### WHY DID YOU START PLAYING GOLF?

Children are drawn to golf for the chance to swing a big stick and hit that little ball. There is the excitement of an outdoor adventure, walking or riding the course with friends or family, but give them clubs to hold and their eyes widen in anticipation. It's just fun to swing a golf club and hit that little ball, and kids have fun even if they completely miss the ball, when their motivation is Intrinsic. A "Swing and Miss" is fun and funny to youngsters because most of them are not playing golf with fortune and fame as the end game. Play is at the heart of learning, and the joy of an exciting golf outing may encourage a young person to learn more about the sport to increase the odds of repeating the pleasant experience. The desire and willingness to play more golf to satisfy an Intrinsic drive helps the young athlete grow to love the game, and the young golfer develops into an amateur golfer, and over time, Extrinsic factors change the game. Golf turns into a score-oriented event, and joy gets connected to the outcome. Performing well feels great, playing poorly is depressing, and the golfer's identity may become linked to results. A kid swings, misses the ball, laughs, and steps right up to swing again without the burden of expectation; as that child grows into an accomplished golfer, a bad swing can become a debilitating label to bear.

### WHY DO YOU CONTINUE TO PLAY GOLF?

According to the Incentive Theory of Motivation, regardless of whether you picked up golf as a child or during adulthood, our actions are primarily driven by Extrinsic factors. We play golf for a reward after the game ends – a score, a trophy, attention, money – and the joy of playing wanes without those rewards. The Intrinsic motivation to play golf gets lost amongst the mound of potential Extrinsic rewards, and a poor performance lingers.

HOW CAN A COMPETITIVE ATHLETE MAINTAIN OR RECAPTURE THE POWER OF INTRINSIC MOTIVATION?

# "HIT CRISPY CHIPS"

Want crisp chips? This will help. Lay your golf towel flat on the ground about a club width behind your ball. You can also use an alignment stick or a steel yardstick works very well. Hit some chips. If you hit the towel or object, your path is either too flat or too steep. If it is too flat that means your result will normally be a skulled or bladed shot. If it is too steep that means you'll normally chunk in. The object behind the ball will train you to get the best possible attack angle for your chips.

Now you know the drill!








# YOUR PATH TO PAR



**DECEPTIVELY** "GOLF IS SIMPLE AND ENDLESSLY COMPLICATED: IT **SATISFIESTHESOULANDFRUSTRATES** THE INTELLECT." THIS WAS ARNOLD PALMER'S PERSPECTIVE ON THE CHALLENGES AND FASCINATION OF THE GAME. I LIKE TO PAIR IT WITH LEONARDO DAVINCI'S, "SIMPLICITY IS THE ULTIMATE SOPHISTICATION. LEARNING NEVER EXHAUSTS THE MIND. ART IS NEVER FINISHED, ONLY ABANDONED." SO LET US BEGIN THIS SEASON OF PERSONALLY EXPLORING THE ART OF GOLF WITH THE GOAL OF PURSUING SIMPLE FUNDAMENTALS.

Once we have assumed the correct grip, posture, stance, aim and alignment, we begin the motion of our swing. In learning or practicing, we may give considerable focus to each of the components of a pre shot routine. But the goal and attribute of accomplished golfers is to unify all the pieces and make the process intuitive and reflexive. Yet, whatever proficiency or deficiency exists in these static preparatory actions, they are effected by the initial motions of the swing.

I could detail at least half a dozen beneficial techniques to increase power and consistency associated with the takeaway. I will in future articles. But, now is the time to keep it simple, by focusing on an unhurried takeaway, moving the club head straight back firm the ball.



The description of this action is often low and slow. Good advice, however, I prefer to think of the motion as unhurried. Any attempt to be overly slow, often corresponds with a quick motion of the hands and arms to "lift the club up" rather than just swinging the club and letting the swing pace increase naturally by the force of momentum. An unhurried takeaway can create a wider arc, greater leverage and lag, better tempo and swing sequence, without even considering, never mind thinking, about these beneficial consequences of the first foot of club head motion, at the beginning of your swing.

It should be noted that the rotational movements of your swing will eventually change the club head path from straight back along the target line to inside the target line. With the proper initial move, no effort is needed to control this natural change in path.

A simple drill to develop the unhurried takeaway is to assume your correct address position and place a ball behind the club head of a 5 iron. Simply make your takeaway motion and roll the ball straight back along the ball target line. It will develop the proper motion as well as training you to keep the club face square to the target for the initial move, without thinking about it.





Old Head at Kinsale, Port Royal Bermuda, Cabot Cliffs, Cypress Point, Pebble Beach, Bandon Dunes would be spectacular courses if the design was limited to just flat tees and flat greens, or just hiking trails. These are pure natural beauties. There are also cosmetic beauties, contrasting perfectly manicured terrain with habitats unnatural to the grass and vegetation of the course, typically deserts or rocky terrain with depleted soils. Finally, there is the rare hidden beauty. Places where beauty was initially in the eye of the beholder, the visionary artist who intercedes to reveal a potential unseen by others. Augusta National and Pine Valley are supreme illustrations, that ironically, could be characterized a being in celestial opposition. Augusta was cultivated from an antebellum plantation nursery called Fruitland. Designed by Bobby Jones, Marion Hollins and Alistair Mackenzie, as Jones' tribute to St. Andrews. Augusta is a challenge to judgement, an invitation to imaginative play and the opportunity for risk reward decisions. Each hole adorned by beautiful flora, celebrating the Master of nature as well as golf each spring. Pine Valley, in contrast, was redeemed from the overgrowth of pines, swamp, scrub growth, underbrush, and sand hills. George Crump was a great amateur golfer, but it was on hunting ventures that he uncovered the property. The pines offered protection from the elements making the course a viable option for play in winter months. The challenge of play was more confrontational than Augusta. The "targets' are clear. To hit them requires excellence.

The advent of modern technology enables courses to be fabricated at the will of the designer. Great design concepts can be applied, great designs can be even replicated with precision. Perhaps the greatest example of this capacity comes from Pine Valley. During its creation, George Crump had very definite goals. During design Crump. An amateur architect, met with and solicited opinions from literally a hall of fame of golf designers: A.W Tillinghast, George Thomas, Walter Travis, C.B. Macdonald, Hugh Wilson, Henry and William Fownes, and most significantly H.S. Colt.

So how can an understanding of Pine Valley help you enjoy your next round? I am an advocate of adapting the course to your game. Essentially, determine the quality of your play at the moment, then choose to play from tees that fit your play for the day. Some courses actually do this by provide a "blended tee" option on the scorecard. Consider George Crump's goals for Pine Valley:

### FOUR ONE SHOT HOLES:

The length of the holes varied to require a 5 iron, 3 iron, 3 or 4 wood and a driver.

### Two Long 3 shot holes:

Unreachable in two shots

### Two Long 2 shot holes:

reachable in two requiring fairway wood.

# FOUR LONG PAR 4'S:

requiring a mid iron (4) approach.

### FOUR MID RANGE PAR 4'S:

Not requiring a long tee shot, thus offering a choice of tee shot position versus approach shot length.

### Two short Par 4's:

required a drive and pitch or a pitch and run.

It is interesting that Crump designed the par 4's for two types of approach shots, in addition to varying distance. For each length par four, two would have bunkers in front of the greens requiring and aerial approach, and two would have no impediments enabling a run up shot.

Perhaps the most significant insight Pine Valley provides is the creation of a 10 hole short course by Tom Fabio and Ernie Ransome, thirty years ago. At just over 2000 yards length, it essentially eliminates the driver and gives the same approach shot challenges as the 7,000 yard main 18.

Few get the opportunity to play Pine Valley, yet, all can appreciate the challenges George Crump sought to provide. George Crump was creative, determined, kind and open to other's points of view, without compromising his own beliefs. He never played his masterful creation, either. He died before its completion at the young age of 46.

# a work of art!

One final note, enjoy your round wherever you play.

Each moment, each shot, is a challenge to be embraced, a gift to be cherished, a memory to be treasured.

If you are playing on Maryland's Eastern Shore, you can actually find all of Crump's par three design challenges on one hole!







# TOOLS OF THE TRADE B Y S T E V E M E N Z




### "GET ON TRACK"

It's that time of year! The Masters is on the tv and you're getting the itch to get out on the course. So grab your clubs and run to the range already! But before you do, please remember to pay attention to this important fundamental. You're alignment will be one of the first fundamentals to go awry. This is tough to see because golf is a side-on game. Most all other sports are played in front of you. That means you line up facing your target. Golf, however, is played while you are on the side of the ball and your shoulders point at the target. Every spring I work with golfers of every skill level and one of the most common issues players have is alignment. Normally they will close their shoulders and feet off to their intended target. That means they point their body right of the target (for right handers). This will cause many issues including a two way miss. They'll struggle swinging

feeling like they're stuck and either hit big blocks to the right or smother hooks to the left. Mostly it will help develop an over the top slicing flight. Get your body parallel to your intended target line and you will be able to swing the club freely. Here's how to fix it; Line yourself up to your intended target then carefully lay your club down against your toes and/or heels. Then without looking at your target lay another club or alignment stick by the ball and make it parallel to your foot line. Step back behind the two clubs or stick and see what your body is telling the ball. If your lined up perfectly at the target, go to town. If your sticks point to the right of your target you are too closed. If they point to the left, your too open. Practicing proper alignment is just as important and practicing your swing. Bad alignment will create bad swing issues if it goes unchecked!
