. With your eyes closed, feel the inner, upper body twist away while your feet and knees are quiet and stuck to the ground. Feel the smooth transition into the hip turn while staying in balance. With your eyes closed, you are less likely to swat at the ball versus simply using your body to swing your arms. Now, when you open your eyes and set up to the ball, focus on repeating the feeling you just had in the swing with your eyes closed. Let the ball just be in the way of repeating that feeling.



TOOLS OF THE TRADE



"THE HEAD COVER"

The head cover is not an item you give much thought about, but here are a couple ways it can help your golf game. If you are having trouble coming over the top during the downswing and hitting the big slice simply put a head cover under you dominant arm pit and swing. This will help your arms stay connected to your trunk and also help the downswing stay more on plane through impact. It will feel uncomfortable and very constricting but that's exactly what you're going to need to fix the issue. Another great way to use a head cover to improve your driver is to place the head cover about a grips length in front of your teed up ball. Try to make sure your hitting the driver slightly on the upswing and don't hit the cover. This will help you achieve a great launch angle and normally maximize your distance and accuracy. So the next time you toss that thing in the back of the cart, think about it as a tool that can help you play the golf of your dreams.





YOU KNOW THE DRILL

BY STEVE MEN7

MAKE SHORT PUTTS "AUTOMATIC"

Here is a trick to make you unflappable on those short putts. Next time your watching a tournament on tv and you see a pro walk up to a three footer and bury it, watch what the do. They will place their lead foot very close to the ball and set the trail foot back. Why do they do this? It's simple, basically there are only three misses on a short putt. You can miss left, miss right or leave it short. Very rarely will it be hit too hard. Here's what this tip does. If you are a right handed player and you step your left foot five or six inches from the ball and make a stroke it becomes extremely hard (but not impossible) to pull the putt and miss left. Now your only left with two misses, right and short. Short misses are usually the result of nerves or lack of confidence. Once you get use to this you will hit the stroke with more confidence so it takes out the short miss. Now you only have one possible miss remaining and that's to the right. You've just increased your chances by more than 66%. Once you understand you only have one way to miss your make percentage will be in the 90th percentile. So next time you're watching golf on tv, pay attention and you'll see it.

Now you know the drill!



RICHARD ROBINSON INSTRUCTOR THE ORIGINAL GOLF SCHOOL

GROUND FORCE PRODUCTION IS NOT A NEW DISCOVERY. IT HAS BEEN STUDIED FOR DECADES IN MANY SPORTS, BUT RECENTLY HAS EMERGED AS A NEW "SECRET" IN GOLF. "OLD SCHOOL" GOLF RECOGNIZED EFFECTIVE, REPEATABLE AND POWERFUL GOLF SWINGS REQUIRE A FIRM FOUNDATION.

The notion that you "swing with your feet" was especially correct for the time, when wind and weather, tweed Norfolk jackets and thick woolen sweaters restricted the capacity for upper body coiling, without good footwork. To provide balance on the undulating and frequently wet links land, players added spikes to shoes. The quest was on to find the best combination of technique and shoes to acquire, balance, stability, flexibility and traction to create the foundation for power. Enter the specialized golf shoe.

FOR MOST OF THE 20TH CENTURY GOLF SHOE DESIGN WAS SIMILAR TO DRESS SHOES, LEATHER, WITH HEELS, AND SCREW IN METAL SPIKES.

The best were comfortable, but very heavy compared to the modern "athletic spike-less shoe". Good shoes are as important as good grips to achieve your best chance to play well. It is helpful to know how the shoe design effects your personal swing requirements.

THERE IS A CONTINUUM OF SHOE DESIGN.

Some emphasize stability and motion control. Others focus on minimizing impediments to proper foot movement. The stability shoe typically has removable spikes or an aggressive sole pattern, stiffer upper material, tighter and sometimes adjustable heel cups. The fluidity shoe is softer, spike-less, with a flat or contoured sole. The stability shoe gives you the sensation and ability to anchor to the ground. The fluidity designs enhance your ability to feel the weight transfer, as if swinging barefoot.

MATCHING THE SHOE STYLE TO YOUR SWING STYLE IS IMPORTANT.


If you have a smooth swing, good flexibility and maintain balance without effort, the fluid designs will enhance your natural feel for each swing, likely increasing swing speed. Proprioceptive feedback through your feet is the modern scientific phrase for the capacity to feel how to " swing with your feet". The light molded, flexible shoes enhance this kind of feedback. Consider that the golf swings of Sam Snead and Fred Couples exemplified effortless, elegant, motion. Snead advocated practicing barefoot. Couples was the first to popularize the flat soled, flexible, no spike shoe.

IF YOU ARE TIGHT, FIND IT DIFFICULT TO MAKE AN UNRESTRICTED TURN, OR STRUGGLE WITH MAINTAINING BALANCE. THE STABILITY SHOE MAY BE THE RIGHT CHOICE. BEING FIRMLY ANCHORED TO THE GROUND IS AN IMPORTANT CONTRIBUTOR TO GOOD BALANCE.

"Tour power" shoe styles afford players with good flexibility and balance, the traction and stability to maximize power potential. Such design can also help players who need to compensate for physical limitations that restrict range of motion, disrupt balance, and cause power leaks. Anchored footing supports the effort to "wind up the backswing", create torque, and then let it go.

CONNECTING TO THE GROUND IS THE FIRST STEP TO CREATING GROUND FORCE.

"Old School" shoes weighed 2 to 3 times more than modern shoes. The simple fact that a heavier shoe contributes to stability is worth noting. Consider practicing while wearing ankle weights. First with weights on both feet, then try just one at a time, lead foot, then trail foot. Doing this will improve your balance, sense of weight distribution and transfer during the swing, to create a firm foundation and power from the ground up.









In this update, we will showcase a new article title "Where are they now?" a brief update of our inaugural graduates from the graduating class of 2012. "I've always had an interest in golf equipment, both fitting, and building clubs." So much so that he built his second set of clubs that he ever played by himself. His advice for anyone looking to get into the golf is: "Never stop learning and don't be afraid of change. There's a great history to learn from, however, there is always new ways to improve or increase efficiency if you're willing to try new things."

Schnauble is now wrapping up his sixth season with TaylorMade, he loves traveling throughout the Middle Atlantic area helping golfers get the best golf clubs on the market. When he is not traveling for work, he is relaxing at home with his dog, Freya.

In early August, the University of Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES) welcomed 340 Freshmen students to its campus in Princess Anne. One of the promising young men among this cohort is Sam Turner of St. Michaels, Maryland. In August 2019, Sam won the Eastern Shore Golf Junior Tour (ESG Junior Tour), beating out a group of 50 junior golfers. UMES has been involved with the ESG Junior Tour for many years. "The Tour is a wonderful recruitment opportunity for our PGA Golf Management Program," said Billy Dillon, who directs the program. The PGA Certified Program is part of the University's Hospitality and Tourism Management (HTM) Program. It is one of only 18 programs of its kind across the United States and UMES is the only Historically Black University to offer the program. "Our students learn the ins and outs of managing a golf course or many other golfrelated businesses," said Dr. Pamela Allison, Chair of the Hospitality and Tourism Management Program (HTM). "Our students take many of the same classes as our other HTM students, but they also learn the particulars about the golf industry," she noted. "They also play a lot of golf!"

The PGA Program was created in 2008 and is designed to nurture the interest and involvement of young people in golf – particularly African American and other students of color who are sparsely represented in the sport. "We are proud," noted Dillon, "that our program is very diverse in composition with students from nearly all of the east coast states as well as Oregon, California, Ohio, Michigan, and elsewhere."

Since 2014, the program has received generous support from the Caves Valley Golf Club Foundation, which provides full funding for select PGA Golf Management majors for their full four-year program. This includes tuition, room and board, university fees, special PGA Golf fees, as well as a laptop. "We are delighted to support this outstanding program," said Scott Dorsey, current Chair of the Caves Valley Golf Club Foundation. "I anticipate that Sam Turner will be a wonderful addition to the program and team."

"We are grateful to the Caves Valley Golf Club Foundation for their ongoing, generous support of this important program," said Heidi M. Anderson, the 16th President of UMES. "My husband and I are avid golfers, and I am delighted to see new students join the program each year. Sam will be a wonderful addition to the program and to our University."

Originally, Sam had accepted a tuition-only scholarship offered by the University, but when Mr. Dillon mentioned that he could nominate Sam for the Caves Valley Scholarship, Sam decided that he would rather apply for that opportunity. After satisfying the minimum educational qualifications and meeting with the Caves Valley Board of Directors, the University approved Sam's Caves Valley Scholarship.

"I look forward to seeing Sam excel both in the classroom and on the golf course," Mr. Dillon said. "He is a fine young man, and most deserving of the Caves Valley Scholarship opportunity."

TOUR UA A-FLIGHT SEAN FETTES

My Golf story begins very similar to a lot of junior golfers in the Tiger Woods era. I picked up my first golf club at age 7, and was immediately in love with the game. Making practice putts to win the Masters or the US Open, and the imaginary crowd going wild! My father would drop me off at Yale Golf Course in New Haven, CT summer mornings before work, and grab a cart to find me wherever I was on the course at dusk. Walking 54 holes a day was my daily routine. I played competitive golf in high school, as well as some AJGA and CSGA tournaments. (Photo 1)

After high school, my priorities changed, as they do for a lot of us, and Golf took a backseat until I was in my late 20's when I moved to Charlotte, NC. I was introduced to the Kings Mountain Country Club in 2013 through a co-worker. That is where my competive golf bug was rekindled. A yearly member-guest tournament, and weekly "choose-ups" honed my skills. I started breaking par consistently, even carded my first "ace". My passion for Golf was back and burning hotter than ever.

I had the pleasure in 2018 of taking a trip over to the motherland and played the Old Course at St. Andrews, Carnoustie, and Kingsbarns as well as the New Course, Jubilee, and the Castle Course. As anyone that has taken that trip knows, I was on Cloud 9 the entire time. We experienced 20 minutes of hail while playing Carnoustie(who could draw it up better!), and consistent 40 mph winds all week. (Photo 10)

Shortly thereafter, a member at KMCC mentioned the UA Tour, and I signed up for the 2018 Carolina Regional Qualifier at River's Edge Golf Club in Shallotte, NC. Shooting a smooth 71 gained me entry into my first UA National Championship in Ocean City, MD. I had not felt nerves and pressure the way I did during that round in a long time. With that being said, I performed to a high caliber, and it reinforced in my mind that I could perform under pressure and execute the shots. (photo 6)

We made a trip up to Ocean City, MD in March 2019 to scout the National Championship courses and prepare for the tournament. The first thing that I gathered was that the playing conditions were similar to that of Scotland. Consistently windy, having to flight the ball down etc. Heading to the June 26th-28th, 2019 event I felt prepared, and ready to tackle the Ocean City Golf Club, Ocean Pines, and Eagle's Landing layouts. I posted a 75-76-77 for a 228 54 hole total to take T-7. I was proud of where I finished, but certainly wanted more. (Photo 3 & Photo 7)

Back to the drawing board for the 2020 UA National Championship with 1 goal. Win!! The Carolina's Regional Qualifier was August 31st, 2019 back at River's Edge. After 18 holes, I was tied for the



lead, and had to playoff on the 9th hole, and ended up defending my title successfully with a win on the 1st playoff hole. I had my ticket punched back to Nationals.

Starting in March 2020 right as the COVID pandemic was in high gear, I set a game plan for how I was going to accomplish my goal. I made a few dietary and personal habit changes to improve my mental and physical game, and committed to an "after-work" practice regimen. I purchased a push cart and made Monday, Wednesday, and Friday 18 hole on-course practice sessions. These sessions improved my physical stamina with walking, and gave me lots of opportunites to work on shots that I just could not recreate on the practice tee. Tuesday and Thursday I would hit 2 buckets of range balls, and then chip and putt to work on feel and green reading. Unfortunately, my plans for Nationals were delayed a couple of months, but before I knew it August had arrived, and I was headed up to Maryland.

Round 1 was played at the RTJ designed Ocean Pines Golf Club. I was paired for the first 2 rounds with 3-time UA National Champion Phil Fenstermaker. My mindset going into the round was to play him match play. If I could keep up with Phil, I knew I would have a chance. I hit 4-iron off #1 into the right rough. Hit an 8 iron for my second in to 3 feet and made birdie right out of the gates. I played a consistent round with 4 birdies and 3 bogeys to card a 71, and was tied for the lead. Round 2 was played at Ocean City Golf Club on the Newport Bay Course. I carded a 2-under par 70 to hold a 2 shot lead going into the final round.

I was paired with Steve Goodley, Ryan Kane, and Pierce Shearin for the final round. I had played 2 previous rounds with Steve and Ryan, both of whom are top notch players, in the 2019 championship. It gave me some peace knowing two of the players in my group. Pierce carded the low round of the tournament on Saturday, a 68, so I knew our final round was going to be very competitive. Heading into the back 9 on Championship Sunday, I was still maintaining the 2 shot lead I brought into the final round. What ensued next was the best stretch of heads up golf I have ever been fortunate enough to be a part of. I birdied 10 to go 3 up, Steve birdied 11 to get it right back, I birdied 12 to go 4 up, Steve



birdied 13 to get back 1. With 5 holes to play, I had a 3 shot lead. I remember reflecting on that 14th tee that if I could go even par for the last 5 holes, Steve would have to play some incredible golf to beat me. I ended up playing the last 5 in 2 under to shoot 32 on the back for a Sunday 69 and a 54 hole total of 210. Not only had I bettered my previous years score by 18 strokes, I had set the Tournament record and won by 10 shots.

I am so grateful that my Mother was there and saw every shot of that tournament. My father was playing in the tournament, but was able to watch the final round. And 2 of my closest friends Thomas and Sarah flew up from Dade City, Florida just to watch the final round as well. It was unquestionably the biggest moment in my golfing life, and something I will never forget.

The game of Golf has a unique ability to teach us things about ourselves that we may not have learned without it. I learned patience, commitment, and tenacity just to name a few. I would not be the man I am today if it were not for the game of Golf. I am very grateful to represent the Tour Sponsored by Under Armour as its National Champion. I am also very grateful for Ray & Holly Taranto and the entire UA team for their hard work putting together these events, and I look forward to defending my title in 2021!
