





Saturday after the round the players were treated to a traditional Carolina BBQ dinner at the golf club! Many players came into town early to enjoy the beautiful beaches as well.





Second place net was won by Christil Watkins of the LPGA Amateur GA in Washington, D.C. and Lori Deitz of The Brookwoods Golf Club, Richmond, VA with a 61. YOU KNOW THE DRILL

"Master THE FAIRWAY BUNKER"

Here are the fundamentals to conquer the dreaded fairway bunker. First off, don't dig your feet in. The object is to pick the ball out of the sand. Choose one more club than you need. Grip down an inch on the club, and ficus on the part of the ball that is closest to the hole. Lastly, take a three quarter swing. When you don't dig in your stance won't be as solid, but this and choking down an inch and staring at the front of the ball will let you pick the ball clean. The three quarter swing will keep you steady and insure a solid strike.

Now you know the drill!





WITH THE GAME COACH

The Ryder Cup is back in the hands of the Americans, and the youngest U.S. team ever assembled put on a record-setting performance to bring the trophy home for captain Steve Stricker. The Europeans were winners of four of the last five matches, but "Captain America" had an excellent game plan, and the players responded in championship fashion.

Instead of relying on psychological profiles to select the team, Stricker chose the players who were playing the best, regardless of age or status, and nurtured their inherent competitiveness. His philosophy, and applied psychology, was elementary: Team USA was better, stronger, and favored to win. They did not need rah-rah pep talks or inspirational videos from celebrities. As one of the players put it, there was an extra drive to change the narrative regarding American golf. Stricker counted on the power of Intrinsic Motivation: American Pride!

Stricker's most important contribution may have been his undeniable passion. The captain's willingness to wear his emotions on his sleeves was endearing to the young stars. The players loved him because they believed he cares. They appreciated the three years he spent preparing, adding six assistant captains to cover every detail so the super-talented group would be ideally positioned to win in Stricker's home state.

The captain understood that the elite golfer's calm brain only needs an optimal environment to maximize potential, whereas the beginner and recreational golfer, and the weekend warriors on The Tour, may require more from a Game Coach. At each skill level, one variable is constant: For every shot, practice, or tournament round, put your best in the best position and let your talent play. Results often align with probability.





YOUR PATH TO PAR


YOUR GOLF GAME COMES TO A UNIQUE CROSSROAD IN THE LATE FALL SEASON. It is a time to revisit expectation as and aspirations. Your game may be at a cresting point. Months of play since spring, improved technique and fitness, better course management skills based on experience, may have you playing the best of your life. On the other hand, ingrained faults well practiced, a change in fitness due to injury or aging, and striving for the glories of an unrealistic perception of your game may have you seeking a magic wand. In either case, the bottom line is a guest to be better and there are plenty of marketing lures to hook you on new equipment. Add to this, the holiday season of gift giving. The gift of a new club may brighten up the winter weather.

ONE SUBTLE LURE, IS THE NEED FOR GREATER DISTANCE. Research confirms the common sense expectation that more distance from the tee is directly related to lower scoring. One study reported players with handicaps 0-5 averaged driving distance of 244 yards, and 11-15 handicap, 221 yards. If the 10% differential applied to approach shots as well, the low handicap player would have approximately a two club advantage on par fours. Tournament players who reach par fives in two can make a par 72 course par 68.

IMPROVING DISTANCE POTENTIAL WAS ONCE DEPENDENT ON THE GOLFERS PHYSICAL ATTRIBUTES

AND TECHNIQUE. While these factors are still most significant, technology plays a greater role for the modern player, and so do weather and course conditions. If you are a data driven person club fitting can provide an avalanche of statistics which are meaningful and interesting to the engineer. For most of us, the bottom line is did the ball go farther, straighter, most often.


BALL SPEED, SPIN AND LAUNCH ANGLE ARE KEY DETERMINANTS OF DISTANCE. Club face and ball impact create the force that generates speed, spin and launch angle. The design of the club head, coefficient of restitution, loft, vertical, front/rear center of gravity, moment of inertia, and the design of the shaft, length, weight, overall flex, bend profile, grip weight, size, shape and texture when matched to a players technique and physique, optimize force production. The design of the ball may be even more significant than the club. However, it is useful to remember the whole is greater than the sum of its parts.



SOME INTEREST HISTORICAL FACTS. The average length of drivers sold today is 45.5 to 46.5 inches. In their greatest years Tiger Woods driver was 43.5 inches, Jack Nicklaus 43.25 inches. In recent years, the tour average driver length has been 44.5 inches. Bobby Jones "Grand Slam" clubs were subject to modern testing and found to have nearly identical dynamic characteristics, except his 8 iron. Jones said he always had trouble with that club. Harry Vardon won six Open championships over a century ago. Vardon's irons were single length measuring 37 inches. Bryson DeChambeau designed Cobra single length 37.5 inches.

SWING SPEED IS A FACTOR BUT NOT "THE" FACTOR. Just like sprinting, we each have a physical top speed that effort will not increase. Good tempo and sequence optimize leverage and club face ball contact, thus distance. A 44.5 inch driver length can increase precision and speed of impact. Most people play a shaft that is too stiff, and too heavy. A low kick point shaft will enhance launch angle and reduce spin, so will setting your driver loft to 11.5 or 12.5 degrees, or playing the ball slightly forward for the tee shot, to create a positive or slightly upward angle of attack. Loft settings below 10.5 require high velocity to reach the optimum apex of ball flight and thus may actually diminish carry distance. Ball speed and spin are key to distance, so select a ball that is designed to respond to your club head speed at impact. All major manufactures have quality options, and websites with helpful ball selection questionnaires. Wilson pioneered low compression design, which is helpful to those with slower swing speeds. Bridgestone offers interesting dimple patterns, Titleist has the most comprehensive design combinations.

> FINALLY, THE BEST WAY TO EVALUATE THE EFFECT OF INCREASED DISTANCE FROM THE TEE, AND A SURE FIRE WAY TO ACHIEVE IT, IS TO MOVE UP TO A TEE 10 OR 20 YARDS CLOSER TO THE GREEN. THE REAL BENEFIT OF GREATER DISTANCE IS MORE GREENS HIT IN REGULATIONS AND PROXIMITY TO THE PIN ON APPROACHES. MAYBE YOU WILL REACH MORE GREENS, CLOSER TO THE PIN WITH A NEW 25 DEGREE HYBRID THAN A NEW DRIVER.


The Special Olympics Maryland Golf Competition





A GAME OF MISSES

There's no question that golf is a hard game. That's one reason we love it. Even though the tour pros on television make it look easy, it is a hard game for them as well. We don't get to see the hours of practice that they put in daily just to keep the skills that they have.

With this being a difficult game, it's easy to get down on yourself when things aren't going well. While we have to develop swing skills to be the best golfer we can be, we have to develop our psychology skills as well. We need to learn to be our best coach versus our worst competitor in dealing with the inconsistencies inherent to this sport.

One of the biggest challenges I see as a coach is to get the person to believe they are actually as good as I know they are. I see the excellent shots on the range and short game areas only to hear them convince themselves it's going to be short lived.

We have to understand and accept that we are not always going to be "on". We have to learn to deal with the added burden of "not having it today" but still enjoy the challenge that represents and still try to bring it home with a good score. When we are building our swing skills,


we are for the most part making our misses better and less frequent. We will never eliminate them completely. Knowing and accepting that this is a game of he/ she who made the least costly mistakes wins, will help to keep a clear head when we have a couple of bad shots. It's not the end world. It's a new challenge to see how well you can recover or if you have the patience to not go for the miracle shot, but wait for another scoring opportunity down the line.

On your next round, think about how you treat yourself. Are you hard on yourself and say thing like "You idiot! How could hit it like that?" Or, are you handling it in a manner that promotes confidence and enjoyment, saying things like "Well that will make for an interesting next shot! Let's see how we can recover from this!"

Tom Kite once said, "You have to love the bad shots as much as the good shots, because it's all part of the same game."

If you find a way to enjoy the challenges of a bad shot, you'll find the enjoyment helps you to ultimately play better.




















TOOLS OF THE TRADE B Y S T E V E M E N Z



"YOUR HEAD COVER CAN FIX YOUR SLICE"

If you are anything like most golfers, you probably struggle hitting a slice. Here are 3 ways your head cover can fix that slice! First order of business is to recognize if you have a slice or a fade. It's fairly easy to see during the ball flight. If you ball moves on the way up in flight, it's a slice. If the ball moves on the way down, it's a fade. Slice usually is determined by the swing path and a fade is usually determined by face angle. By utilizing the head cover you can straighten out that ball flight. One quick fix is to put your head cover in you trail arm pit. Don't let the head cover fall out until the follow through. If done properly the cover will fly towards the target. This will eliminate casting or throwing the club from the top and help you hit the ball more from an inside or square path. The second thing you can do is put the head cover about an inch

outside the club head at address. Looking down at your ball there will not be much room between the toe of the club and the cover. Try not to hit the head cover through the swing. This will also give you a great visual and help you square up the club path. You may even start attacking from the inside and find a ton or accuracy and power. The third thing you can do is place the head cover about a grip length in front of the ball. Try not to hit the head cover through the swing. This will help you hit up on the ball with the driver resulting in a much desired ball flight and positive launch angle. When we swing out to in our launch angle is almost always a negative value which accentuates the spin on a slice. Try all three at the same time and you will see the dreaded slice disappear, hit more fairways and your score will drop.







PLAY BETTER BY DESIGN

RICHARD ROBINSON, INSTRUCTOR THE ORIGINAL GOLF SCHOOL

THE GOLF COURSE

Great golf course design is a work of art. In the earliest years of the game, designers had to seek out the best use of the natural landscape. The works of Alister Mackenzie, Seth Raynor, C.B. Macdonald, Devereux Emmet, and Marion Hollins epitomized such prowess, including Cypress Point, Augusta National, Monterey Peninsula Country Club, Pasatiempo, the Woman's National Course set standards for all who followed.

Today it is possible to "create" a desired landscape with the availability of modern machinery. Computer modeling can provide a vision of a course before any ground is disturbed. Options can be evaluated precisely. Advances in agronomy can help create course conditions that might not otherwise be supportable with total reliance on the native climate. There have been two significant effects of this design evolution. One might be called an "oasis effect". Bill Coore and Ben Crenshaw's Prairie Dunes in Hutchison Kansas, is aptly referred to as "A little bit of Scotland in The Land of Oz." A British links in an American prairie, all that is missing is a coastline. The second effect is the ability to use original drawings, photos, and design notes to restore original classics, as Coore and Crenshaw did at Pinehurst #2. Thus, the "art of course design" is an acknowledgment that offering a diversity of opportunities to the golfer is the pinnacle of design achievement.

Understanding this can be enormously useful to playing the game. Seeking to be in harmony with a design will improve shotmaking decisions and creativity. Trying to confront and overpower the design challenges will test both strength and accuracy. Either path can be taken, it is your choice. Bobby Jones, Ben Hogan and Jack Nicklaus usually played to the intent of the design. Arnold Palmer and Bryson DeChambeau aggressively preferred to defeat the design. Tiger Woods blended both approaches with long towering tee shots or precise laser like "stingers" to suit the situation. Yet, Tiger rarely went for a pin at Augusta, preferring to let the slope bring his ball to the hole, a mindset that "Mastered" Augusta in 2019.

The designer offers the player opportunities to make decisions. Modern players and equipment companies seem to seek to obliterate the finesse of the game supplanting it with power. The measure of a well designed course is not so much resistance to scoring, as it is requiring the player to use every club in the bag during a well played round. Many old school designs typically offered three and sometimes four

distinct par three distances: the shortest less than 125 yards, mid range 145-165, long 175-200 yards, and very long 200-250 yards. The par threes at Pebble Beach and the University of Maryland exemplify this pattern. Jack Nicklaus nearly aced Pebble Beach's 17th set at 219 yards for the 1972 U.S Open. He also recollected playing anything from a 4 iron to a sand wedge into the 106 yard 7th. The par threes anchored the concept of through the bag shot making, requiring for most players a short iron, mid iron, long iron/hybrid, and fairway wood approach.

You can be your own designer, by choosing a personal "blended tee" for each par 3. Most courses have 4 sets of tees, but typically set up from 150-175 yards. Go Old School play the 4 par threes from different tees to get the short, mid range, long and championship challenges. When first designed a hole has no tee markers, green, flag, or scorecard yardage, just the vision of the designer. Play with your imagination.

The 16th a Cypress Point is one of the most historic and spectacular holes in the world. It is the best example of creatively inspired design superseding careful calculation. Alister Mackenzie stood with several gentlemen pondering

and debating whether the rugged peninsula jutting into the pacific, should be a long par three with a 220 yard carry over the crashing surf., or a short par 4 dogleg. Marion Hollins, the developer who hired MacKenzie arrived on the scene and inquired about the concerns. She then asked if anyone had a club and a ball. Marion took the club a placed a shot over 220 yards onto the peninsula, then calmly commented, "Gentlemen, it is a par three!"

Marion Hollins was and remains the "First Lady of Golf Design." She was a driving force creating the golf mecca of the Monterey Peninsula. Her design insights were highly regarded by McKenzie, Raynor, Macdonald, and Emmet. She was influential in Bobby Jones selecting McKenzie as architect for Augusta National. MeKenzie sent Hollins to Augusta to supervise the development of the course as his representative telling Bobby Jones and Clifford Roberts,"I want her views and personal impressions, I know of no man who has sounder ideas." Although is has been nearly a century since her famous shot at Cypress Point, Marion Hollins will be inducted into the World Golf Hall Of Fame in 2022.




